- 2) Authorize the EMD Director, or Deputy Director, to execute agreements with agencies that receive the funding for Countywide HazMat Operation Group (CHOG), as approved-as-to-form by County Counsel and based on the availability of fiscal funding.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

On February 25, 2020, Item 3.11, the Board of Supervisors authorized EMD to apply for the FY20 SHSHP Grant on behalf of the Riverside County OA. On 10/23/2020, Cal OES awarded the Riverside OA federal pass-through funding in the amount of \$2,578,162 to enhance the OA's abilities to prevent, deter, respond to, and recover from threats and incidents of terrorism and other catastrophic events. EMD, on behalf of the Riverside County OA, is the lead agency for the SHSP grant. As the lead agency, EMD will retain \$191,400 to manage and administer this grant. The remaining \$2,386,762 is distributed among the approved projects. The expenditure period for these funds is from September 1, 2020 through May 31, 2023.

On December 18, 2002, Item 3.26, the Board of Supervisors appointed the Anti-Terrorism Approval Authority (ATAA) as the review board used for determining the utilization and distribution of SHSP funds. The ATAA board has recommended, and the Riverside County OA has been awarded, funding for the projects listed below. The benefit of these projects will be realized among 25 cities/agencies throughout Riverside County:

The Emergency Management Department currently consists of five divisions: Administration, Community Readiness, Emergency Planning (EPD), formally Preparedness, Emergency Services (ESD), and Riverside Emergency Medical Services Agency (REMSA). Three of these divisions will receive funding for projects.

Administration oversees the management of the operational area awards for the entire county and is entitled to 5% of the overall grant reimbursement as payment for this oversight and can claim indirect cost up to a 10% di minimus for a total recovery amount of up to \$191,400 between both.

Emergency Planning oversees the program management of the HazMat Operations, Pharmaceutical/Distribution Plans and Medical Surge projects and as stated above will receive the following awards for each of these projects:

The HazMat Operations project provides funding to each of the six HazMat response agencies in the county: Riverside County Fire/Cal Fire, County of Riverside Department of Environmental Health, County of Riverside Sheriff's Department, City of Corona Fire Department/HazMat, City of Hemet Fire Department/HazMat and the City of Riverside Fire Department/HazMat. Funded agencies purchase equipment, attend trainings and conduct exercises to maintain Type I or II HazMat status and to ensure a coordinated HazMat response in the event of an emergency in the County.

Emergency Planning will use funding to purchase pharmaceutical for first responders and their families and to support planning for and distribution of pharmaceuticals. The goal of the cache is to provide a three-day supply of medication, thereby sustaining the first responder community

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until additional resources can be obtained through regional or state caches or from the federally deployed Strategic National Stockpile.

The Medical Surge Project is designed to improve the coordination and response to multicasualty incidents throughout the County. SHSP funding will be used to coordinate exercises, enhance the Medical Volunteer Plan, and train/exercise response plans.

<u>Community Readiness</u> oversees the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program at the county level and will use the funding to provide citizens and employees of Riverside County CERT training and equipment. CERT training prepares our residents for self-sustainment in a catastrophic event where professional help will be delayed.

Community Readiness also coordinates and manages volunteer programs such as RACES and Disaster Corps.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

These funds are used to sustain capabilities for the entire OA. Through training, planning, and equipping first responders, the citizens in the County of Riverside are better served and protected. The OA also offers trainings directly to the communities through the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program which provides training to our communities on how to be self-sustaining and have the ability to help their neighbor during a catastrophic incident. In addition, the OA participates in many emergency preparedness groups that are made up of residents and businesses and provides emergency preparedness materials and trainings through outreach activities such as safety fairs.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

This grant is federally funded through CalOES and is 100% reimbursable. EMD will be expected to pay each of the Cities/Agencies for their expenses upon receipt of their completed allowable purchases prior to requesting reimbursement from CalOES. The \$2,578,162 in expenditures will occur within the next two fiscal years and will be included in the County budgets for those years.

Throughout the subaward cycle, milestones set in the GRT will be used as indicators of project feasibility, performance, and grant management capacity. This information may also be used in assessing proposals in future grant opportunities.

A Conditional Hold has been placed on your subaward; five percent of the subaward must be allocated to each of the four National Priority Investment Justifications for a total of twenty percent of the award. To release this hold, additional information is required for the investments identified which must be submitted in the December 2020 BSIR in a manner consistent with Grants Program Directorate Information Bulletin No. 447.
