

**BACKGROUND:**

Redistricting is the process by which Supervisorial District boundaries are drawn every 10 years to ensure that each district has an equal number of residents.

Under State law, the Board of Supervisors may establish, by resolution, ordinance or charter amendment, an independent redistricting commission, a hybrid redistricting commission, or an advisory redistricting commission composed of residents of the County to change the Board's district boundaries.

Elections Code 23002 applies to Advisory Redistricting Commissions. It states in relevant part, "(b) Notwithstanding any other law, the local jurisdiction may prescribe the manner in which members are appointed to the commission; (c) A person who is an elected official of the local jurisdiction, or a family member, staff member, or paid campaign staff of an elected official of the local jurisdiction shall not be appointed to serve on the commission; (d) A local jurisdiction may impose additional requirements or restrictions on the commission, members of the commission, or applicants to the commission in excess of those prescribed by this section."

On November 17, 2020 (Agenda Item 3.3), the Riverside County Board of Supervisors established the 2021 Advisory Redistricting Commission by resolution, which is the existing Planning Commission for the County of Riverside and is a Brown Act body of five members selected by the Board of Supervisors. Each Planning Commissioner is a resident of the County, with one Planning Commissioner representing each Supervisorial District. The Planning Commission receives support through the County of Riverside Planning Department and meets on Wednesdays within the County.

The 2021 Advisory Redistricting Commission receives direct support through a Technical Committee established by the Executive Office (EOTC), which is comprised of the five Chiefs of Staff for each Supervisorial District, as well as staff from the Executive Office, County Counsel, Riverside County Information Technology Department, Registrar of Voters, and Transportation Land Management Agency.

In prior census years, data collection was complete by July of the census year. However, due to challenges in collecting data posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Census Bureau

extended data collection to October 2020. In addition, during prior census and redistricting cycles, the Census Bureau released data to the states for distribution to local governments by April of the year following the census. This year, the Redistricting Data was forecasted for release to states by September 2021, nearly five months later than prior redistricting cycles. The significant delays on the release of data by both the federal and state governments have created a very tight timeline for local jurisdictions to complete the redistricting process, which by law must be complete by no later than December 15, 2021, to allow for those districts to be ready for use in the June 7, 2022 primary election.

The Executive Office Technical Committee (EOTC) has attended four Advisory Redistricting Commission (ARC) meetings since Board appointment in November, to provide updates and gather feedback. The most recent update provided to the ARC was on October 6, 2021; during that meeting, the EOTC presented four draft maps, labeled EOTC A, B, C and D, and received comments from the public and the ARC. At that time, the ARC was made aware that draft maps EOTC A, B, C and D did not include the California's adjusted U.S. Census Data for breakdown of voting age population data by ethnicity, the Citizen Voting Age Population data, and prisoners population, as this information was not available for analysis at the time of maps creation.


As of October 14, 2021 the EOTC created three additional draft maps, EOTC E, F, and G. The EOTC has updated the original maps A, B, C, and D and the additional maps E, F, and G to include the California's adjusted U.S. Census Data for breakdown of voting age population data by ethnicity, the Citizen Voting Age Population data, and prisoners population data. The EOTC is also having an assessment of racially polarized voting prepared, as an additional measure to assist in determining compliance with Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

The County's redistricting efforts will have a direct impact on the residents and businesses of Riverside County as the results will maintain a proportionate number of voters between supervisorial districts and will determine representation at the County level.

Dear Members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors and Members of the Riverside County Redistricting Advisory Commission:

I write to make a correction to the letter I sent on behalf of MALDEF (Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund) on October 8, 2021 regarding draft maps released by Riverside County and compliance with state and federal law.

In that letter, I discussed that it appears possible to draw two districts in the western part of Riverside County with greater than 50% Latino citizen voting age population (LCVAP) and I gave an example of two potential majority LCVAP districts that could be drawn. The following correction should be made to the description of the second potential majority LCVAP district:


- Instead of: "Another potential majority LCVAP district may be drawn in southwest Riverside County containing the communities of Norco, Woodcrest, Temescal Valley, Meadowbrook, and Lake Elsinore."
- The letter should read: "Another potential majority LCVAP district may be drawn that includes the communities of Moreno Valley, Perris, Good Hope, Meadowbrook, Lakeview, Nuevo, Romoland, and Homeland."

The Board of Directors of the Residents Association of Greater Lake Mathews, Inc. (RAGLM) has carefully reviewed the various maps published thus far suggesting preferred supervisorial district boundaries. We have also met and consulted with numerous other rural community associations representing, like RAGLM, the rural communities of Riverside County. Our interest is in protecting and preserving the rural nature and quality of life of Greater Lake Mathews specifically and adjacent communities as well.

Based on our careful study, we believe the suggested map referred to as "Community Draft Map 2" on the latest Advisory Commission webpage and also otherwise submitted and known as "Walshv.2" best serves the interests and desires of the rural community of Riverside County. Those boundaries would be almost identical to the boundaries of our present District and would add Temescal Valley, Wildomar, La Cresta, De Luz and some additional rural areas. That selection would also allow the community to retain its present County Supervisor. Finally, this selection has the support of the community organizations of, among others, Temescal Valley, Anza, and Mead Valley.

We unanimously and strongly urge you to adopt Community Draft Map 2, also known as Walshv.2.

The City of Palm Springs would like to express our concern with the proposed district maps presented at the October 6th Planning Commission meeting for the purpose of County redistricting. While our city will most likely not be affected by any changes in the 4th District, as a jurisdiction affected by certain County policy decisions and services, we are concerned about the proposed maps and how they adequately address specific issues in accordance with the Voting Rights Act.


The Voting Rights Act of 1965 requires the County to draw one or more Section 2 compliant supervisorial districts. The County, like all legislative bodies across the country, must comply with Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act to ensure that the final supervisorial map does not dilute the voting power of any protected community. We are concerned with the County's failure to include data required as part of its release of four draft supervisorial district maps that would enable members of the public to analyze whether the proposed maps are in compliance with state and federal Voting Rights Acts. Specifically, the County has not shared with the public California Voting Age Population (CVAP) data for the County, and whether and how such CVAP data has been used in crafting the currently proposed maps.


Furthermore, we strongly encourage the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors to submit new maps that emphasize the redistricting priorities in the manner they are intended. We agree equal population statistics are the first priority. However, that must be immediately followed by the importance of the Voting Rights Act, which is then followed by the parameters of city boundaries, communities of interests and so on.



Honorable Board Members:

The Inland Empire Redistricting Hub is a coalition of community organizations who are dedicated to ensuring fair maps in the counties of Riverside and San Bernardino. We appreciate all the work you, staff, and the commission have done in an effort to draw fair maps in Riverside County. However, we are very concerned about the proposed maps to date. We had hoped that with the introduction of

draft maps E, F, & G we would see a departure from previous drafts given the community push back on maps A through D, but it appears our concerns were neither heard nor honored.

On September 27th, 2021 Sky Allen emailed [rivcoredistricting@rivco.org](mailto:rivcoredistricting@rivco.org) a number of Communities of Interest testimonies collected by the 22 organizations who make up the Inland Empire Redistricting Hub. Some of the priority Communities of Interest included keeping the Latino communities of Jurupa Valley and Riverside City together. These communities are cohesive in their shared socioeconomic interests. A second high priority Community of Interest was ensuring Moreno Valley and Perris were kept together. Like Jurupa Valley and Riverside, there is a cohesive Latino community spanning the two cities. The third high priority Community of Interest was keeping black and Latino communities of Hemet and San Jacinto within a district shared with Perris and Moreno Valley.

On Thursday, October 14th 2021, Michael Gomez Daly submitted a narrative and accompanying maps that prove the commission has the ability to draw 2 VRA compliant districts with Latino CVAP above 51%. One of those districts also has a Black CVAP over 14%. The two districts are as follows: 1) Jurupa Valley, Riverside City, El Cerrito, and segments of Corona City; and 2) Moreno Valley, Mead Valley, Perris, and communities in Hemet and San Jacinto.

The undersigned organizations do not support any of the draft maps that have been proposed and urge you to revisit the drawing process and demand you consider the Communities of Interest testimonies that were previously submitted as well as ensuring CVAP requirements are adhered to in your maps.

