# BACKGROUND:

### <u>Summary</u>

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) receives an annual appropriation from the California Tire Recycling Management Fund to allow for the awarding and funding of grants for activities that result in reduced landfill disposal of waste tires. For fiscal year 2021-22, CalRecycle is offering the Rubberized Pavement Grant Program to promote the use of Rubberized Asphalt Concrete (RAC) and encourage the recycling of California-generated waste tires. This grant program funds public work projects that utilizes RAC from recycled tires. The grant award is for a maximum of \$250,000.

The resurfacing of San Jacinto Street in the Hemet area and Max Gilliss Boulevard in the French Valley area have been identified for improvements and funding has been programmed for these projects with SB1 funding. These projects have also been identified to be eligible for the grant since the proposed asphalt layer overlay treatment will use asphalt rubber materials from waste tires and that these two projects will produce the RAC materials required for eligibility.

The County Transportation Department propose to use San Jacinto Street and Max Gillis Boulevard resurfacing projects to apply for the CalRecycle's Rubberized Pavement Grant for funding other road pavement projects that will be using RAC and conventional materials. The proposed projects are anticipated to begin construction in March 2022 with an anticipated completion date in June 2022. The expected date of awarding of the grant is December 2021. Grant reimbursement will be made at the completion of the projects.

### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The use of asphalt rubber in pavement overlay application improves safety due to the carbon black in the rubber that keeps the pavement blacker longer and provides better color contrast for pavement markings. The asphalt rubber also reduces road noise. The proposed resurfacing improvements utilizing RAC materials will benefit the communities by improving road conditions to the surface streets.

### **Additional Fiscal Information**

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The proposed projects have been programmed for improvements with SB1 funding. If the CalRecycle grant is awarded, the funding received from this grant program will fund other rehabilitation projects.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATION(S) FOR THE CALRECYCLE RUBBERIZED PAVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM WHICH THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IS ELIGIBLE FOR FIVE (5) YEARS

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code sections 48000 et seq. authorize the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to administer various grant programs (grants) in furtherance of the State of California's (state) efforts to reduce, recycle, and reuse solid waste generated in the state thereby preserving landfill capacity and protecting public health and safety and the environment; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of this authority CalRecyle is required to establish procedures governing the application, awarding, and management of the grants; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle grant application procedures require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of CalRecycle grants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, ("Board"), in regular session assembled on October 26, 2021, at 9:30 a.m., or soon thereafter, in the meeting room located on the first floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, authorizes the County of Riverside Department of Transportation to submit applications to CalRecycle for the Rubberized Pavement Grant Program which the County of Riverside Department of Transportation is eligible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Director of Transportation, or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute on behalf of the County of Riverside all grant-related documents, including, but not limited to, applications
