The information I will be presenting this week and next week was presented to RIVCO Transportation and BoS Washington's Staff prior to the vacation public hearing of Caravel Lane or was made available to them.

- <u>RIVCO Ethical Conduct Standards</u>: Public's Interest, Dedication, Policy Makers, Public Awareness, <u>Honesty, Integrity, Trustworthiness, Fairness</u>, Concern for Others, <u>Law Abiding, Commitment to Excellence, Leadership, Reputation and Morale, and Accountability.</u>
- During Boers' last presentation to the RIVCO BoS on 25 Jan 2020 during the open comments section of public hearing where present three emails on how a <u>RIVCO Senior Financial</u> <u>Analyst with RIVCO Transporation Commision (RCTC) used their official RCTC.org work email and title while communicating during work hours with other RVICO agencies to facilitate the vacation of Caravel Lane that would benefit this RCTC public servant and her family with a FREE GIFT of Public Land. Does a RIVCO Sr. Financial Analyst normally handle the process of a vacation or is this just a <u>Conflict of Interest?</u>
 </u>
- Boers' also informed the RIVCO BoS that during a sworn deposition Paul Hillmer, A Senior Land Surveyor with RIVCO Transportation Survey Division Right-of-Way & Record of Survey, was asked if he knew the RIVCO Senior Financial Analyst, Hillmer responded. "No."
- During that same sworn deposition <u>Hillmer was presented an email (just one of many) that showed Hillmer did in fact have email contact and phone conversations with that RIVCO Senior Analyst.</u> Once presented with that information <u>Hillmer changed his answer and acknowledge that he did know this person.</u> Is this acceptable conduct for a Sr. Land Surveyor? Is this considered being honest or demonstrating one's integrity, trustworthiness, and fairness.
- It should be noted that RIVCO Counsel was present for Hillmer's deposition. A copy of Hillmer's deposition was provided to RIVCO BoS Chuck Washington's Staff along with other information on how the vacation of Caravel Lane and possibly some questionable conduct of some RIVCO employees and some RIVCO public servants handling the vacation of Caravel Lane.
- Is this what RIVCO considers acceptable ethical standards of conduct? I don't believe some RIVCO Leadership or any reasonable person would consider this acceptable behavior.
 However this is just an example how the vacation of Caravel Lane was mishandled and pushed through, that benefited this RIVCO Public Servant and their family in receiving a FREE

GIFT of Public Land by some RIVCO employees and other RIVCO officials actions or lack of action.

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RIVCO Director of Transportation tells RIVCO BoS in Public hearing, "No fire Hydrant along the area to be vacated."



- <u>RIVCO Transportation had received</u> not one, but two encroachment reports of Cibola Circle and part of Caravel Lane that was done by a CA State Licensed Surveyor, and was
 paid for by Boers. The second survey showed that the applicant had numerous encroachments in Cibola Circle which would render the road in some areas to less than 24' wide.
- Date of the first survey was April 2018 and the second survey was December 2020. Both surveys encroachment reports where provided to the RIVCO Transportation Department.
- <u>RIVCO Transporation</u>, nor the applicated, did not do any type of onsite physical survey of Cibola Circle or Caravel Lane as part of the vacation packet for Caravel Lane. Nor was an engineer report done for Cibola Circle or Caravel Lane.
- The RCTC Sr. Fianacial Analyst public servant, who is the applicant's daughter, stated in an email to both RIVCO Fire and Hillmer that the road been widen to 30' by CSA149, which was not a factual accurate statement.
- The survey encroachment report that Boers' provided to the RIVCO Transportation department showed that some areas of Cibola Circle was less than 24' feet, because of the applicants encroachments.
- Hillmer instead chose to take the word of a RIVCO RCTC public servant (the applicant's daughter) vs using hard evidence (two surveys) provided by Boers' to the RIVCO Transportation Department. Despite the fact that this RCTC public servant and her family could possibly gain a FREE GIFT of PUBLIC LAND base just on her word.
- During Hillmer's sworn deposition he admitted to taking the word of the RCTC public servant at her word.
 I cannot answer the question or even speculate why Hillmer would take the word of this RCTC employee vs using the hard evidence presented to him. Again a copy of the deposition was presented to RIVCO BoS Washington's staff and RIVCO Counsel was present during that meeting prior to the hearing of Caravel Lane. Is this what RIVCO considers being fair and impartial by taking the word of a RCTC employee over the real facts presented to them?