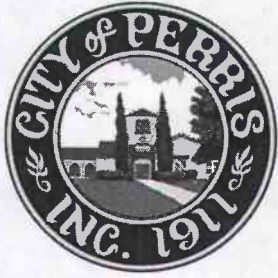

**Re:** Supervisorial Redistricting Maps

On behalf of the City of Perris, I am writing to express concerns over the proposed redrawing of the Supervisorial District borders for the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, specifically in relation to the proposed redistricting map boundaries between the Cities of Perris and Moreno Valley. The City of Perris is one of the fastest-growing Cities in the region, with a 2020 Census population of 78,700. Our neighboring City of Moreno Valley is the second largest City in the County with a 2020 Census population of 208,634. Both Perris and Moreno Valley Cities share more than a border whose residents readily cross boundaries for work, infrastructure, recreation, health care, and other key social and economic networks. For these reasons and as further explained below, it is prudent for the City of Perris to remain within the same district with our neighboring City of Moreno Valley.

Together we share urgent common concerns as we work collaboratively on vital issues of shared interest critical to our socio-economic growth and quality of life, including but not limited to public safety, fire protection, transportation, infrastructure, water, energy, education, environmental protection and economic and workforce development. For the past years, we have worked collaboratively on the growth of our cities and wish to continue this progressive relationship for the benefit of our residents. The Cities of Moreno Valley and Perris work together as a unified community due to our geographic boundaries, such as channels, freeways, thoroughfares, industrial corridors, school districts, and shared history, including a rich expansion of socio-economic development and ethnic composition. We are also bound by shared interests in the March Air Reserve Base given our location adjacent to the base. Furthermore, both state assembly and congressional districts include Moreno Valley and Perris.

We urge you to support the redistricting that would allow for both Cities of Perris and Moreno Valley to remain within the same district boundaries. We strongly oppose any redistricting map that would split our two Cities into two Supervisory Districts, effectively diluting our collective voice. Spreading our residents between multiple Districts would be in violation of the common-sense principles that guide redistricting to avoid splitting up communities that share critical common concerns. Such a decision would defy logic and carry damaging ramifications for our communities, especially minority populations who have suffered unduly under the pandemic.

Perris and Moreno Valley have worked together through leadership and strategic development to grow our economic engine that is making critical strides to increase job opportunities, cultural and ethnic amenities, and the quality of life for an increasingly diverse population. Residents deserve equal representation through a unified voice as a community where our shared interests can be presented in a unified manner. For these reasons, I urge you to reject any proposed map changes that jeopardize the socio-economic interests of the culturally diverse and ethnically rich residents of the Community of Interests containing Moreno Valley and Perris.

Dear Committee Members, Commissioners, and Board:

The Inland Empire Redistricting Hub (the Hub) writes to formally submit our Regional Community Supervisorial Map for the 2021 redistricting cycle. The Hub reflects the combined recommendations of nearly two dozen local community based organizations and their constituents, particularly historically disenfranchised and underrepresented communities.

**IE Redistricting Hub**

The Hub is a coalition of base building organizations across San Bernardino and Riverside Counties. This coalition was created in order to ensure the lived experiences and needs of low income communities of color and working families in our region are uplifted and considered throughout the 2021 redistricting process. Some of our partners include: Conduit Community Development; Community Health Action Network; Communities for a New California; Inland Coalition for Immigrant Justice; Inland Congregations United for Change; Inland Empire Community Collaborative; Leadership Counsel for Justice and Accountability; Motivating Action Leadership Opportunity; Riverside NAACP; Starting Over, Inc; Warehouse Workers Resource

Center; Peoples Collective for Environmental Justice; Alianza Coachella Valley; TODEC Legal Center, and the Way Resource Center (for a full list, please visit our website <https://fairdistrictsie.org/>). Our partners organize low income communities of color, residents of faith, warehouse workers, residents impacted by environmental injustice, residents impacted by the criminal justice system, LGBTQ folks, and more. Through our coordinated education and advocacy efforts, we intend to provide a thoughtful, multi-racial, intersectional, nuanced take on redistricting within the Inland Empire.

This coalition is facilitated by the staff of Inland Empire United (IE United), a collective impact table of community leaders and agents in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. IE United brings movements together around a progressive vision for the region and advocates for transformational change within the counties.

**Community Engagement and Advocacy:**

Since December of 2021, the Hub has met no less than once a month to advance our collaboration. Partnering organizations have hosted a number of educational workshops explaining what redistricting is, how it relates to the 2020 Census, and what its impact on local funding and political representation will mean for community members in their everyday lives. From these workshops, organizations also helped participants identify and document their own communities of interest (COI) so that the county redistricting bodies can process and incorporate their concerns into draft districts. Partners submitted dozens of COIs through IE United.

The intel gathered in these COI workshops and through community testimony was used to develop supervisorial maps for Riverside County that reasonably balance population, comply with Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, honor communities of interest, respect city boundaries and/or natural dividing lines, and are reasonably compact and geographically contiguous. The maps included in this report were negotiated and agreed upon between each of our local Hub partners and as such, reflect all of our combined interest and commitment to the residents of the county.

**Communities of Interest:**

The Hub gathered dozens of community of interest maps in our local contact management tool Amplify. Though we honor them all to the best of our ability in the maps in this report, the following communities are our top priorities in the 2021 redistricting process.

**Jurupa Valley & Riverside:**

Moving to Riverside County, the cities of Riverside, Jurupa Valley, and Corona are home to a great number of Spanish speaking immigrant households. Here is a community united by

language, food, shopping centers, farmers markets, community organizing as well as race and land. Though Riverside is a large city, the northwestern most part of the city should be kept connected with Jurupa Valley, Mira Loma, Corona, and Coronita.

Moreno Valley & Perris:

To the east of the city of Riverside, the cities of Moreno Valley and Perris are deeply connected through: a) large Spanish speaking immigrant populations; b) rising Black populations migrating east as Riverside explodes in population; and c) the shared desire for investment in less metropolitan areas of Riverside County. These cities and surrounding communities, though neighboring Riverside, experience similar cultural needs and communities as Riverside but different socioeconomic needs. As Riverside continues to boom, residents and developers are both moving eastward for housing and development sites, and there is a need to ensure representation and funding for the community is responsive to the needs of the rural-turned-suburban communities in this area.

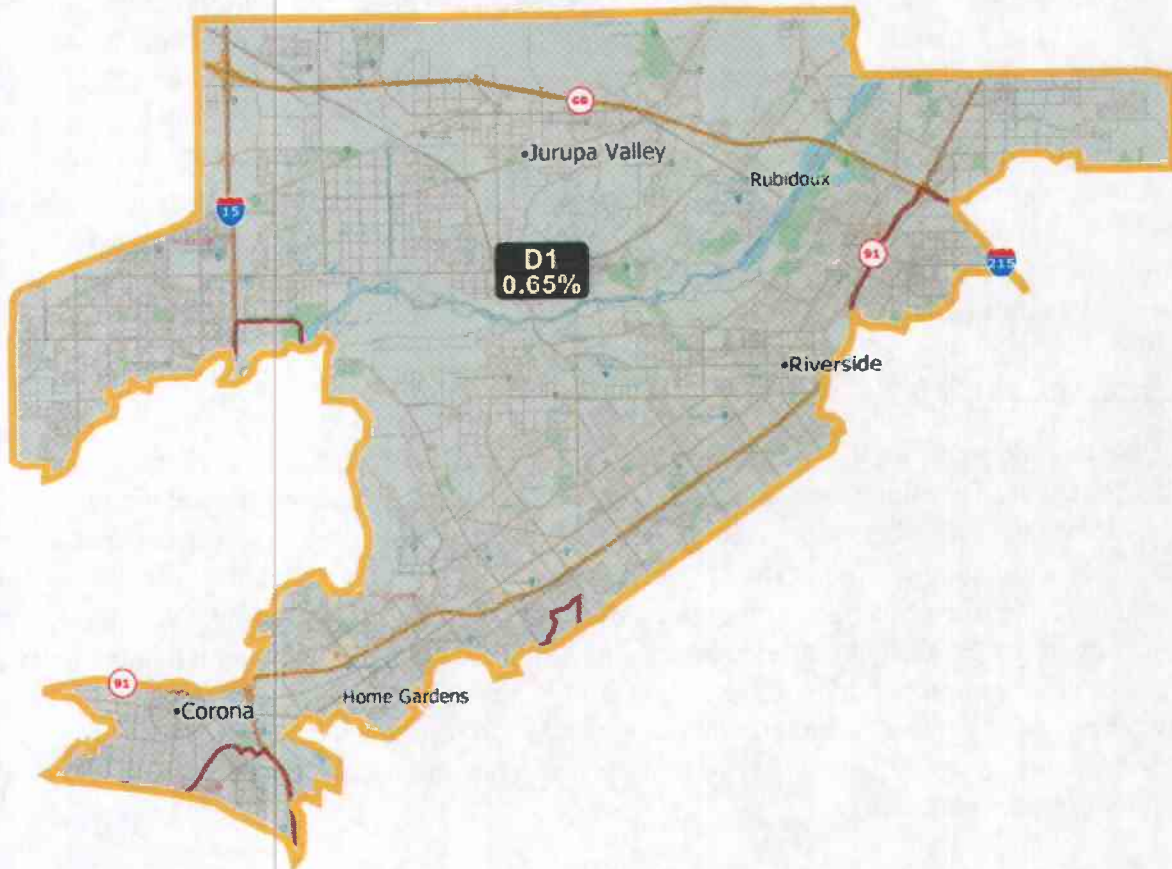
Eastern Coachella Valley:

