BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- Red Zone, Inc. \$5,000 funding will be used to support summer day camps for kids that
 are ages 6-14 for low socioeconomic areas that cannot afford summer camps. This is in
 partnership with the Val Verde Unified School District to serve children in the Mead
 Valley area.
- 2. Riverside National Cemetery Support Committee \$2,500 funds will be used to assist with the maintenance and operations of the Riverside National Cemetery.
- 3. City of Riverside Mayor's Office \$1,000 funds will be used to support the City's efforts to repair the Riverside Military Wall of Honor. After 25 years after the unveiling, the monument is in desperate need of repairs and modern enhancements.
- **4. Civil Rights Institute of Inland Southern California \$3,750** funding will be used to support a 2 day event to document African American history of Riverside County focusing on Good Hope, Mead Valley, and the greater Perris areas in partnership with the Civil Rights Institute of Inland Southern California and the "Bridges That Carried US Over Project: Documenting Black History in the Inland Empire".
