BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Temecula Sunrise Rotary Foundation \$1,000 funding will be used towards food and supplies for the free drive-up for Christmas meals on Christmas Day. The Foundation also delivers warm Christmas meals to homebound seniors.
- 2. NAMI Mt San Jacinto \$1,000 funds will be used towards the 16th Annual NAMIWalks Inland Empire. NAMI provides advocacy, education, support, and public awareness so that all individuals and families affected by mental illness can build better lives.
- 3. Hemet/San Jacinto Valley Chamber of Commerce \$1,500 the funds will be utilized for the Hemet State of the City Address. This event allows communication directly to the citizens of Hemet as to current and future initiatives within the city.
- 4. Murrieta/Wildomar Chamber of Commerce \$1,500 the funding will be used for the chamber annual awards presentation that honors and supports exceptional businesses that demonstrate strong community involvement in the Southwest area.
- 5. Family Service Association \$1,500 funds will support the HOPE for the Holidays Program. While in placement, resources are often scarce for all but food, clothing, and shelter. This can make the holidays a very difficult time for foster youth. This program provides gifts to over 200 foster youth and families in the Third District.
- 6. Riverside County Foundation on Aging \$1,500 the funds will help support seniors' nutrition needs through provision of gift cards from local grocery stores to purchase groceries, medicine, and daily living necessities during the holiday season.

- 7. Murrieta Rotary \$2,500 funding will be used for the 13th Annual Murrieta Field of Honor which honors heroes those who served or are serving in the United States armed forces, law enforcement, fire, and other first responder posts.
- 8. Trauma Intervention Programs of Southwest Riverside County \$3,000 funds will be used to recruit new volunteers and provide them with a 55-hour trauma intervention program training to be able to help others in traumatic crises.