Our final top priority as an IE Redistricting Hub is the Eastern Coachella Valley. The cities of Indio, Coachella, Thermal, Oasis, Mecca, and Northshore should always be kept together in new districts. Not only is there an exceptionally strong community of Spanish speaking Latinx folks in this area, communities in the eastern Coachella Valley face a lack of investment in the areas of housing and housing infrastructure, from roads to sidewalks to street lighting to community parks. Similarly to other rural pockets in the Inland Empire, the sense of community here is incredibly strong and the activism and community organizing in the region is a testament to that. From housing to infrastructure to education to environmental justice, the Eastern Coachella Valley must be kept whole so that the residents can properly advocate for their needs and priorities as a community.

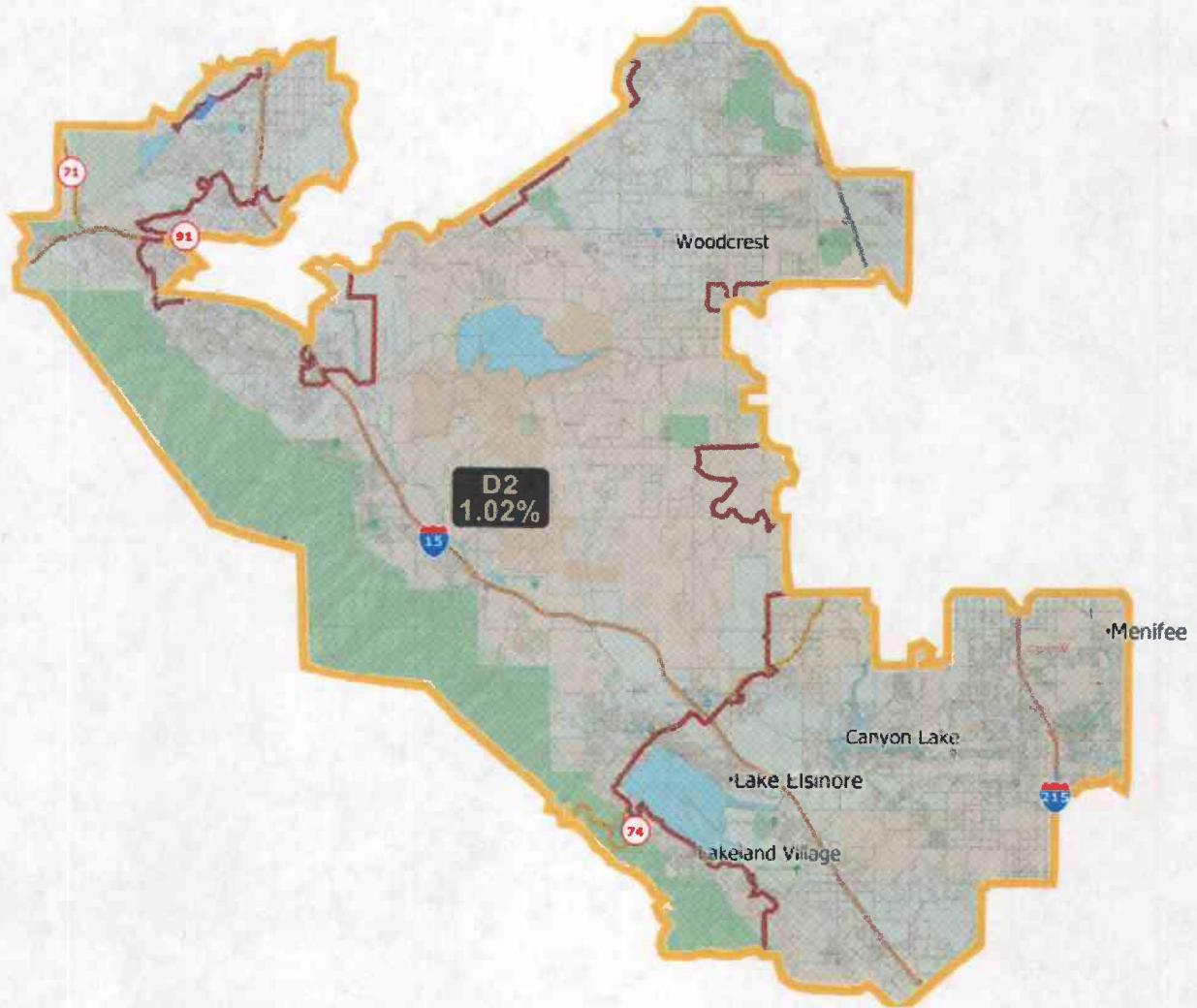

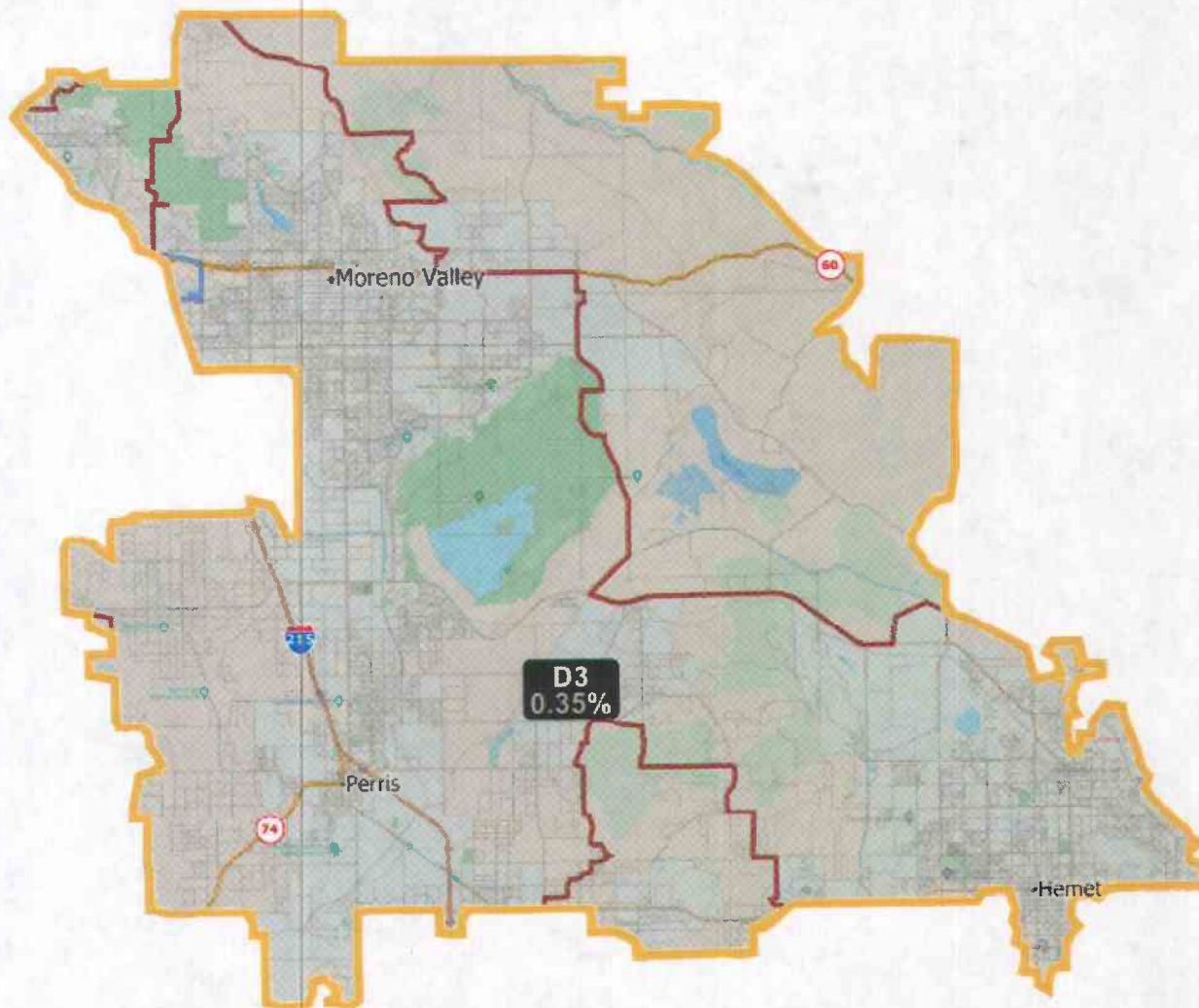

Dear Members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors and Members of the Riverside County Redistricting Advisory Commission:

On behalf of MALDEF (Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund), I write to urge you to re-release your draft maps with data that is required to ensure the County's compliance with state and federal law. MALDEF has serious legal and process concerns surrounding the Riverside County Board of Supervisors redistricting exercise and the draft maps released by the County.


First, we are concerned that the County's failure to include required data related to citizen voting age population (CVAP) and other relevant information required by state and federal law as part of its four draft supervisorial district maps indicates a failure by the County to consider that data in preparing the draft maps. The Fair and Inclusive Redistricting for Municipalities and Political Subdivisions Act (FAIR MAPS Act) requires the County to comply with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (VRA), 52 U.S.C. § 10301, and, to the extent practicable, keep communities of interest together. Cal. Elec. Code §§ 21500(b) & (c)(2). The FAIR MAPS Act also requires counties to include with each draft map "information on the total population, citizenship voting age population, and racial and ethnic characteristics of the citizenship voting age population of each proposed supervisorial district[.]". *Id.* § 21508(d)(2). The current maps only include total population data and fail to disclose CVAP data for any of the proposed districts. Without the CVAP data, broken down by racial and ethnic demographics, the public cannot evaluate whether the proposed maps comply with Section 2 of the VRA.

Further, federal law is clear that in determining compliance under Section 2 of the VRA, “CVAP is the appropriate measure to use in determining whether an additional effective majority-minority district can be created.” *Luna v. County of Kern*, 291 F.Supp.3d 1088, 1107 (E.D. Cal. 2018) (quoting *Cano v. Davis*, 211 F.Supp.2d 1208, 1233 (C.D. Cal. 2002)). The current draft maps only contain total population data – there are no population percentages and no CVAP data included. Based on the data provided with the County’s current draft maps, there is no indication that the County has considered either CVAP or compliance with the VRA in creating its current maps. Therefore, the County must redraw its draft maps, and the new maps must consider the racial and ethnic composition using CVAP data in each district in order to ensure compliance with Section 2 of the VRA.

Second, there is a potential Section 2 of the VRA violation due to a lack of proper analysis of a potential two Latino-opportunity-district plan. Indeed, none of the County’s current draft maps contain any majority Latino CVAP districts as required for compliance under the VRA. Based on a review of demographics in the County, it appears possible to draw two districts in the western part of Riverside County with greater than 50% Latino CVAP, and it is incumbent upon the County to fully explore this possibility to avoid potential VRA litigation. For example, a potential majority Latino CVAP district could be drawn in northwest Riverside County containing the communities of Jurupa Valley, Riverside, and Corona; such a district is geographically compact, contiguous, and respects communities of interest. Another potential majority LCVAP district may be drawn in southwest Riverside County containing the communities of Norco, Woodcrest, Temescal Valley, Meadowbrook, and Lake Elsinore.

