BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Political Reform Act prohibits a public official from using his or her position to influence a government decision in which he or she has a financial interest. Government Code section 87300 requires local government agencies to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code identifying officials and employees required to file statements of economic interest based on the positions they hold. A local government agency, as defined by Government Code section 82041, includes the Coachella Valley Public Cemetery.

Each even-numbered year, Government Code section 87306.5 requires local government agencies to review their Conflict of Interest Code, make appropriate revisions, if necessary, and submit an amended Conflict of Interest Code to the code reviewing body. Government Code section 82011(b) identifies the Board of Supervisors for the County of Riverside as the code reviewing body for a local government agency within its county.

The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery recently amended its Conflict of Interest Code on October 15, 2021 to add positions, delete positions, and revise titles of existing positions that participate in making governmental decisions. The Board of Trustees for Coachella Valley Public Cemetery has adopted Resolution No. 112, amending its Conflict of Interest Code. The Coachella Valley Public Cemetery has submitted its amended Conflict of Interest Code for approval by the Board of Supervisors as the code reviewing body.

This office has reviewed the Amendment to the Conflict of Interest Code of the Coachella Valley Public Cemetery and has found that it complies with statutory requirements. A complete copy of the Amendment to the Conflict of Interest Code of Coachella Valley Public Cemetery is attached.

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the Amendment to the Conflict of Interest Code of the Coachella Valley Public Cemetery, and direct the Clerk of the Board to notify the Coachella Valley Public Cemetery of the action taken.

RESOLUTION NO. 112

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COACHELLA VALLEY PUBLIC CEMETERY DISTRICT TO AMEND THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District (the "District") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") approved by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors on April 7, 2020, in compliance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent changed circumstances within the District have made it advisable and necessary pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act to amend and update the District's Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in the District being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Trustees of, the proposed amended Code was provided each affected designated position and publicly posted for review; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Code at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees on October 15, 2021, at which all present were given an

opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the

Coachella Valley Public Cemetery District that the Board of Trustees does hereby adopt the

proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on

file with the General Manager and available to the public for inspection and copying during

regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Code shall be submitted

to the Riverside County Board of Supervisors for approval and said Code shall become effective

immediately upon approval of the proposed amended Code.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE COACHELLA VALLEY PUBLIC CEMETERY DISTRICT

(Amended October 15, 2021)

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code § 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code Regs. § 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing Regulation 18730 may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation page, Regulation 18730 (attached) and the attached Appendix designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the COACHELLA VALLEY PUBLIC CEMETERY DISTRICT (the "District").

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the Administrative Assistant-Clerk of the Board as the District's Filing Officer. The Administrative Assistant-Clerk of the Board shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by the Board of Trustees and General Manager and forward the originals of such statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside. The Administrative Assistant-Clerk of the Board shall retain the original statements filed by all other officials and designated positions and will make all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall receive ethics training as required pursuant to Government Code section 53235 (AB 1234). The **Administrative Assistant-Clerk of the Board** shall annually provide all filers with information on training available to meet the requirements of Section 53235, and maintain required records indicating the dates that filers satisfied the training requirements and the entity that provided the training. These records shall be retained for five years after the date of training and are public records subject to disclosure under the California Public Records Act. (Gov. Code § 53235.2.)

PART "A"

OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

Officials who manage public investments, as defined by 2 Cal. Code of Regs. §18700.3(b), are NOT subject to the District's Code but must file disclosure statements under Government Code section 87200 et seq. [Regs. § 18730(b)(3).]

Consultants and New Positions²

Individuals serving as a consultant as defined in FPPC Reg. 18700.3(a) or in a new position created since this Code was last approved that make or participate in making decisions must file under the broadest disclosure set forth in this Code subject to the following limitation:

The General Manager may determine that, due to the range of duties or contractual obligations, it is more appropriate to assign a limited disclosure requirement. A clear explanation of the duties and a statement of the extent of the disclosure requirements must be in a written document. (Gov. Code § 82019; FPPC Regs 18219 and 18734.) The General Manger's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.)

PART "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of economic interests that the designated position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.³ "Investment" means financial interest in any business entity (including a consulting business or other independent contracting business) and are reportable if they are either located in, doing business in, planning to do business in, or have done business during the previous two years in the jurisdiction of the District.

<u>Category 1:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments.

<u>Category 2:</u> All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the boundaries of the District.

<u>Category 3:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the District.

<u>Category 4:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the District.

<u>Category 5:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the designated position's department, unit or division.

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³ This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730.1)
