She attended the University of Southern California and the Presbyterian Training School for Lay Workers in Richmond, Virginia.

Margaret married Charles H. Jameson in 1953 and moved to Corona, California, where she lived until her passing. Margaret was active in the Presbyterian Church and the Frist Baptist Church of Corona.

In addition to her family and the church, Margaret devoted herself to the education of children. She was the director of the nursery school at St. John the Baptist Episcopal Church, in Corona for many years between 1969 and 1981. She saw many of her nursery school children grow up to be parents in Corona. Margaret served 12 years on the school board for the Corona Norco Unified School District where she was proudest of seeing the creation of a program for high school students, who are also parents.

Margaret enjoyed designing two homes, including her final home in the foothills south of Corona. The views of the mountains in all directions, were a source of great pleasure to her. Margaret is survived by her three children Charles B. Jameson, Eleanor Jameson and Katherine Jameson Pitts, eight grandchildren, six great-grandchildren and many nephews and nieces.

On motion of Supervisor Spiegel, seconded by Supervisor Washington, and duly carried, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, May 18, 2021, be adjourned in memory of Councilmember Ike Bootsma, an Eastvale resident of over forty-six years, who passed away May 14, 2021.

Ike Bootsma was born third from the youngest of nine children to Dutch immigrant parents, Trynje and Jim Bootsma. They emigrated from the Netherlands and started a Dairy in Artesia, California in 1930. Ike's family was one of the first to settle in Chino Valley in 1938 when Dairy's began their exodus from Artesia.

In 1975 Ike started a Calf Ranch in Eastvale. It was a very successful operation until its closing in May of 2007. The Calf Ranch was an important component of the dairy industry, where they raised calves for Dairy replacement. Ike started what became known as "contract" raising. It was a very good enterprise and worked well for the Dairy industry and for his family.

Ike was elected to the Eastvale City Council in November of 2020. Prior to being elected in 2020, Ike served on the Eastvale City Council from 2010 through 2016 and served as mayor from 2013 to 2016. While on the City Council, Ike Represented the City on several regional boards, including Western Riverside Council of Government and Riverside Transit Agency.

Ike and his wife were active members of the Eastvale Kiwanis Club and raised money each year to provide Eleanor Roosevelt High School Students with college scholarships. They were also active in the Eastvale Roadway Adoption Program and kept city streets free of litter, by participating in monthly street clean up events. In addition, Ike was a member of the local Eastvale Chamber of Commerce and stayed up to date on what was happening with the City's local businesses and the challenges they faced.

Ike's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him, he was a remarkable and dedicated public servant, who will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

Mag was born January 9, 1944 in Santa Ana, California, to Magdaleno H. and Lucy Rodriguez Flores. He grew up in Victorville, California. After serving proudly in the United States Army from 1965-1967, and achieving the rank of Specialist E-5, Mag married his high school sweetheart, Deborah Wilson, on June 13, 1967. They moved to Riverside where together they raised three daughters, Natalie, Timilie and Jessica.

Mag was an accomplished wrestler in high school, he served as a high school, NCAA, and international AAU/FILA Official for free-style, Greco-Roman and SAMBO wrestling. He had the honor of being appointed as a timer for the 1984 Olympics for the Free Style and Greco-Roman wrestling competitions.

Mag attended Cal Poly Pomona, and during that time served as a recreation aide and lifeguard for the City of Riverside. After graduation he was hired as a Deputy Probation Officer for the Riverside County Probation Department and was employed there until his retirement in December 1998. He worked as a property manager for the Lewis Operating Corporation until 2008.

Mag was a past member of the Riverside County Bar Association Judicial Selection Committee and the Riverside Salvation Army Board, and in recent years, served as Veterans Chairman for PossAbilities Golf at Golden Era Golf Course. In his retirement years, Mag loved walking the trails in his community in Beaumont, and playing golf, but the time he valued most was that spent with his children and grandchildren. His family was the light of his life.