In closing, MALDEF urges the County Board of Supervisors to release the data demographics, including CVAP for all proposed draft map options that staff has been using to analyze for VRA compliance so that the public can conduct its own careful review of the proposed district plans. The Board of Supervisors should also direct staff to determine whether two VRA compliant districts can be drawn in Riverside County. Since the recent letter we submitted, changes have occurred by the redistricting committee that allow cities to be split. As a result, we are now submitting an additional map that is very similar to the current District 1 and District 2 Boundaries. Highgrove would move into District 1. Sage, Aguanga, Lake Riverside and Anza are located in District 3. Winchester, Homeland and Green Acres would be in District 3.

The Residents Association of Mead Valley that represents the rural community of over 19,000 residents of Mead Valley submits Walsh V.1 and Walsh V.2 redistricting maps.

**Walsh Version 1 Map**

Walsh Version v.1 map includes a small area of the City of Lake Elsinore that we would like to include within the District 1 Boundaries. This area is known as Canyon Hills. Another area of Lake Elsinore to the north and west of Canyon Lake has no population. We wish to include that area as well.

The City of Canyon Lake and Canyon Hills are one community. They share the same schools and attendance boundaries. They share the same shopping centers and gas stations. They share the same streets.

The Canyon Hills neighborhood sits between Canyon Lake to the north and Wildomar to the south and Menifee to the west. While technically within the Boundaries of the City of Lake Elsinore, they are more associated with the City of Canyon Lake.

Making these small changes allows District 1 to have a more balanced demographic population.

District 5 would continue to include the City of Perris.

The unincorporated areas except for Temescal Valley would remain the same as the current District 1 Map and Lake Elsinore would move into District 2.

District 3 would include the communities of Anza, Sage, Lake Riverside and Aguanga.

Wildomar, Canyon Lake and Riverside would be included in District 1.

### **Walsh Version 2 Map**

Walsh v.2 map would have District 1 include the cities of Lake Elsinore, Canyon Lake, Wildomar and part of the City of Riverside. District 1 would include the Communities of Highgrove, Woodcrest, Mockingbird Canyon, Mead Valley, Lake Mathews, Gavilan Hills, Good Hope, Meadowbrook, Lake Hills, El Sobrante, De Luz, La Cresta and Warm Springs.

District 2 would include a portion of the City of Riverside.

The population numbers are inaccurate for the current District 1 2011 census map that you have online. The Maps show Mead Valley with a population in 2011 of 455. I have lived in Mead Valley for 35 years and those numbers were never that low since I have lived there. The current number would be closer to 20,145. Mead Valley has had 19,000 residents for over 10 years.

Another concern is that many rural communities are not included in the maps. Gavilan Hills, Lake Hills, De Luz and La Cresta are not included in the redistricting maps. These areas have a substantial population that is not being counted.

Please add these maps to the list of Draft Maps submitted to the Board of Supervisors and Redistricting Committee. RAMV would prefer Walsh v.2 as their first choice and Walsh v.1 as the second choice.

Dear Advisory Redistricting Commission Members:

Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District ("District") welcomes this opportunity to comment regarding the proposed redistricting of the Riverside County Supervisorial districts. Only through collaboration and cooperation are the various County agencies, municipalities and special districts able to work together to achieve the quality of life our Riverside County residents have come to enjoy and expect. While the County is awaiting the finalized census data, we want to take this opportunity to share with you our thoughts regarding the boundaries as they relate to Supervisor Districts 3 and 5, with particular emphasis on the current boundaries of our District.

**The District feels that the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 should remain as close to their current configuration as possible.**

**(Map Option "C" attached)**

Most of the District territory is located in the unincorporated areas of Supervisor District 3, along with the cities of Hemet and San Jacinto, but we also serve parks located in the City of Menifee which is wholly located in Supervisor District 5. We work with the City of Menifee, which also provides parks and recreation services to its residents, and have no objection to the city being located in Supervisor District 5. However, if the city were to detach from the District through the LAFCO process sometime in the future, essentially all District boundaries would be located in Supervisor District 3.

As mentioned initially, it is important to have strong, collaborative relationships with the various entities responsible for providing service to the same geographic area.

