BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to resurface approximately 1.5 miles of San Jacinto Street from Thornton Avenue to Florida Avenue (SH 74) in the Community of East Hemet of Riverside County.

San Jacinto Street is classified as a local road south of Stetson Avenue and as a secondary highway north of Stetson Avenue in the County of Riverside's General Plan. San Jacinto Street is a two-lane road and currently ranges from 20 to 64 feet wide with curb and gutter along various segments of the roadway. Roadway resurfacing is needed due to the deteriorated pavement conditions. Various pavement rehabilitation methods are being proposed throughout the project limits which will result in new Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) and Rubberized Hot Mix Asphalt (RHMA) being placed throughout the project limits.

Additional improvements include placement of AC dike, reconstruction of cross gutter and spandrels, ADA compliant concrete driveways, pavement safety edge, placing of traffic striping, thermoplastic crosswalk and pavement markings, upgrading one existing traffic signal and other associated work.

On April 28, 2017, Senate Bill 1 (SB1) was passed to improve the state's aging transportation infrastructure, particularly roads and bridges. Because of this, the County is now able to improve the condition of roads in need of resurfacing or reconstruction and has included them in the County Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). San Jacinto Street resurfacing project is one of Riverside County's priority projects approved for use of the new Gas Tax/SB-1 funds. Without SB1 this needed road repair project would have been shelved until funding became available.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel. The bid documents include the following bid schedule of work:

Base Bid Schedule:

San Jacinto Street Resurfacing

Alternative Bid 1:

City of Hemet (City Limit to Florida Avenue)

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Alternative Bid 2:

EMWD Manhole Adjustments (County)

Alternative Bid 3:

EMWD Manhole Adjustments (City)

Improvements within the City of Hemet are included in the bid package as an alternate bid schedule. If City of Hemet approves the award of their alternate bid schedule, as bid by the apparent low bidder, the cost for the work will be funded by the City of Hemet through a reimbursement Agreement, which will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval prior to or concurrent with the award of the construction contract.

The adjustment of a facilities owned by EMWD and Frontier, are also included in the bid package as an alternative bid schedule. If EMWD and Frontier approve the award of their respective alternative bid schedules, as bid by the apparent low bidder, the cost for the work will be funded by the utility owners through reimbursement letter Agreements that will be executed by the Director of Transportation.

The Transportation Department will select the contractor based upon the lowest responsive and responsible bid for the sum of all bid schedules.

Environmental Findings

The project proposes to resurface approximately 7,885 feet of San Jacinto Street, construct sidewalks to join existing segments, signal upgrades, and associated improvements from Thornton Avenue to Florida Avenue. The project in its entirety is consistent with CEQA Section 15301(c) because it does not create additional automobile lanes and involves no expansion of use of the existing roadway and associated facilities.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The purpose of this project is to replace existing deteriorated pavement with new hot mix asphalt and rubberized hot mix asphalt for the approximate 7,885 feet segment of San Jacinto Street to provide the public with a smooth paved roadway that will improve the safety and efficiency of vehicular traffic.

The work is scheduled to begin Summer 2021, and will be phased to keep the road open during construction as much as possible and will take approximately two months to complete.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

The construction contract is estimated to cost approximately \$1,968,429. The County improvements will be funded with Gas Tax/SB-1 Funds. The City of Hemet and EMWD are responsible for funding their respective alternative bid schedules in full if approved.

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There are no General Funds used in this project.





PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to resurface approximately 7,885 feet of San Jacinto Street from Thornton Avenue to Florida Avenue (SH 74). San Jacinto Street is classified as a local road south of Stetson Avenue, and as a secondary highway north of Stetson Avenue in the County of Riverside's General Plan. San Jacinto Street is a two lane road and currently ranges from 20-64 feet wide with curb/gutter along various segments of the roadway. The project will include the following:

- Pavement removal
- Cold Planing
- Paving with Hot Mix Asphalt and Asphalt Rubber Hot Mix
- Reconstruction of concrete curb/gutter, cross gutter, spandrel, and ADA deficient curb ramps
- Upgrading the existing traffic signal at Stetson Ave from a loop detection system to a camera detection system
- Construction of sidewalk to join existing segments on south bound San Jacinto Street between Lucerne Drive and Whittier Avenue
- Utility adjustments
- Striping of roadway, including pavement markers and reflectors
- Salvage/removal and installation of new signs

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

The proposed project will not acquire right-of-way. Temporary construction easements may be required for the proposed improvements.

This project is subject to compliance with the Western Riverside County MSHCP. In accordance with Section 7.1 of the Western Riverside County MSHCP, necessary operation and maintenance along existing roadways are considered a covered activity outside cell criteria areas. This project is considered to be a safety improvement project under operation and maintenance and therefore is a covered activity.