- Some in RIVCO Transportation failed in their due diligence and duties in the vacation of Caravel Lane by taking the word of a RCTC public servant vs the hard evidence presented to them, or even verifying the real facts that had been presented to them prior to the public hearings of Caravel Lane. A RCTC public servant and her family that would ultimately benefit in receiving a FREE GIFT of PUBLIC LAND.
- An example would be the fire hydrant at the corner of Caravel Lane and Valenica Way. During the RIVCO BoS public hearing for the vacation of Caravel Lane, the Director of Transportation Mark Lancaster was asked if there was fire hydrant along the area to be vacated, Lancaster answered, "no." Again this information was provided to <u>RIVCO transportation prior to both RIVCO Planning Commision and RIVCO BoS of the vacation of Caravel Lane.</u> Did Lancaster and his staff verify facts before appearing before these boards or did they just ignore them? Is this the type of leadership that RIVCO considers to be setting the examples or commitment to excellence for fellow RIVCO employees and RIVCO public servants?
- The fully functionally and working fire hydrant at the corner of Caravel Lane and Valencia was easily verifiable by the Rancho Water Authority, which again that information
 was provided to RIVCO Transportation prior to RIVCO Planning Commision and RVCO BoS. The information on the fully functional fire hydrant (along with other information of the
 mishandling of the vacation of Caravel Lane) was also presented to RIVCO BoS Washington's Staff (and RIVCO Cousel was present during that meeting) prior to the BoS public hearing
 on the vacation of Caravel Lane.
- Lancaster during the RIVCO BoS public hearing for the vacation of Caravel Lane read aloud a part of the RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst (as Lancaster identified the author of the letter as the applicant's daughter). A copy of that letter was provided in the packet for the vacation of Caravel Lane, whereas many letters from the opposition where not included. In that letter from the RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst there was several false, misleading and not factual accurate information in it. For example in the letter the RCTC employee claimed that the Boers' want access to a dry fire hydrant at the corner of Caravel Lane and Valencia Way to develop on their property. Then also stated that there is a working fire hydrant in front of the property. Again this information is easily verifiable by Rancho CA Water Authority that there is a working fire hydrant at that corner of Caravel Lane and Valencia Way and this information was provided to the RIVCO department of transportation on several occasions prior to the public hearings for Caravel Lane.
- I ask the RIVCO BoS was Lancaster being fully transparent during his presentation to the BoS during the public hearing for the vacation of Caravel Lane? Did Lancaster as a leader (RIVCO Director of Transportation) set the standards for the Department of Transportation and his employees? Was Lancaster fully committed to excellence by demonstrating his willingness to be fair and impartial by verifying all the facts being presented to him?
- Again I'm here to just present some more hard facts to the RIVCO BoS about the mishandling of the vacation of Caravel Lane and possibly some RIVCO Ethical Standards violations committed by some RIVCO employees and some RIVCO public servants. I will continue to come before the RIVCO BoS presenting more information and hard facts, because I feel strongly that the public has a right to know how some within RIVCO Sr. Employees and Sr. Public Servants are possibly conducting themselves in a questionable manner behind closed doors and even in public forums.
- The RIVCO BoS has the opportunity to rescind or amend the vacation of Caravel Lane. The vacation of Caravel Lane has created a dangerous situation in that Cibola Circle a 650' long, less than 24' wide, dead-end road with no turnout, no turnabout or fire hydrant. Making it hard for people to turnabout on Cibola Circle. videos have been presented to the RIVCO BoS during prior BoS public hearings which demonstrate this point.
- The RIVCO BoS should as a minimum amend their decision in the vacation of Caravel Lane by requiring that some the public land that was vacated Caravel Lane be used for a Full Public Turnabout on Cibola Circle vs a private turnabout that the public has no access to.