Working with the County on projects of mutual benefit can only be successful if we continue to build and strengthen those relationships. By leaving the majority of the District's service area in supervisor District 3, we feel those goals are better achieved.

Additionally, as much of the District's service area is located in unincorporated areas, continuing to keep the District's boundaries in one supervisor district provides stability to communities of interest that may be considering incorporation. Even what might seem as minor adjustments to supervisor district boundaries could potentially affect those efforts as local communities move forward with their long-term strategic planning.

In consideration of the above, the District feels that **the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 should remain as close to their current configuration as possible.** We understand the challenges that the Commission faces with adjusting the supervisor districts to comply with the population balance requirements of the California Elections Code. In a county that has been labeled one of the fastest growing in the country over the past few decades, our population has certainly increased. The District believes, however, that the growth has been widespread throughout the County, and that the supervisor district boundaries will not need to be adjusted significantly in order to account for the population gains. This will also keep diversity representation within our communities which has been key to the success of Riverside County.

Thank you again for the opportunity to express our opinion regarding the current Riverside County redistricting efforts. We believe that **maintaining the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 is in the best interest of the residents of those districts,** and we look forward to the final decision of the Advisory Redistricting Commission and the Board of Supervisors.

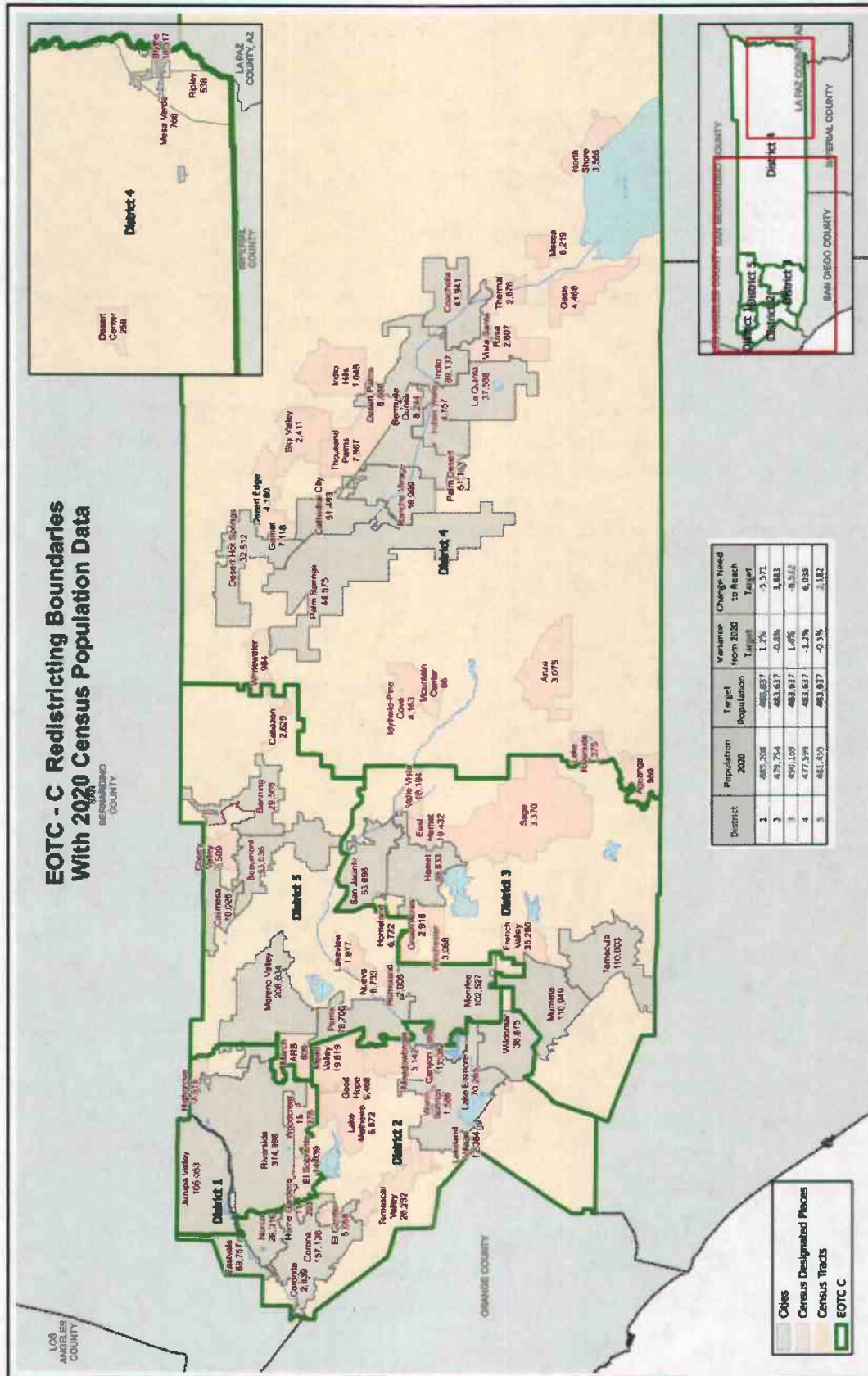

We have no tourism industry, no commercial agriculture and no state prisons. Our primary travel is to Temecula and Murietta to shop, for doctors appointments, restaurants and recreation.

