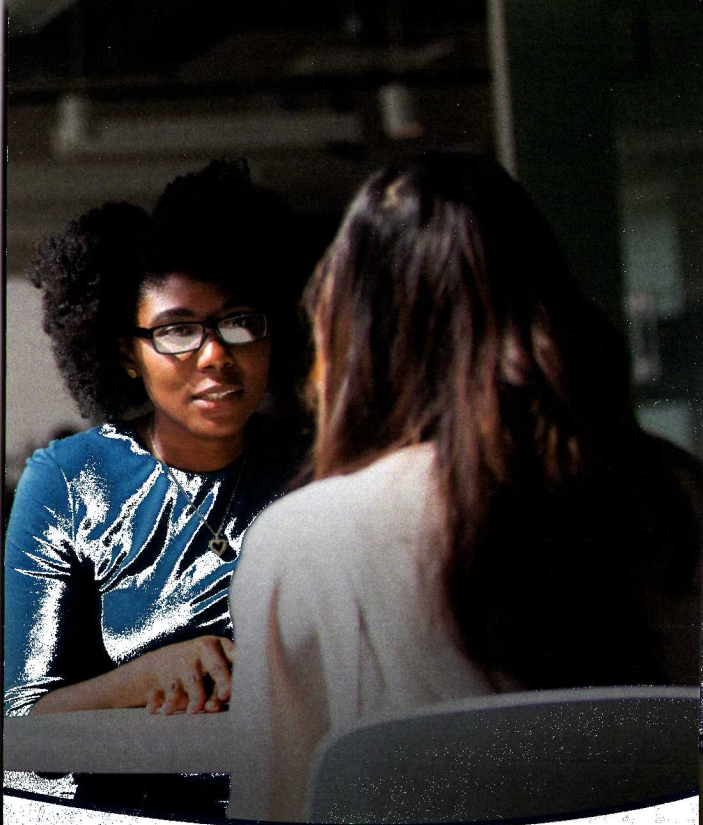

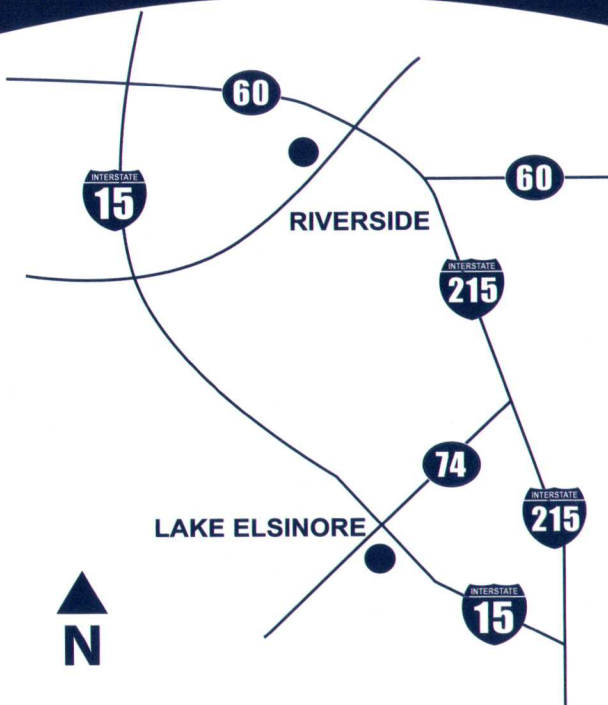

- **Mark Lancaster emails dated July 3, 2018** (a copy of those emails were provided to the RIVCO BoS on February 8th, 2022) tried to prevent me from fencing off part of my property, but Lancaster **did not addressing the real issue that a Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) employee and her family had blocked two county public dedicated roads, as well as access to part of my property.**
- **This RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst was a co-worker with Lancaster at RCTC.** Is this why Lancaster didn't investigate and the real facts? Or was Lancaster just taking the word of his fellow co-worker?
- RIVCO Transportation had been provided an encroachment report conducted by a certified CA state licensed surveyor showing that this RCTC employee and her family had blocked two county dedicated roads and part of our property.
- Did Lancaster just choose to look the other way and ignore the real facts and just didn't want to address the real issue, because he was trying to help out fellow co-worker? Is there a different standard for the public vs RIVCO public employees and RIVCO public servants?
- **Lancaster choose to read the RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst's letter to BoS during the vacation hearing of Caravel Lane as to why the lawsuit was filed.** Despite the fact that the Boers (the plaintiffs) and their lawyer was present during the BoS hearing.
- The RCTC employee was not the property owner, nor was she the applicant.
- Why did Lancaster choose to read the RCTC employee's letter?

