

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program is to support comprehensive emergency management at the State, Tribal and local levels and to encourage the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery capabilities for all hazard incidents. Riverside County, functioning as the Operational Area (OA), applies for the EMPG each year and sub-grants to cities within the County. As the lead agency for the OA, EMD is applying for EMPG funding on behalf of the Riverside County Operational Area.

The amount applied for has been pre-determined by California Governor's Office of Emergency Services through a funding formula which considers both a base and the county population. On October 11, 2021, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), awarded the Riverside County Operational Area the FY 2021 EMPG subaward in the amount of \$618,175. An application from the Riverside County OA is required before accepting the award. Once the completed application is received and approved, EMD will be able to request reimbursement of eligible subaward expenditures.

These grant funds will be utilized to enhance emergency management and community preparedness. A new Signature Authority Resolution is required with each year's application.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

EMPG funds are used to sustain capabilities for the county-wide Emergency Management Program. EMD participates in many of the citizen/business groups and provides emergency management training and information. One such training is the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program, which teaches residents to be self-sustaining during a catastrophic incident. These trainings are offered on a regular basis and throughout the county.

Additional Fiscal Information

The EMPG grant is a federally funded dollar-for-dollar local cash or in-kind match. Each agency that is awarded funding is responsible for providing the dollar-for-dollar cash or in-kind match requirement. The dollar-for-dollar match portion of funding dedicated to the EMD will be derived from Emergency Services Coordinators' regular salaries that come from Net County Cost and/or local funds, as budgeted in the FY21/22 approved budget.

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The OA uses the same type of formula as the state in order to pass funding through to participating cities and the OA accordingly. All cities are invited to participate in this grant program. The match for this pass-through amount will come from 100% City funds.

The attached resolution has been reviewed and approved as to form by County Counsel.