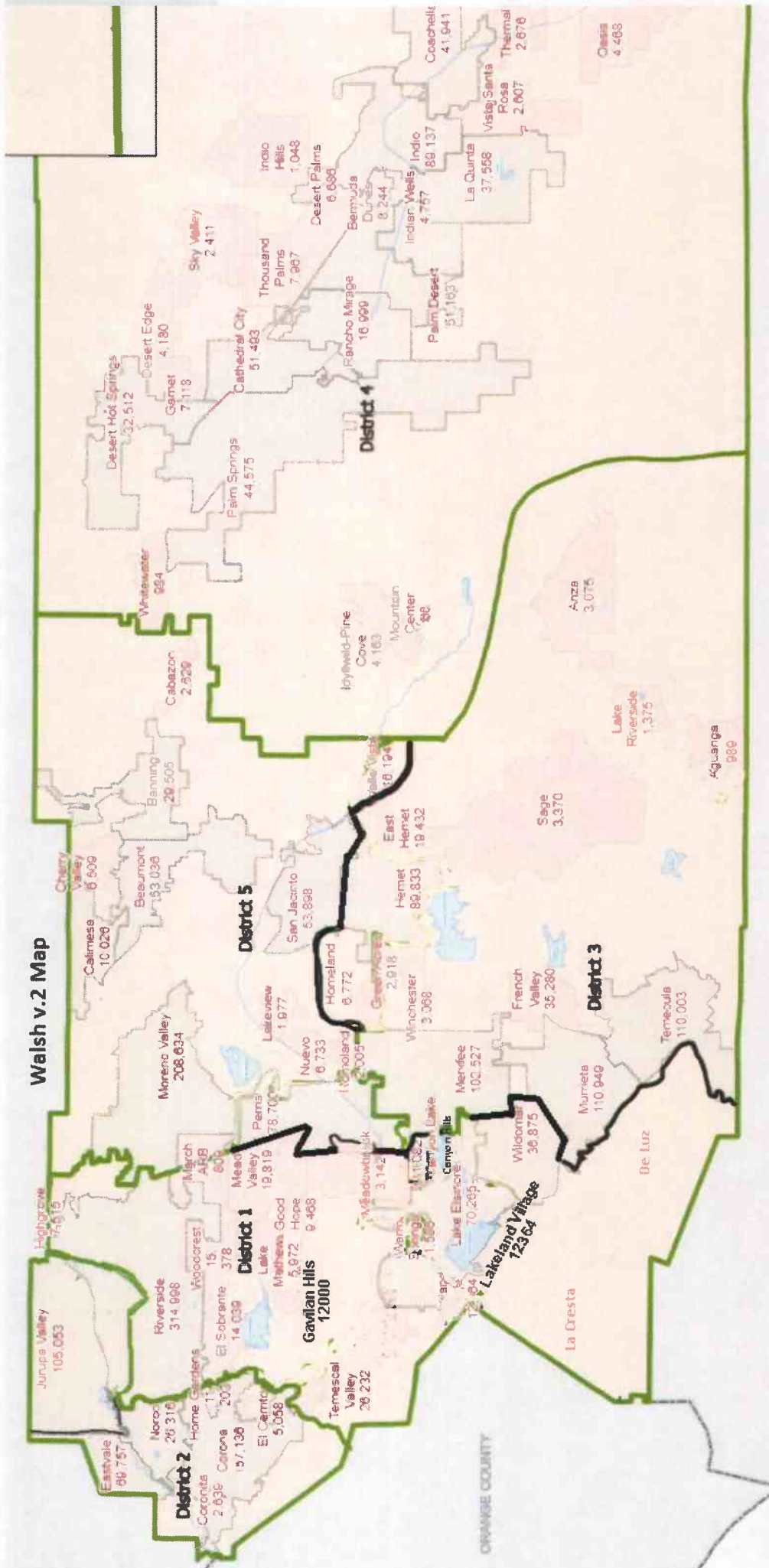

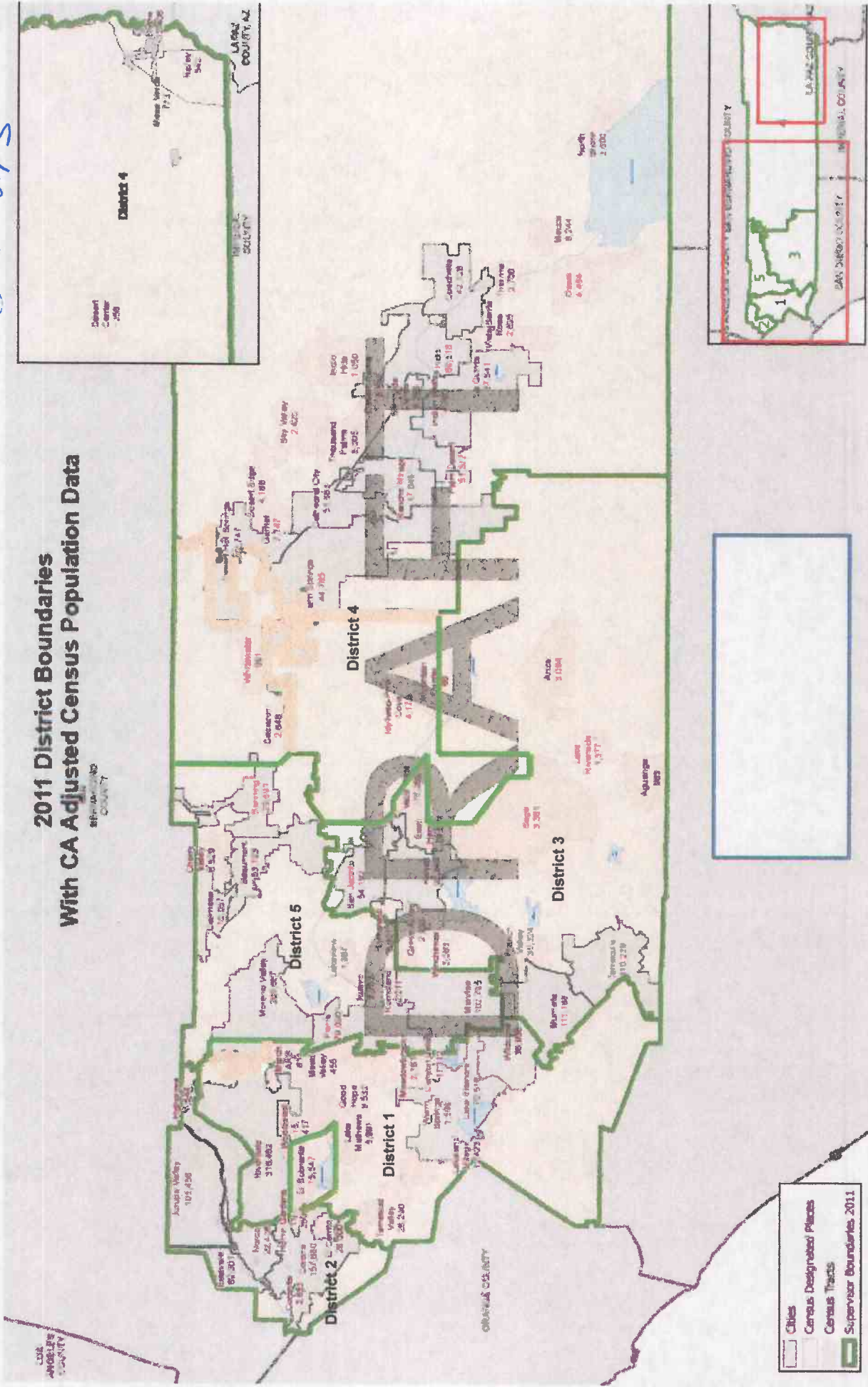

Walsh v.2 Map

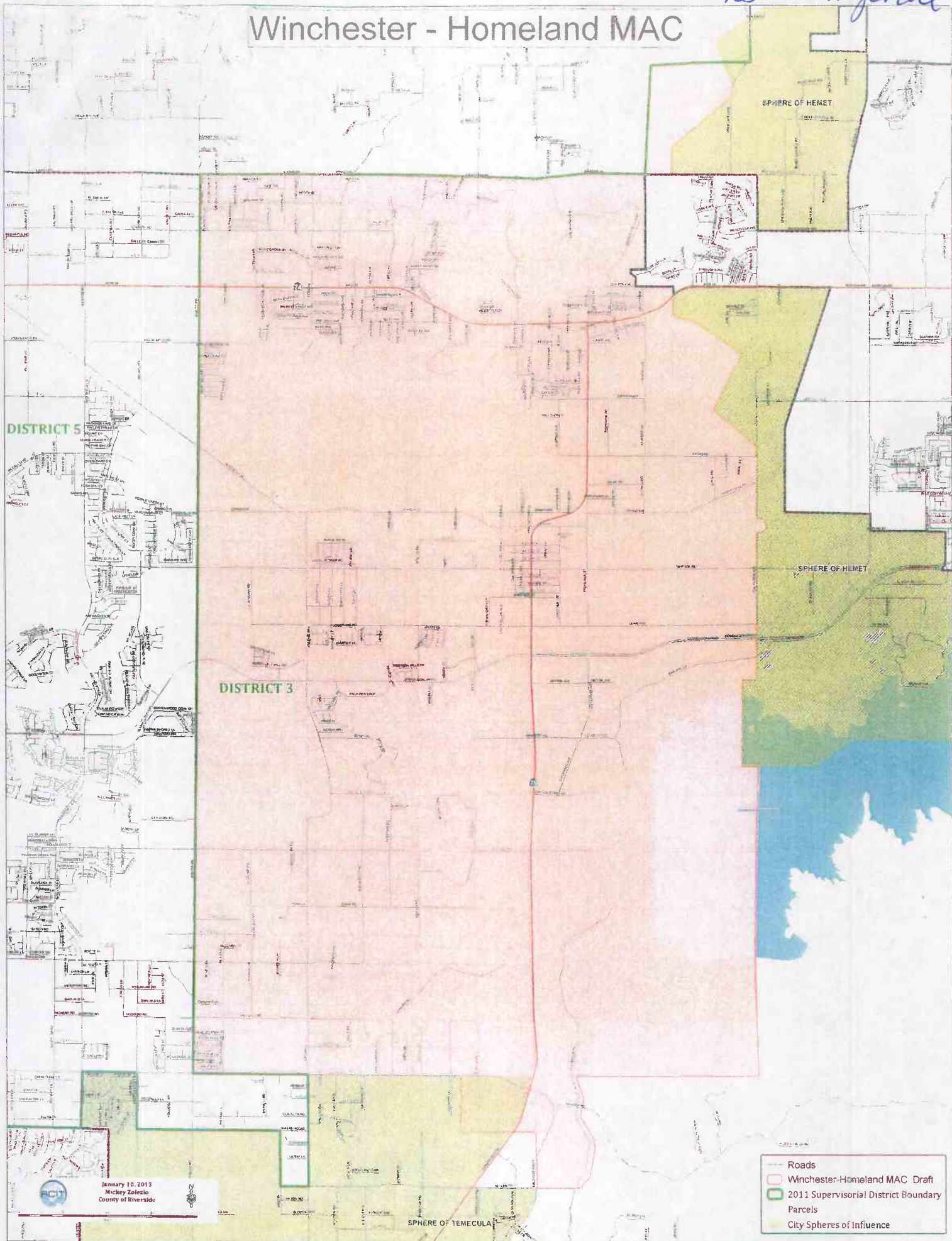

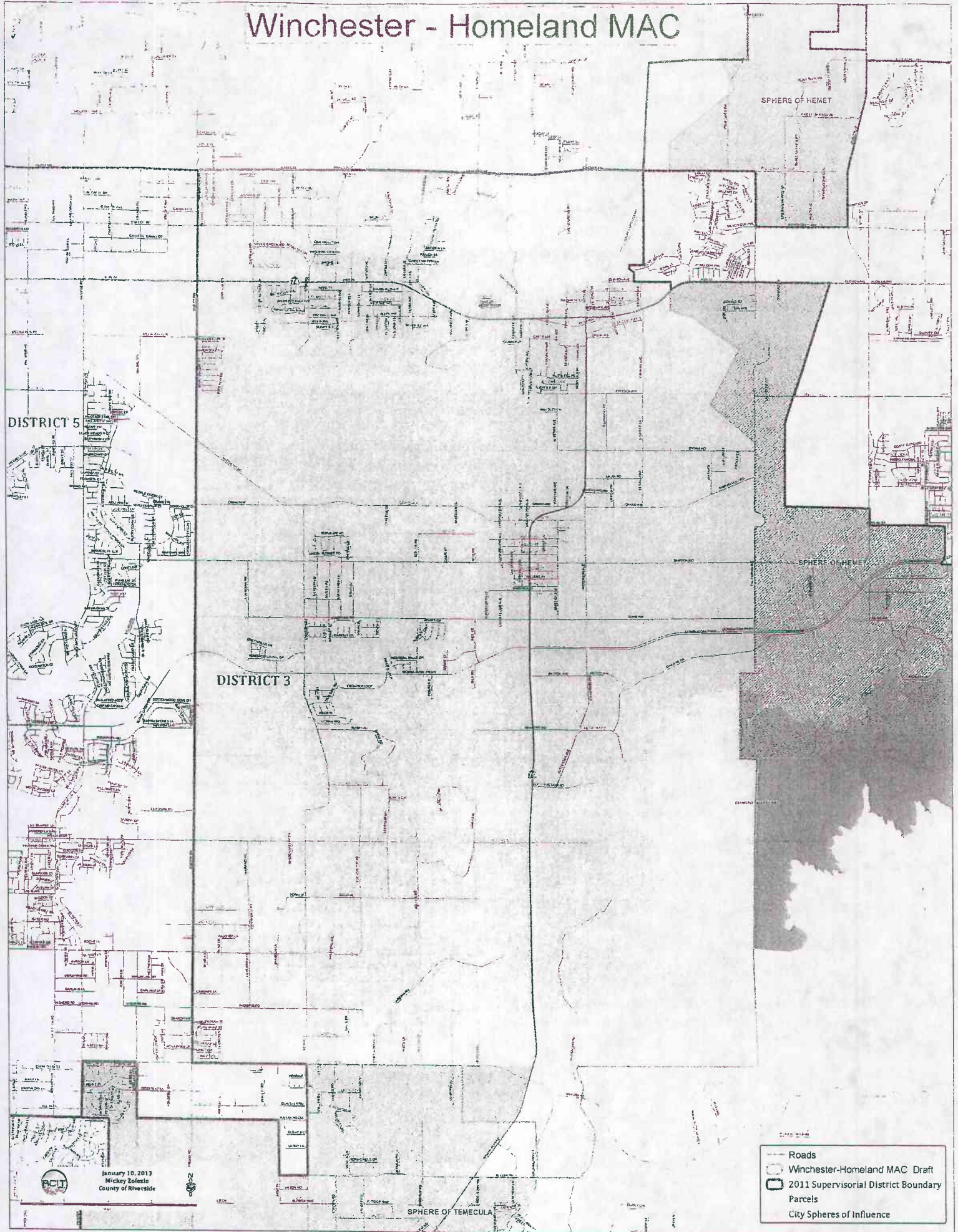

## Today's Proposed Actions

1. The Board of Supervisors open the public hearing and hear comments
2. At the conclusion of the public hearing, that the Board of Supervisors discuss the draft maps that have been submitted by the Executive Office Technical Committee (EOTC), draft maps submitted by the public, and all oral and written public testimony
3. The Board of Supervisors provides direction to staff on the recommended draft maps that will be forwarded to the ARC for further consideration

## REDISTRICTING LAW (STATE)

- Fair Maps Act (AB 849)
- Revises and standardizes redistricting for cities and counties
- Eliminates discretionary criteria and rules
- Mandatory requirements with “priorities”

## ORDER OF PRIORITY

1. Population equality of residents of the county as determined by the census.
2. Compliance with U.S. Constitution, California Constitution and the Federal Voting Rights Act.
3. To the extent practicable, Districts shall be geographically contiguous.
4. To the extent practicable, geographic integrity of any local neighborhood or local community of interest shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division. Importantly, "communities of interest" do not include the relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.

## ORDER OF PRIORITY (Continued)

5. To the extent practicable, Districts of counties shall respect the geographic integrity of a city or census designated place.
6. District boundaries should be easily identifiable and understandable by residents. Natural and artificial barriers, streets or boundaries of cities or counties shall bound districts.
7. To the extent practicable, and where it does not conflict with the preceding criteria in this subdivision, supervisorial districts shall be drawn to encourage geographical compactness in a manner that nearby areas of population are not bypassed in favor of more distant populations.

