- 2. Authorize RUHS-BH Director to sign any future agreements for NPLH Competitive Allocation Funds that includes signature of acceptance documents, agreements, and/or subsequent ministerial amendments, and related documents that do not change the substantive terms of the Agreement.

BACKGROUND:

<u>Summary</u>

On July 1, 2016, Governor Brown signed landmark legislation enacting the No Place Like Home (NPLH) program to dedicate up to \$2 billion in bond proceeds to invest in the development of permanent supportive housing for persons who are in need of mental health services and are experiencing homelessness, chronic homelessness, or who are at risk of chronic homelessness. NPLH funds may be used to acquire, design, construct, rehabilitate, or preserve permanent supportive housing. Awarded counties are responsible to provide on-site supportive services to tenants for a minimum of 20 years. These services are consistent with services already provided by RUHS-BH.

On October 29, 2021, Housing and Community Development (HCD) released Round 4 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Competitive Allocation Funds for NPLH, totaling \$231.4 million. Applications submitted by Riverside County will compete with 10 other "Large Counties" (as defined in the NPLH program guidelines) for \$121.2 million in Round 4 funding. Funds will be used for deferred payment loans to finance the development of permanent supportive housing for persons with a serious mental illness who are homeless, chronically homeless or at-risk of chronic homelessness. The deadline for the County to take action and submit application(s) is January 19, 2022 by 5:00 PM PST. It is anticipated that awards will be announced in Spring of 2022.

HCD requires a separate resolution of the Board of Supervisors to authorize the County to apply in conjunction with a partner developer/development and to accept if awarded, any NPLH Competitive Allocation funds. As the need for permanent supportive housing continues to grow, RUHS-BH, on behalf of Riverside County, is requesting the Board of Supervisors to adopt Resolution 2022-013 authorizing the Director of Behavioral Health to apply for and accept, if approved, an award of NPLH Competitive Allocation Funds and to execute all related documents in connection with the Competitive Allocation Funding for NPLH.

JFM Villas Family Apartments will be the developer on the application for this proposed resolution. A subsequent agreement will be put forth after the Spring of 2022 to the Board of Supervisors if the developer is awarded funds from the No Place Like Home program.

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Impact on Citizens and Businesses

These services are a component of the Department's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

Additional Fiscal Information

The No Place Like Home program is one hundred percent (100%) State funded. There are sufficient funds in the Department's FY21/22 budget and no additional County funds are required.

RUHS-BH has participated in several NPLH funding opportunities in the past, which are listed below.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-013

AUTHORIZATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NO PLACE LIKE HOME PROGRAM (Round 4) COMPETITIVE ALLOCATION

"JFM Villas Family Apartments"

WHEREAS, the State of California, Department of Housing and Community Development
("Department") issued a Notice of Funding Availability for Round 4, dated October 29, 2021, as may be
amended from time to time, ("NOFA"), under the No Place Like Home Program ("NPLH" or "Program")
authorized by Government Code section 15463, Part 3.9 of Division 5 (commencing with Section 5849.1)
of the Welfare and Institutions Code, and Welfare and Institutions Code section 5890;

WHEREAS, the NOFA relates to the availability of approximately \$231.4 million in Competitive Allocation funds under the NPLH Program; and

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside is a County and an Applicant, as those terms are defined in the NPLH Program Guidelines, enacted in October 2020 ("Guidelines").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors for County does hereby determine and declare as follows:

SECTION 1. That County is hereby authorized and directed to apply for and if awarded, accept funds from the NPLH Program not to exceed \$121,200,609 ("NPLH Loan").

SECTION 2. That the Director of Behavioral Health, or his or her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to act on behalf of County in connection with an award of NPLH Loan, and to enter into, execute, and deliver any and all documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to evidence the loan of NPLH Loan, the County's obligations related thereto, and the Department's security therefore. These documents may include, but are not limited to, a State of California Standard Agreement ("Standard Agreement"), a regulatory agreement, a promissory note, a deed of trust and security agreement, and any and all other documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate by the Department as security for, evidence of, or

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pertaining to the NPLH Program funds, an all amendments thereto (collectively, the "NPLH Program Documents").

SECTION 3. That County shall be subject to the terms and conditions that are specified in the Standard Agreement; that the application in full is incorporated as part of the Standard Agreement; that any and all activities funded, information provided, and timelines represented in the application are enforceable through the Standard Agreement; and that County will use the NPLH Loan in accordance with the Guidelines, other applicable rules and laws, the NPLH Program Documents, and any and all NPLH Program requirements.

SECTION 4. That County will make mental health supportive services available to each project's NPLH tenants for at least 20 years, and will coordinate the provision of or referral to other services (including, but not limited to, substance use services) in accordance with the County's relevant supportive services plan, and as specified in Section 203 of the Guidelines.
