

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The purpose of the Emergency Management Program Grant-American Rescue Plan Act (EMPG-ARPA) program is to provide additional funding from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the annual EMPG 2021 cycle on a population-share basis. Participating states distribute these funds for reimbursement of applicable state, tribal, and local emergency management program expenses. Through this EMPG-ARPA funding opportunity, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) will award eligible applicants for planning, equipment, training, and exercises. All planning, equipment, training, and exercise activities eligible under EMPG 2021, are also eligible for EMPG-ARPA funding.

The amount applied for has been pre-determined by CalOES through a funding formula which considers both a base and the county population. As the lead agency for the OA, EMD is applying for EMPG-ARPA funding on behalf of the Riverside County Operational Area. On October 11, 2021, CalOES awarded the Riverside County Operational Area the FY 2021 EMPG-ARPA subaward in the amount of \$78,391. An application from the Riverside County OA is required before accepting the award. Once the completed application is received and approved, EMD will be able to request reimbursement of eligible subaward expenditures.

These grant funds will be utilized to support planning, equipment, training, and exercises, including the development of tools and strategies for prevention, preparedness, response, and ongoing communication and coordination. A new Signature Authority Resolution is required with each year's application. FEMA requires submitting separate applications for the FY 2021 EMPG Program and FY2021 EMPG-ARPA.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The FY 2021 EMPG-ARPA program will provide funds to assist state, local, and territorial emergency management agencies with implementation of the National Preparedness System (NPS) and to support the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient nation.

This grant is a federally funded dollar-for-dollar local cash or in-kind match. The dollar-for-dollar match portion of funding dedicated to the EMD will be derived from Emergency Services Coordinators' regular salaries that come from Net County Cost and/or local funds.