## REDISTRICTING LAW (Federal)

- Required compliance with both federal and state law
- Overriding criterion remains total population
  - *Reynolds v. Sims*, 377 U.S. 533 (1964) – “One person, one vote” principle that requires “an honest and good faith effort to construct districts... as nearly as equal population as is practicable”
  - *Brown v. Thomson*, 462 U.S. 835 (1983) – “local legislative districts are permitted to deviate somewhat from perfect population equality to accommodate traditional districting objectives, among them, preserving the integrity of political subdivisions, maintaining communities of interest, and creating geographic compactness.”
  - *Evenwel v. Abbott*, 136 S. Ct. 1120 (2016) – The legal principals in both of the above cases were reaffirmed
- Section 2 of the Federal Voting Rights Act (VRA) prohibits redistricting that dilutes minority voting rights



## VOTING RIGHTS ACT – SECTION 2

- Prohibits any electoral practice or procedure that minimizes or cancels out the voting strength of racial or language minority groups in the voting population
- *Thornburg v. Gingles*, 478 U.S. 30 (1986) sets the framework to ensure compliance
  1. Minority group that is **sufficiently large** and **geographically compact** to constitute a majority of the voting-age population in a single member district.
    - *Barrett v. Strickland*, 556 U.S. 1 (2009): a majority-minority district that has at least 50+1% of minority district's citizen voting age population ("CVAP") should be considered
  2. Minority group must be politically cohesive
  3. Majority group must vote sufficiently as a bloc to enable it to defeat the minority group's preferred candidate
  4. If all three factors present, the consideration proceeds to a totality of circumstances known as the "Senate Factors"

## RACIALLY POLARIZED VOTING

- Racially Polarized Voting = minorities vote for their preferred candidate and all majorities always vote for their preferred candidate.
- RPV Analysis = Statistical analysis of historical election results to determine the existence of racially polarized voting.

