BACKGROUND:

Summary

In addition to establishing fees and penalties, Ordinance No. 779 includes the basis for operating regulations that include waste inspection, salvaging and safety. In order to verify that the current refuse rates are appropriate to offset expenses, the Department prudently reviews its operations annually and forecasts capital improvements, expansion projects, and future expenses and liabilities with a projection of 20 years. Since revenue from in-county tonnage delivered to the landfills represents the majority of the Enterprise Fund's total revenue, it is important to accurately project future tonnage growth or decline. Because of stricter regulatory compliance requirements to increase landfill diversion to 75%, we anticipate zero tonnage growth in coming years.

For these reasons, and in consideration of inflation factors including salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements and increased permitting fees the Department proposes to increase landfill disposal fees by the percentage change in Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index for the 12 month period ending January 2021, which is calculated to be 2.25%.

The Department continues to pilot the operation of a Materials Reuse Store at the Lamb Canyon Landfill. The program will divert recyclable waste streams for reuse. Until full program costs are defined, the Department proposes to charge fees consistent with the value of these commodities. Proposed rates are based on commodity pricing received by the Department in CY2020, plus a \$6.25 per item surcharge for staff time involved in sorting, inspecting and storing material for sale. The Department will continue to pilot the operation of a Materials Reuse program to identify additional program costs.

The Department operates a composting facility at the Lamb Canyon landfill in order to divert organic material arriving at the landfill from disposal. The Department continues to enhance the composting program to determine how best to manage the waste stream and find end uses for the product while serving the best interest of the public. In an effort to determine if clean green material versus mixed green material will result in reduced handling/processing costs, the Department proposes to incentivize customers by establishing a *clean green waste* rate (less than 1% contamination) of \$37.68, \$5.00 less than the proposed routine refuse rate. This rate is proposed to incentivize customers to separate green waste material from trash before it is

brought to the landfill. This material will require less processing and will be processed at the Department's compost facility. Once sufficient operating cost data is gathered over time, the Department will set a rate based on those costs while taking into account fluctuating market conditions associated with green waste as a commodity. Fees for clean green waste at other composting facilities in the area range from \$45 to \$50/ton.

In response to customer feedback and service needs, the Department proposes to increase the number of mattresses/box springs permitted per load at larger facilities from two to five. The two per load limit will remain in effect at the more remote desert facilities.

The application of an uncovered load fee has always been assessed at scaled sites, but not at rural sites. The uncovered load fee at scaled facilities is currently \$25.00. To ensure consistency in the application of this fee throughout the county and to aid compliance with the California Vehicle Code, the Department proposes to introduce this fee at a reduced rate of \$10.00/load at rural (unscaled) facilities. For comparison, San Bernardino County doubles the disposal fee for uncovered loads.

Appendix D – Schedule of Miscellaneous Fees: The department has historically subsidized the sale of the Geobins (used for composting organic waste) with the sales price set at \$12.00 per bin (subsidy in 2010 was 36%). The cost of the bin materials has increased each year historically, most recently by nearly \$3.00 in 2020 since the last material purchase in 2017. The subsidy is currently 53%. The Department proposes to set a maximum subsidy of 50% of the material cost (rounded to the nearest whole dollar). Based on current material costs, the Department proposes a \$1.00 fee increase for Geobins from \$12.00 to \$13.00.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Waste Disposal Fees are reviewed annually, and are subject to CPI adjustment which, for this period, is 2.25%. Modest fee increases are needed in order to offset impacts due to inflationary factors while meeting the need for capital improvements, and expansion projects, which allow for the continued protection of the general public health and welfare by efficient management of Riverside County's solid waste system. The Waste Disposal Fees charged under Ordinance 779.22 continue to be the lowest in the Southern California region, and the Department does not anticipate an increase in illegal dumping as a result of these modest fee increases, nor are there any negative impacts to residents or businesses.

- 1) Rate for Transfer Trucks determined by individual contracts.
- 2) Loads of dead sheep or small calves from the Blythe service area separated from other waste will be received at no charge at the Blythe Landfill (daily from 8am to 9am) due to health and safety risk in the vast open canal system in the area.
- 3) Certified loads of illegally dumped nonhazardous municipal solid waste retrieved along open flowing irrigation canals, which are delivered by the agency responsible for maintaining the canals shall be received at no charge at the Blythe Landfill.
- 4) The General Manager-Chief Engineer is authorized to recoup costs associated with the segregation of unauthorized waste commingled with routine refuse.
- * Cash customers prorated to the nearest \$0.25
- ** Exception El Sobrante Landfill. Incidental Out of County (OOC) rate established by Waste Management, Inc.

APPENDIX B TO ORDINANCE NO. 779.22 RESIDENTIAL SELF-HAUL CARDS and OTHER FEES - OASIS LANDFILL FOR

RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES Effective July 1, 2021

The Residential Self-Haul Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all residential haulers. For use by residents of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal.

RESIDENTIAL CARD REGULATIONS:

Authority: Riverside County Ordinance No. 745 requires that, "Every tenant, occupier, operator, or owner of a residence...shall not less than once a week, cause to be removed all solid waste created, produced or brought upon the property to an approved disposal facility."

- 1. **Number of Uses -** Monthly Residential Self-Haul Card allows up to 4-400 lb. standard load uses per month.
- 2. Expiration Date The expiration date for the yearly card is the last day of the fiscal year, June 30th. The expiration date for monthly cards is the last day of the month. In addition, any unused punches for each month will expire on the last day of that month.
- 3. No Refunds There will be no refunds on partially used cards.
- 4. Standard Load The maximum load allowed access to the landfill with one use of the Residential Self-Haul Card will be four hundred (400) pounds, which is equivalent to one punch on the card. If the Gate Services Assistant judges a load to be over this Standard Load limit, two or more punches will be made to the card.
- **5.** Cost The Residential Self-Haul Card discounted rate is sixteen dollars and twenty nine cents (\$16.29) per month.

- 7. Lost Cards Lost cards are to be reported immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unauthorized use of a card after if it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick Street, Moreno Valley, CA 92553, (951) 486-3200.
- 8. Uncovered Load Fee A fee of \$10 will be assessed per uncovered load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager-Chief Engineer or his/her designee may litter roadways to the landfill or along landfill roads to the dumping pad.
- 9. Passenger/Light Duty Tires Limited to 5 (five) Tires Rer Residential Customer Per Day. No semi tires. \$2.00/fee per tire.
- 10. Restrictions on Use of Card Household hazardous waste, other hard-to-handle waste, or commercial business waste will not be accepted on this card. Card may only be used by persons residing at the purchaser's address on file.
- 11. Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage In the event that the rural landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a scaled Riverside County landfill and may use their Residential Self Haul Card.

APPENDIX C TO ORDINANCE NO. 779.22 RURAL SITE ACCESS - COMMERCIAL CARDS - OASIS LANDFILL FOR RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES Effective July 1, 2021

The Rural Site Access Commercial Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all non-permitted/contracted entities hauling commercial waste. For use by commercial entities of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal.

COMMERCIAL CARD REGULATIONS:

A Rural Site Access Commercial Card provides for disposal of commercial waste generated within the remote service areas and is required unless a permitted waste hauler or other large commercial users have negotiated a separate contract for disposal access to rural landfills with the County.
