I. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairperson Lee Wilson followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

II. APPROVAL OF November 18, 2019 MEETING MINUTES

Paul Rodriguez motioned and Amie Kinne seconded the motion to approve the November 18, 2019 meeting minutes as written.

III. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Staff Update

Ryan Ross reported:

Ryan Ross introduced the new ARC Board member form the Riverside County Executive Office, Rania Odenbaugh.

The Newsletter will continue to go out quarterly. Please submit any comments or suggestions.

B. El Sobrante Landfill Update

1. General Site Operations

Joe Walstrom reported:

Joe Walstrom who replaced David Harich, gave a brief history of his Landfill experience and stated that overall landfill operations will remain the same under his direction.

Operations started in Phase 12 in June 2020.

COVID precautions are in place at the landfill with use of masks, hand sanitizer, hand washing and social distancing.

Phase 13 excavation and construction is expected to start in mid to late 4th quarter of 2020 and will continue into 2021.

Drilling of new landfill leachate gas collection wells are underway and are expected to be complete in October 2020.

A 2nd landfill gas flare facility is in the design stages.

WMI is currently working with the Water District to install a 1.5 million gallon potable water tank for landfill and community use.

The new Maintenance Facility is completed and in use. The old maintenance facility is currently vacant.

C. Local Mitigation Trust Fund

Ryan Ross reported:

Approximately \$77,000 remains in the Local Mitigation Trust Fund, which is available for mitigation projects in areas around the landfill.

There is approximately \$4,700 in the Clean Money Program. Corrine Awad form Waste Resources is working with EDA on the Clean Money Program.

D. Dawson Canyon Road Signage/Spanish Hills Address Assignment

Rick Lantis from Riverside County TLMA provided an update on the TLMA address assignment process. Meeting participants discussed address assignment related issues in Dawson Canyon.

E. Illegal Dumping

Joe Contaoi from Waste Resources reported:

Waste Resources has removed illegal dumping from El Cerrito Road to Terramor Drive. Waste Resources will work with Jamison Cole from Code Enforcement to remove illegal dumping from private property.

Jamison Cole gave an overview of the Code Enforcement illegal dumping removal process. Jamison emphasized the importance of identifying factors, such as vehicle license plates, when reporting illegal dumping.

Ryan Ross gave an overview of the Annual Report review process

Annual Monitoring Report (AMR):

COC members discussed updates, edits and clarifications for the AMR.

Conditions of Approval (CoA):

Mitigation Monitoring Plan (MMP) Report:

COC members discussed updates, edits and clarifications for the MMP report.

B. Chair and Vice Chair Elections

Paul Rodriquez nominated Ruth Brissenden as Chairman. Lee Wilson seconded the nomination. Nomination passed 4-0.

Amie Kinne nominated Paul Rodriguez as Vice Chairman. Ruth Brissenden seconded the nomination. Nomination passed 4-0.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS (Individuals desiring to speak to the Citizens Oversight Committee will be limited to a maximum of three minutes)

Jerry Sincich discussed hydro-seeding at the landfill, waste coming from Guam and Mexico, and expressed concern over staging of trucks along Temescal Canyon Road.

Amie Kinne announced she is selling her property in Dawson Canyon and intends to remain on the COC until the sale of the property is complete.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order at 10:07 a.m. by Chairperson Ruth Brissenden.

II. APPROVAL OF September 2, 2020 MEETING MINUTES

Lee Wilson motioned and Paul Rodriquez seconded the motion to approve the September 2, 2020 meeting minutes as written. Minutes approved 3-0.

III. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Staff Update

Ryan Ross reported:

The Administrative Review Committee met in early October 2020 to review the final annual report and found Waste Management Inc. (WMI) to be in compliance with conditions of approval and mitigation measures adopted for the Project. The final report is now with the COC for comments, then it will be presented to the Board of Supervisors as a receive and file item in mid-December 2020.

The 3rd quarter COC Newsletter went out last week.

Meeting participants discussed the Hazardous Waste exclusion program at the El Sobrante landfill.

B. El Sobrante Landfill Update

1. General Site Operations

Joe Walstrom reported:

Operations continue in Phase 12.

Construction will start in 13A sometime in the 4th quarter of 2020.

Landfill gas well drilling is completed and they anticipate installing the 2^{nd} flare in a couple of months.

C. Local Mitigation Trust Fund

Ryan Ross reported:

There is approximately \$77,000 in the Local Mitigation Trust Fund which is used at the discretion of the COC Board for mitigation projects in areas around the landfill.

D. Supplemental Irrigation for Outside Slopes

Ruth Brissenden expressed concern that Mitigation Monitoring Plan A-1 is not effective. There has not been a minimization of visual impacts. The Habitat Conservation Plan appears to be in-effective and should be amended.

Lee Wilson also expressed concern over the landscaping and growth of vegetation on the western facing slopes.

Ryan Ross will work with Ruth Brissenden to add COC comments to the report to the Board.

IV. ACTION ITEMS

A. Comments on the Final 2019 El Sobrante Annual Report

Ruth Brissenden discussed B3 Dudleya planting vs survival clarification in future reports.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS (Individuals desiring to speak to the Citizens Oversight Committee will be limited to a maximum of three minutes)

Jerry Sincich discussed bare slopes visible to the community, soils and irrigation.

VI. COMMENTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Lee Wilson expressed concern regarding the adopt-a-highway program on Interstate 15. Art Marquez and Joe Walstrom stated that WMI manages a crew that is picking up litter on I-15 in areas that are not actively under construction at least twice a week.