## VOTING RIGHTS ACT – SECTION 2

- Prohibits any electoral practice or procedure that minimizes or cancels out the voting strength of racial or language minority groups in the voting population
- *Thornburg v. Gingles*, 478 U.S. 30 (1986) sets the framework to ensure compliance
  1. *Minority group that is **sufficiently large and geographically compact to constitute a majority of the voting-age population in a single member district.***
    - *Barrett v. Strickland*, 556 U.S. 1 (2009): a majority-minority district that has at least 50+1% of minority district's citizen voting age population ("CVAP") should be considered
  2. *Minority group must be politically cohesive*
  3. *Majority group must vote sufficiently as a bloc to enable it to defeat the minority group's preferred candidate*
  4. *If all three factors present, the consideration proceeds to a totality of circumstances known as the "Senate Factors"*

## GUIDANCE FOR MAP DRAWING

- (1) Total population equality
- (2) Compliance with federal law, including VRA
  - Map does not dilute the voting strength of a racial or language minority group
  - If a map has a 50+1 majority-minority using CVAP data, close attention should be paid to it as explained in *Barrett*.
  - Equal protection for all voters
  - Cannot favor or discriminate against a political party
- (3) Districts shall be contiguous

## GUIDANCE FOR MAP DRAWING

- (4) Geographic integrity of neighbors shall be respected
- (5) Geographic integrity of a city should be respected by the county
- (6) District boundaries should be easily identifiable and understandable by residents
- (7) Geographic compactness of populations should be honored

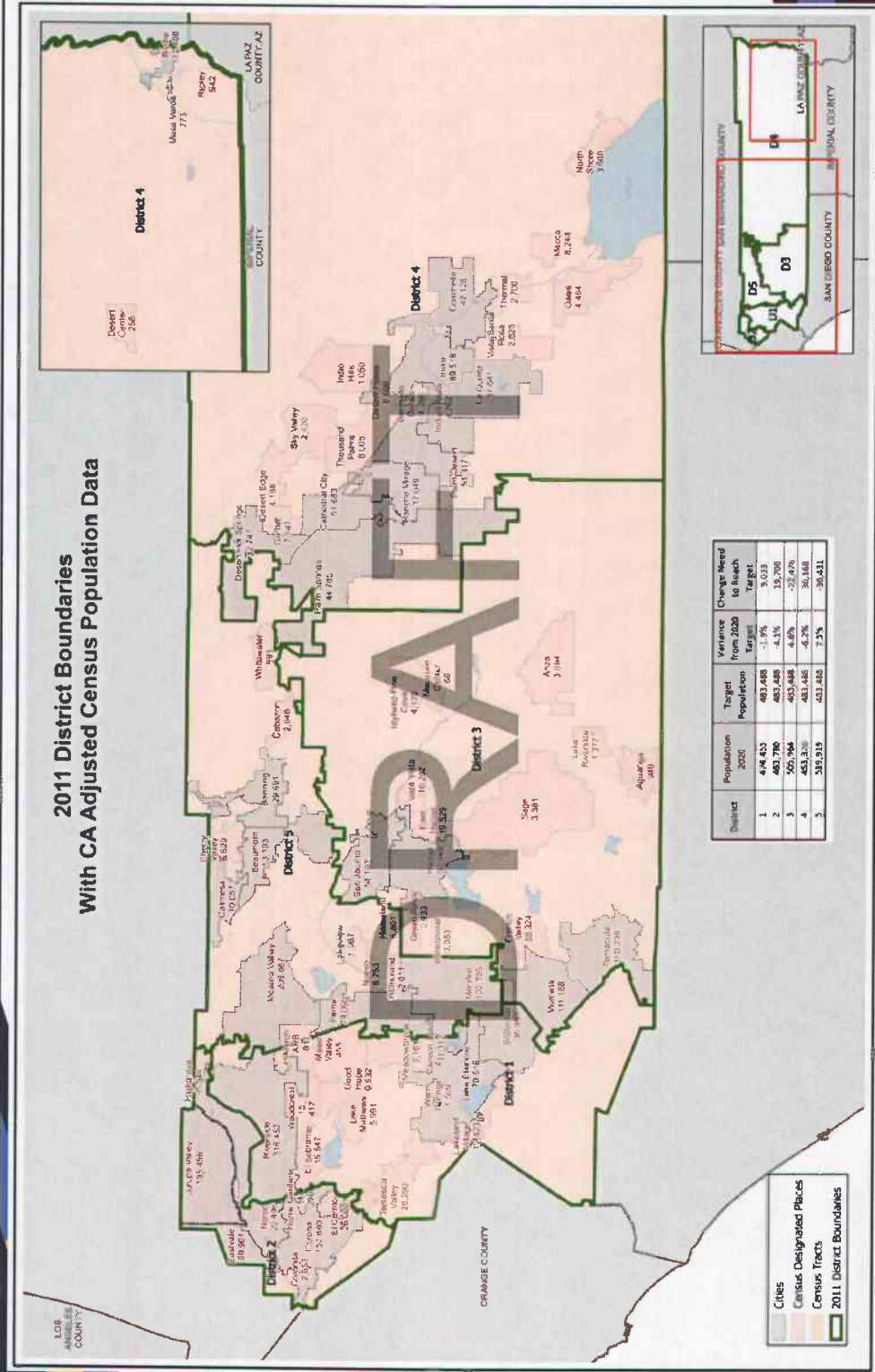

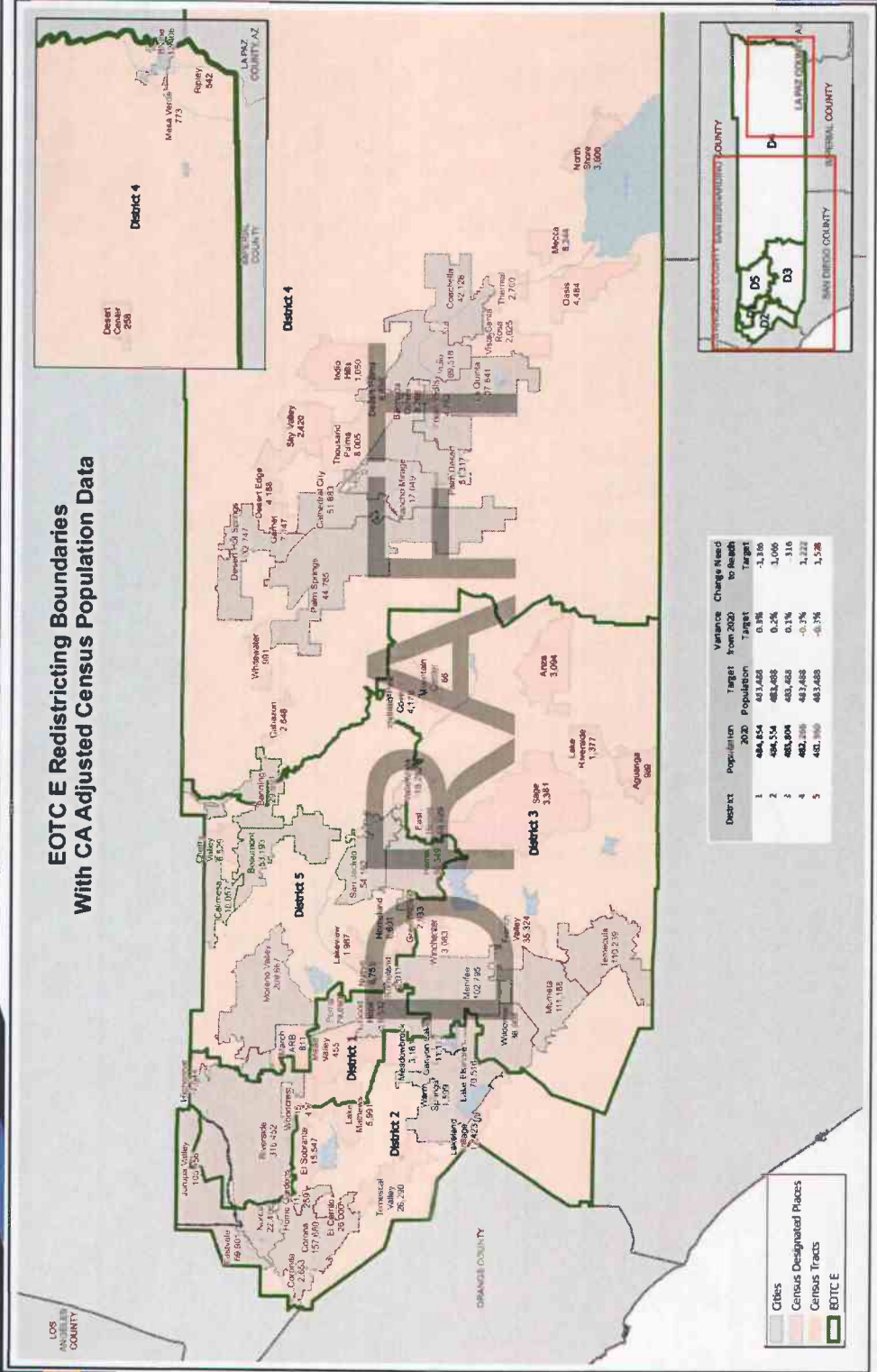
