BACKGROUND:

Summary

Community planning efforts in the unincorporated areas of the County balances land use planning with other complimentary community components, such as housing, transportation, natural resources, infrastructure, the environment, character, needs, constraints and opportunities.

The Planning Department proposed to evaluate land use plan and policies that govern over and guide development within the unincorporated community of Thermal; and propose changes that will refine the area's land use plan and policies, in accordance to existing land use patterns, anticipated growth, community needs, environmental justice (EJ), and current and future infrastructure capacity. The main goals are to facilitate more housing, specifically affordable and special group housing, address infrastructures need, encourage economic development, promote environmental justice, and consider development constraints, circulation, and other unique aspects of the community, including addressing disparities and health and safety concerns.

In order to achieve the goals of the amendment, the following project components are anticipated:

- Robust Community Outreach;
- Creation of a new policy area, with focus on housing, development, infrastructure, EJ, promoting the downtown area and creating vibrant and diverse areas within the community;
- Updates to the land use plan, which may include Foundation Component changes;
- Update any other portion of the General Plan to create consistency and support the proposed community plan;
- Environmental review under CEQA; and
- Public hearing process.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed community planning and land use efforts will include a community engagement component to help address relevant matters and guide the project. The proposed amendments will commence a process to establish policy that would support community needs and establish goals that would encourage development in an orderly manner, while minimizing impacts to residents and businesses.

Additional Fiscal Information

The initial cost is estimated at \$250,000, which will be expended this fiscal year but may extend into the 2022/2023 fiscal year and will fund community engagement activities, land use/policy plans, environmental review and documentation, and the public hearing process. The initial costs will be funded by REAP grant funding, but a budget adjustment may be needed in the future, contingent upon the final project scope and time to completion.
