

#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### Summary

North Indian Canyon Drive is a major north-south arterial that connects the Cities of Palm Springs, Desert Hot Springs, and the County of Riverside. North Indian Canyon Drive is a vital corridor that provides connectivity between Interstate 10, Dillon Road, and State Highway 62. The Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG), the Cities, and the County desire to resurface and widen North Indian Canyon Drive between 20<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Dillon Road to add an additional lane of travel in each direction and to add a new traffic signal at the intersection of Dillon Road to help improve traffic mobility. To expedite project improvements, the project has been divided into two phases.

#### Phase I:

The first phase includes the resurfacing of the existing pavement of North Indian Canyon Drive between 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue and was completed by the City of Palm Springs in February of 2017. County was not involved with this phase of the project; the Phase I total cost is estimated as \$300,000.

#### Phase II:

The second phase of the project is being led by the County of Riverside and proposes to widen North Indian Canyon Drive between 20<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Dillon Road, and includes a new traffic signal at Dillon Road. Additional work includes, resurfacing Dillon Road north of 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and resurfacing and reconstructing Dillon Road south of 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The total estimated cost of Phase II is \$4,488,000.

The County constructed the southern half of Phase 2 between 20<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue in 2019 while Right of Way and utility relocations were coordinated for the northern half between 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Dillon Road. The County is now ready to advertise the segment between 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Dillon Road.

In Amendment Number Two, CVAG agreed to increase the Cost Estimate from \$4 million to \$4,788,000 and will ultimately fund 75% of engineering, environmental, right of way, and construction costs, up to \$3,591,000. The remaining 25% of the project costs will be funded by

fair share contributions by the Cities of Palm Springs, Desert Hot Springs, and the County of Riverside (Local Share).

County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to form.

#### **Environmental Analysis**

At its meeting on January 9, 2018 (Item 3.32), the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors adopted the Final Initial Study with a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the North Indian Canyon Drive Widening Project, based on the conclusion that the project will not have a significant impact on the environment. No further action is required for this agreement.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

North Indian Canyon Drive is of regional importance and connects the Cities and communities of Desert Hot Springs and Palm Springs with Interstate 10, State Highway 62, and Dillon Road. The lane widening and new signal proposed for North Indian Canyon Drive will add capacity as well as provide a smooth paved roadway that will improve the safety and efficiency of vehicular traffic.

#### **Additional Fiscal Information**

The total project cost is estimated to be approximately \$4,788,000. Which has been divided into two Phases. Phase I, led by City of Palm Springs has an estimated cost of \$300,000 and Phase II is being led by the County of Riverside, and has an estimated cost of \$4,488,000. CVAG will initially contribute 100% of the project costs.

CVAG, the cities of Palm Springs and Desert Hot Springs, and the County of Riverside will enter into a sub-agreement at a later date to reimburse CVAG for each agency's fair share (25%) of the estimated costs. The reimbursement will be paid through a separate project number, C70029 and is estimated as \$795,475.

Construction for the work between 18th Avenue and Dillon Road is expected to begin in FY 20/21.

There are no General Funds used in this project.





# AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO to the CVAG REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT With the CITY of PALM SPRINGS and the COUNTY of RIVERSIDE

#### NORTH INDIAN CANYON DRIVE WIDENING PROJECT

THIS AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO is made and entered into this 29<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2019, by and among the County of Riverside (Lead Agency, Phase II), the City of Palm Springs (Lead Agency, Phase I) the City of Desert Hot Springs (Agency) and the Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG), a California joint powers authority.

In September of 2016, CVAG's Executive Committee agreed to a Reimbursement Agreement with the City of Palm Springs and the County of Riverside for the North Indian Canyon Drive Widening Project. It was the agreement between CVAG and Lead Agencies that, of the total estimated cost of the Project, \$3,000,000, CVAG shall pay the estimated Regional Share amount of \$2,250,000 but not-to-exceed \$3,000,000, and Local Agencies shall pay their proportional Local Share of project costs, as well as one hundred percent (100%) of all costs not eligible for reimbursement by CVAG.

Amendment Number One Amended the SCOPE of the original Reimbursement Agreement to include a signalized intersection at Dillon Road and North Indian Canyon Drive, including transitions and turn lanes on all legs to Riverside County standards, and amended the cost estimate from \$3 million to \$4 million.

This Amendment Number Two Amends the original Reimbursement Agreement to:

- 1. Add the City of Desert Hot Springs as a local Agency,
- 2. Revises the Cost Estimate from \$4 million to \$4,788,000, and
- 3. Assigns individual cost share estimates for each of the local jurisdictions, comprising the 25% Local share.
- 4. CVAG's Regional 75% cost share estimate increased to a not-to-exceed total of \$3,591,000.
