BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside is a member agency of the Western Riverside County Regional Conservation Authority (RCA), a joint powers agency comprised of the County of Riverside and 18 cities located in western Riverside County. The member agencies of RCA recognized that a habitat conservation plan is necessary to provide special protections for vegetation communities and natural areas containing habitat values to prevent future endangerment of the plant and animal species impacted by new development in western Riverside County. In order to address these issues, the member agencies formulated a plan called the Western Riverside County Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (the "MSHCP) whereby a mitigation fee would be assessed on new development and would be used to fund the implementation of the MSHCP.

RCA has prepared a new nexus study (2020 Nexus Study) to update fees for the MSHCP Program. On December 7, 2020 the RCA Board of Directors reviewed and approved the 2020 MSHCP Nexus Study to reflect changes in the MSHCP Program. The RCA Board of Directors has recommended that member agencies prepare amendments to their respective ordinances to adopt and implement new Local Development Mitigation Fees (LDMF).

Pursuant to the Board of Supervisors (Board) Policy A-67, an ordinance amendment shall require initiation by the Board. Such initiation shall be in the form of an order adopted by a majority of the Board members. The order will direct the Transportation and Land Management Agency to amend Ordinance No. 810 to update fees, definitions, and exemptions under the Western Riverside County Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Mitigation Fee Program.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The MSHCP is key to the prevention future endangerment of many plant and animal species impacted by new development. These mitigation fees are paid by new development and used for the implementation of the MSHCP.
