BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The American Outreach Foundation is a non-profit organization that provides electric wheelchairs and scooters, in perfect condition to veterans, low-income seniors and those who do not have insurance or those whose health insurance policy does not cover this type of assistance. CID funds will be utilized to help cover the cost of pickup/ delivery of power chairs, batteries and other program costs.
2. The 27th Annual Steve Chase Humanitarian Awards Gala was held on May 9, 2021. Due to Covid-19 restrictions the event was broadcasted virtually on NBC Palm Springs and social media platforms. The Desert Aids Project will use the funds to provide medical and social services to some of the most underserved and disenfranchised members of our community.
3. The First Community Baptist Church has been serving the Desert Hot Springs community since 1947. The church was recently impacted by vandalism and hate graffiti. Several items were damage and stolen. The CID funds will help repair and replace the damaged equipment such as their sound system, pulpit chairs and a better security system.
4. The Greater Coachella Valley Chamber of Commerce's purpose is to support and connect business members and the larger business community to a vibrant local economy. CID funds will be utilized to support local community programs designed to educate and promote local business activity.
5. The Greater Riverside Hispanic Chamber of Commerce is hosting a charity golf tournament in support of The Cheech on Monday, July 12, 2021. The Cheech Marin Center for Chicano Art and Culture will provide a place for all to see, study, and discuss the various intersections of Chicano art. CID funds will further programming and opening exhibitions at The Cheech.
6. The Regional Access Project (RAP) Foundation serves as the fiscal agent for the scholarship fund for the Fourth District Youth Advisory Council (YAC). YAC members are high school students who participate in monthly community and county service projects in the Fourth District. CID funds will go to the RAP foundation to support the scholarship fund.
