#### BACKGROUND:

#### **Summary**

The TLMA Code Enforcement Department needs to increase its fleet by eight (8) vehicles, all 4X4 Mid-Size SUVs in its neighborhood enforcement fleet. The department has 11 vehicles that are 13 years or older in its current fleet, of which four (4) are F250 Trucks. Code Enforcement vehicles that are over the 7-year mark are no longer covered under the maintenance agreement, and the F250 trucks are not cost effective to be driven around for Code Enforcement officers. The trucks will still be used for abatement activity and special enforcement when necessary.

The Code Enforcement Department plans to use Special Assessment revenues collected through cost recovery process to purchase the vehicles.

## Impact on Residents and Businesses

The purchase is being funded 100% by fees already collected and set aside for the Code Enforcement Department, therefore there is no impact on the General Fund
