- Approve in-principle, the RUHS-ITF Child & Adolescent Unit, Room D-32, T.I. Project located at 9990 County Farm Road in Riverside, California; to make modifications to the existing space in order to accommodate the Emergency Treatment Services (ETS) Child & Adolescent Unit and comply with anti-ligature & the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) regulations;

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Emergency Treatment Services Children and Adolescent Unit located at the Inpatient Treatment Facility was relocated to Room D-32 as required by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). Since the space was non-compliant with current anti-ligature regulations, the existing building systems and fixtures require modification. The scope of work for the Project, includes but is not limited to: installation of a new nurses' station and casework; new pyxis medication dispensing system, electrical/data ports, and installation of new office equipment.

Facilities Management (FM) recommends the Board of Supervisors (Board) approve the RUHS-ITF Child & Adolescent Unit, Room D-32, T.I. Project and the preliminary project budget in the not to exceed amount of \$173,257. FM will procure the most cost-effective project delivery method and award in accordance with applicable Board policies.

Pursuant to CEQA, the RUHS-ITF Child & Adolescent Unit, Room D-32, T.I. Project was reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt under CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1 Existing Facilities Exemption, and Section 15601 (b)(3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption. The Project will include interior renovations to the existing building systems and fixtures, including nurses' station, casework, and pyxis installation; power/data and computer equipment, and would not result in an expansion or change in use. The improvements to the facility would not alter the function of the facility; would not increase the capacity of the site; and would provide enhanced medical and behavioral health services, consistent with the existing use of the site. With certainty, there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment because it merely entails the improvements to the existing space within an existing building. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by FM staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

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Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Project will provide enhanced medical and behavioral health services to children and adolescents, will be consistent with the existing use of the site and ensure patient safety by bringing the facility into compliance with current requirements.

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

NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

January 15, 2021

Project Name: Riverside University Health System Inpatient Treatment Facility (RUHS-ITF) Child and Adolescent Unit Tenant Improvements

Project Number: FM05430009534

Project Locations: 9990 County Farm Road, west of Harrison Street, Riverside, Assessor's Parcel Number (APN): 145-120-003

Description of Project: Recently, the Emergency Treatment Services (ETS) Children and Adolescent Unit was relocated to the RUHS ITF as required by the California Department of Public Health. Since the space was non-compliant with current anti-ligature regulations, the existing building systems and fixtures require modifications. The scope of work for the modifications includes a nurses' station, casework, pyxis installation, power/data, and computer equipment. The completion of tenant improvements at the RUHS ITF is identified as the proposed project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The operation of the facility will continue to provide public services and will not result in a change or expansion of existing use. No additional direct or indirect physical environmental impacts are anticipated.

Name of Public Agency Approving Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Name of Person or Agency Carrying Out Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Exempt Status: State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15301 Existing Facilities Exemption; 15061(b) (3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption, Codified under Title 14, Articles 5 and 19, Sections 15061, and 15301.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of the categorical exemption as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The project will not cause an impact to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern nor would the project include unusual circumstances which could have the possibility of having a significant effect on the environment. The project would not result in impacts to scenic highways, hazardous waste sites, historic resources, or other sensitive natural environments, or have a cumulative effect to the environment. No significant environmental impacts are anticipated to occur with the implementation of tenant improvements at the RUHS ITF.

- Section 15301 (b)—Existing Facilities: This Class 1 categorical exemption includes the operation, repair, maintenance, leasing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities, provided the exemption only involves negligible or no expansion of the previous site's use. The project, as proposed, is limited to the completion of tenant improvements at the RUHS ITF. The use of the facilities would continue to provide public services and would not result in a significant increase in capacity or intensity of use. Therefore, the project is exempt as it meets the scope and intent of the Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301, Article 19, Categorical Exemptions of the CEQA Guidelines.
- Section 15061 (b) (3) "Common Sense" Exemption: In accordance with CEQA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." State CEOA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3). The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." Ibid. This determination is an issue of fact and if sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity cannot have a significant effect on the environment, then the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEOA is required. See No Oil, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles (1974) 13 Cal. 3d 68. The ruling in this case stated that if a project falls within a category exempt by administrative regulation or 'it can be seen with certainty that the activity in question will not have a significant effect on the environment, no further agency evaluation is required. With certainty, there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment. The proposed completion of tenant improvements at the RUHS ITF will not result in any direct or indirect physical environmental impacts. The improvements would occur within existing facility, would not alter the footprint and is being completed to create a compliant and safe health facility for children and adolescents. The use of the facility for public health services would remain unchanged. Therefore, in no way, would the project as proposed have the potential to cause a significant environmental impact and the project is exempt from further CEQA analysis.

Based upon the identified exemptions above, the County of Riverside, Facilities Management hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
