BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Valley Restart Shelter - \$10,000** the funding will be used as match funding to replace the old flooring in the multipurpose room and the kitchen of the shelter. The current flooring is original from the 1940's. By replacing the flooring in the two rooms, this will improve the function of the shelter and make it safer for shelter clients
2. **The Empowerment Center - \$2,500** the funding will be used for the Youth Leadership Academy which provides a comprehensive approach to building the long-term resiliency of youth by developing their character, person strengths and social and emotional awareness skills. Young people are mentored for 6 weeks in the following program areas: character development, strengths discovery and financial literacy.
3. **Community Food Pantry of Murrieta - \$7,500** the funding will be utilized to purchase nutritional foods, such as milk, fresh produce, and protein foods to distribute to 500 income qualified families weekly.
4. **Community Pantry- \$10,000** the funding will be used for Seniors First – Food, Rental and Utility Assistance Program for seniors over 60, veterans and disabled seniors living in the San Jacinto Valley and surrounding areas. In addition, the Seniors First Program will deliver food to veterans and seniors who are homebound.
