

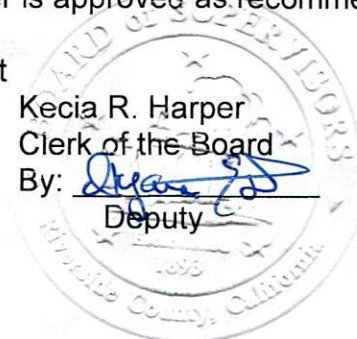

BACKGROUND:

Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports economic expansion and the development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that more than 50% of the WDB's members must come from the business community. In addition, WDBs are required to have representation from universities or community colleges, economic development, and workforce representatives including labor organizations. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official, is responsible for appointing the WDB members for two-year terms.

Francisca Ledoux Hernandez, Vice President of Human Resources and Medical Staff Credentialing, Riverside Medical Clinic, has been in the Healthcare Industry for over 35 years and had worked for Riverside Medical Clinic as the Vice President of Human Resources for the past 26 years. Riverside Medical Clinic embraces community partnerships to prepare our workforce for the future. She has served on the Riverside County WDB for the past 10 years.

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Being a member of the Riverside County Workforce Development Board has allowed her to further her passion about education and workforce issues. With the changing environment, she believes there is a need to develop the workforce and employ individuals with sustainable incomes. Jobs will require multiskilling, cross training and development of career ladders to promote individual growth. She brings great perspective on the need of the Healthcare Industry, which is an in-demand industry identified by the WDB.

Francisca Ledoux Hernandez, Vice President of Human Resources and Medical Staff Credentialing, Riverside Medical Clinic, has expressed interest in continuing to serve on the WDB as a Private Sector Representative for the Second District. If reappointed, she will serve a two-year term commencing June 18, 2021 and expiring June 18, 2023.
