RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- Approve in-principle the emergency declared RUHS-MC Fire Damper Inspection Project located in Moreno Valley, California; in order to comply with current fire and life safety standards;
- Authorize the use of RUHS Enterprise Fund 40050 in the amount of \$123,200, for the Department requested budget to be validated, for emergency work, including reimbursement to Facilities Management (FM) for incurred emergency project related expenses;
- 5. Ratify, receive and file the attached emergency procurement (Purchase Order MCARC-293608) with Prevent Life Safety Services, Inc. (Prevent Life Safety) of Livermore, California, for fire damper inspection services in the amount of \$123,200, and authorize the Chair of the Board to execute the contract on behalf of the County pursuant to Board Policy B-11 emergency authority and Resolution No. 2003-23;
- 6. Authorize the Director of Facilities Management, or her designee, to administer all necessary agreements in accordance with applicable Board policies;
- 7. Delegate project management authority for the Project to the Director of Facilities Management in accordance with applicable Board policies, including the authority to utilize consultants on the approved pre-qualified list for services in connection with the Project, and are within the approved project budget; and
- 8. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to execute pre-qualified consultant service agreements not to exceed \$100,000 per pre-qualified consultant, per fiscal year, in accordance with applicable Board policies for the Project, and the sum of all project contracts shall not exceed \$123,200.

C.E.O. RECOMMENDATION: Approve

BACKGROUND: Summary

In compliance with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Sections 80 and 105, Healthcare facilities are required to have fire dampers inspected and tested every six years. Dampers used in fire protection assemblies in air conditioning and ventilation ductwork, as well as all life safety components, must meet current operational standards and be maintained within healthcare facilities.

The RUHS Medical Center fire damper inspection, which was due in September 2020, could not be completed due to the COVID-19 pandemic surge. The scope of work for the Project includes but is not limited to: the identification, cleaning, inspection and testing of approximately 2,200 fire and/or smoke dampers throughout the facility. The Project has been deemed an emergency by Riverside University Health System.

On April 12, 2021, Facilities Management (FM) issued an emergency declaration pursuant to the authority delegated in Resolution 2003-23 by the Board of Supervisors (Board), allowing Facilities Management (FM) to take immediate action to procure contracts to provide emergency work without competitive bidding. Failure to take immediate action necessary to remedy the compliance issue would pose a health and safety risk to RUHS patients and jeopardize the facility licensure.

Facilities Management recommends the Board approve in-principle the RUHS-MC Fire Damper Inspection Project and the emergency procurement contract with Prevent Life Safety in the amount of \$123,200 to ensure operational safety of the dampers throughout the facility. RUHS will utilize the findings from the inspection report to conduct a formal public works bid to repair or replace the dampers identified.

BACKGROUND: Summary (Continued)

With certainty, there is no possibility that the Project may have a significant effect on the environment. The Project is limited to the inspection of fire dampers throughout the medical center and is necessary to comply with public health and safety requirements. The work is limited to inspection of existing equipment and would not result in physical changes to the environment. Therefore, the RUHS-MC Fire Damper Inspection Project is exempt as the Project meets the scope and intent of the Common Sense Exemption identified in Section 15061 (b)(3); and Class 1 Existing Facilities Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by FM staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The RUHS-MC Fire Damper Inspection Project will ensure the health and safety of patients, health care workers, and the public by providing timely inspections.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

RUHS Plant Operations sought informal quotations from three vendors: Prevent Life Safety, Johnson Controls, and Siemens Industry, Inc. (Siemens) for the hospital fire damper inspection. Siemens declined to provide a quote. Prevent Life Safety was the least expensive and was able to commence inspection immediately. This comprehensive inspection will document the current number and types of dampers throughout the facility and identify any replacement or repairs required to ensure the dampers are functioning properly.

Additional Fiscal Information

All costs associated with this Board action will be expended in FY 2021/22 and are 100% funded through RUHS Enterprise Fund 40050.



NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Description of Project: In compliance with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Sections 80 and 105, Healthcare facilities are required to have fire dampers inspected and tested every six years. Dampers (used in fire protection assemblies in air conditioning and ventilation ductwork), as well as all life safety components, must meet current operational standards and be maintained within healthcare facilities.

The RUHS Medical Center fire damper inspection, which was due in September 2020, could not be completed due to the COVID-19 pandemic surge. The scope of work for the Project includes, but is not limited to, the identification, cleaning, inspection and testing of approximately 2,200 fire and/or smoke dampers throughout the facility. RUHS will utilize the findings from the inspection report to conduct a formal public works bid to repair or replace the dampers identified. The inspection and testing and any subsequent replacement of the Fire Dampers at the RUHS MC is identified as the proposed project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The operation of the facility will continue to provide public services and will not result in a change or expansion of existing use. No additional direct or indirect physical environmental impacts are anticipated.

Name of Public Agency Approving Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Name of Person or Agency Carrying Out Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Exempt Status: State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15301 Existing Facilities Exemption; 15061(b) (3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption, Codified under Title 14, Articles 5 and 19, Sections 15061, and 15301.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of the categorical exemption as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The project will not cause an impact to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern nor would the project include unusual circumstances which could have the possibility of having a significant effect on the environment. The project would not result in impacts to scenic highways, hazardous waste sites, historic resources, or other sensitive natural environments, or have a cumulative effect to the environment. No significant environmental impacts are anticipated to occur with the inspection and testing of the Fire Dampers at the RUHS MC.

- Section 15301 (b)—Existing Facilities: This Class 1 categorical exemption includes the operation, repair, maintenance, leasing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities, provided the exemption only involves negligible or no expansion of the previous site's use. The project, as proposed, is limited to the inspection and testing of the Fire Dampers at the RUHS MC. The activity is a maintenance activity which is required ever six years. The use of the facilities would continue to provide public services and would not result in a significant increase in capacity or intensity of use. Therefore, the project is exempt as it meets the scope and intent of the Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301, Article 19, Categorical Exemptions of the CEOA Guidelines.
- Section 15061 (b) (3) "Common Sense" Exemption: In accordance with CEOA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3). The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." Ibid. This determination is an issue of fact and if sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity cannot have a significant effect on the environment, then the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See No Oil, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles (1974) 13 Cal. 3d 68. The ruling in this case stated that if a project falls within a category exempt by administrative regulation or 'it can be seen with certainty that the activity in question will not have a significant effect on the environment, no further agency evaluation is required. With certainty, there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment. The proposed inspection and testing of the Fire Dampers at the RUHS MC will not result in any direct or indirect physical environmental impacts. The improvements would occur within existing facility, would not alter the footprint and is being completed to create a compliant and safe health facility. The use of the facility for public health services would remain unchanged. Any subsequent replacement of the Fire Dampers required by the inspection and testing would also be exempt as it would entail the replacement of existing equipment. Therefore, in no way, would the project as proposed have the potential to cause a significant environmental impact and the project is exempt from further CEQA analysis.

Based upon the identified exemptions above, the County of Riverside, Facilities Management hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
