BACKGROUND:

Summary

The California Climate Investments and the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) Forest Health and Fire Prevention Programs have been funded in the past with Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds appropriated by the California Legislature to agencies that administer California Climate Investments (CCI). The appropriation for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 grant application is up to \$120,000,000 total allocation for all grant projects, there is no cost limit per project.

These programs improve resiliency of forested and forest-adjacent communities and upper watershed forests while achieving climate goals. The grant funding will be available for local projects and activities that address the risk of wildfire, reduce wildfire potential and increase community resiliency. Funded activities include hazardous fuel reduction, fire prevention planning and fire prevention education with an emphasis on improving public health and safety while reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Qualifying projects and activities will help California cope with its extensive tree mortality crisis and provide benefits to habitable structures in the State Responsibility Area (SRA). Projects will be designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions during project activities and over time through wildfire reduction.

The Department plans to apply for hazardous fuel reduction projects which include continuing fuel breaks in the Elsinore Front Country to allow for additional landowner participation and more fuels to be removed as well as a new project application which will address the need for a shaded fuel break along the Ernie Maxwell Trail in the Idyllwild community. The project components will include community outreach and participation agreements, survey and mapping of tree health and mortality, treatment of trees and forest fuels and other related forest restoration projects and fuel modification activities.

If the Fire Department is awarded funding, the Department will seek acceptance of the award from the Board of Supervisors. All project and activity work related to awarded grants must be completed by March 15, 2026.

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Impact on Residents and Businesses

These funds are dedicated to protecting the health and safety of the public and firefighting personnel against fire and fire related hazards in the unincorporated area.

Additional Fiscal Information

The Fire Prevention Grant Program does not require cost share match; however, priority is given to projects that contain matching funds and leverage other financial resources. The department will provide cost share through our approved budgeted departmental functions.


Contract History and Price Reasonableness

On December 14, 2021 via MO#3.23 the Board of Supervisors authorized the acceptance of grant #5GG20165 in the amount of \$1,566,548 in Fire Prevention Grant Program funding for the Juvenile Fire Intervention Program which is ongoing until March 15, 2024.

On November 6, 2018 via MO#3.20 the Board of Supervisors authorized the acceptance of grant #5GG17197 in the amount of \$1,898,303 in Fire Prevention Grant Program funding for the Elsinore Front Country Fuel Break project which is ongoing until March 15, 2022.

On November 6, 2018 via MO#3.21 the Board of Supervisors authorized the acceptance of grant #5GG17196 in the amount of \$853,482 in Fire Prevention Grant Program funding for the Riverside County Dead, Dying Diseased Tree Removal project which is ongoing until March 15, 2022.

On May 7, 2019 via MO#3.18 the Board of Supervisors authorized the acceptance of grant #8GG18659 in the amount of \$766,500 in Fire Prevention Grant Program funding for the Riverside County Forest Health Program which is ongoing until March 30, 2023.
