BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Fire Departments Winchester Station 34 is one of the largest and most recognized in the County, housing the lone HAZMAT Unit for Riverside County Fire. Station 34 has minimal landscaping with large areas of dirt; therefore, it is the intent of the County to add additional landscape that is both drought tolerant and easily maintained. The project scope would include but is not limited to, a new drip irrigation system, planting of shrubs and trees, installing a mow curb, crushed rock, and decomposed granite.

Facilities Management recommends the Board of Supervisors (Board) approve the Fire Winchester Station 34 Landscape Project and the preliminary project budget in the not to exceed amount of \$161,632 to complete the project. FM intends to use the best cost-effective project delivery method to expedite the completion of the project.

With certainty, there is no possibility that the Project, as defined, may have a significant effect on the environment. The Project, as proposed, includes installation of a drip irrigation system and plantings on County owned land. The use of the facility would continue to provide public services and would not result in a significant increase in capacity or intensity of use. Therefore, the Fire Winchester Station 34 Landscape Project is exempt under CEQA as the project meets the scope and intent of the Common Sense Exemption identified in Section 15061 (b)(3) and Class 1 Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by FM staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.



NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Description of Project: The County of Riverside owns a facility located at 32655 Haddock Street in the community of Winchester that contains Fire Station 34. Currently, the Winchester Station 34 has minimal landscaping with large areas of dirt. The station is one of the largest and most recognized in the County, housing the lone HAZMAT Unit for Riverside County Fire, it is the intent of the County to add additional landscape that is both drought tolerant and easily maintained. The project scope would include but not be limited to, new drip irrigation system, planting of shrubs and trees, the installation of a mow curb, the installation of crushed rock, and the installation of decomposed granite. The completion of exterior landscaping improvements within the Fire Station 34 facility is identified as the proposed project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The operation of the facility will continue to provide public services and will not result in a change or expansion of existing use. No additional direct or indirect physical environmental impacts are anticipated.

Name of Person or Agency Carrying Out Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Exempt Status: State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15301 Existing Facilities Exemption; 15061(b) (3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption, Codified under Title 14, Articles 5 and 19, Sections 15061, and 15301.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of the categorical exemption as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The project will not cause an impact to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern nor would the project include unusual circumstances which could have the possibility of having a significant effect on the environment. The project would not result in impacts to scenic highways, hazardous waste sites, historic resources, or other sensitive natural environments, or have a cumulative effect to the environment. No significant environmental impacts are anticipated to occur with the implementation of improvements at Fire Station 34.

- Section 15301 (b)—Existing Facilities: This Class 1 categorical exemption includes the operation, repair, maintenance, leasing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities, provided the exemption only involves negligible or no expansion of the previous site's use. The project, as proposed, is limited to the completion of exterior landscaping improvements within Fire Station 34 to make the facility more aesthetically pleasing. The improvements would direct include drip irrigation and plantings. The use of the facilities would continue to provide public services and would not result in a significant increase in capacity or intensity of use. Therefore, the project is exempt as it meets the scope and intent of the Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301, Article 19, Categorical Exemptions of the CEQA Guidelines.
- Section 15061 (b) (3) "Common Sense" Exemption: In accordance with CEOA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3). The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." Ibid. This determination is an issue of fact and if sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity cannot have a significant effect on the environment, then the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See No Oil, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles (1974) 13 Cal. 3d 68. The ruling in this case stated that if a project falls within a category exempt by administrative regulation or 'it can be seen with certainty that the activity in question will not have a significant effect on the environment, no further agency evaluation is required. With certainty, there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment. The proposed completion of improvements at Fire Station 34 will not result in any direct or indirect physical environmental impacts. The improvements would occur within existing facility, would not alter the footprint and are being completed to provide a facility that is drought tolerant and easily maintained. The use of the facility for public safety services would remain unchanged. Therefore, in no way, would the project as proposed have the potential to cause a significant environmental impact and the project is exempt from further CEOA analysis.

Based upon the identified exemptions above, the County of Riverside, Facilities Management hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
