BACKGROUND:

Summary

On August 17, 2021 the Board of Supervisors directed the Clerk of the Board to set a public hearing on September 21, 2021, for a list of parcels listed in the "Attachment A" of Resolution No. 2021-159 upon which the cost of weed abatement will become a special assessment.

Due to an error when generating the "Attachment A," the Fire Department is requesting this Public Hearing be canceled so that an updated "Attachment A" can be brought back to the Board of Supervisors and included in the notice of the Public Hearing.


Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Hazard Reduction program is designed to protect life, property and the environment. Voluntary compliance is the primary goal of the program. Each parcel owner is provided the opportunity to abate the property prior to the county conducting the abatement. The owner also has an opportunity to reimburse the county the cost of abatement prior to the special assessment process being initiated.