Mark Boers
3/8/22 *Public Comment*

- **The Boers' attorney sent a letter June 4, 2020 to RCTC Legal Affairs (a copy of the letter has been provided to RIVCO BoS today) about the RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst employee and some of our concerns.**
- **We had our attorney send the letter because we had concerns how this RCTC employee was boasting that "Mark" or "Paul" would "handle it" (The road situation) and that "they got it under control." This RCTC employee also had mentioned that she would be working it (the vacation of Caravel Lane) with them (Mark and Pual).**
- **When our lawyer had sent the letter dated June 4, 2020 we didn't know who "Mark" or "Paul" was and we did not have any real knowledge of the vacation either at that time. During my sworn deposition I was asked why we had our attorney send the letter. I explained during my sworn deposition the reason why we had it sent, it appeared that this RCTC employee was using her position to directly assist in the vacation of Caravel Lane.**
- **At the time of my sworn deposition I did not know who Mark or Paul was. Now we know who "Mark" (Mark Lancaster, the RIVCO Director of Transportation) and "Paul" (Paul Hillmer, a RIVCO Transportation Sr. Land Surveyor) are.**
- **So is it okay for RIVCO employees and RIVCO public servants to work the system together to help out a fellow RIVCO employee or RIVCO public servant to circumvent the legal system and the courts? Did they do that because they thought no one is watching or that they can get away with it?**

- Mark (Lancaster), Pual (Hillmer) and this RCTC employee worked together on the vacation of Caravel Lane which resulted in this RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst employee and her family getting a Free Gift of Public Land.
- This RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst used her official RCTC email to assist directly in processing the vacation packet for Caravel Lane, which is not part of her official duties as a RIVCO public servant.
- During Paul Hillmer's sworn deposition on November 10, 2020, Hillmer was asked if he knew this RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst. Hillmer said, No.
- Hillmer changed his answer once he was shown email correspondence that he had with this RCTC Sr. Financial Analyst employee as they worked together on the vacation of Caravel Lane.
- When Pual Hillmer was asked if they would be verifying the on-the-ground situation before this goes up before the RIVCO Planning Commission. Hillmer answered, "by the time of the planning commission, we will not have made a site visit."
- Based on emails and sworn depositions it appears that RIVCO employees and RIVCO public servants took the word of this RCTC employee and did not verify the facts. Why?

- **I have provided other documents to RIVCO BoS today that questions the integrity, honesty and conflict of interest to support my claims I have made today.**
- **Are we seeing a pattern of conduct here from some folks within RCTC and RIVCO Transportation Department?**
- **I want to also note that a lot of folks from CSA149 and other RIVCO agencies that we worked with were very professional and saw what was happening, but told us they could not get involved because they didn't want to put their job in jeopardy.**
- **Why would RIVCO employees or RIVCO public servants be scared to speak up or do the right thing?**
- **I feel strongly that this was just more than a conflict of interest and that it would also fall into the categories of cronyism, conspiracy and collusions as well.**
- **Are RIVCO Code of County Ethics and Conduct just words? Do they really mean anything when RIVCO employees and RIVCO public servants aren't being held fully accountable for their action?**
- **How can the public trust RIVCO Sr. leadership when they don't uphold the standards even after they have been presented hard evidence?**
- **Vacating Caravel Lane has rendered Cibola Circle into a dead-end road with no turnabout. Part of the public land that was vacated could have been used for a public turnabout on Cibola Circle. Why wasn't this done?**

1. One of Megan Kavand's emails that was shown to Paul Hillmer during his sworn deposition.
2. However, in Hillmer's sworn deposition he didn't know her, but yet Kavand was clearing obstacles directly with the Deputy Fire Marshall for the vacation of Caravel Lane, while using her official RCTC email.
3. In the email date May 19, 2020 Kavand is actively working the vacation of Caravel Lane with Hillmer.
4. Kavand wasn't the property owner nor was she the applicant.
5. This is not part of Kavand's official duties with RCTC, and even if it was part of her job, it would still be a direct conflict of interest and against RIVCO Code of Ethics.
6. Our attorney had sent a letter dated June 4, 2020 to RCTC Legal Affairs about Kavand. We had numerous concerns because Kavand had been boasting about how "Mark" and "Paul" would handle it and that they got in under control. She also said that she would be working it with them (Mark and Pual).
7. When our attorney sent this letter (June 4, 2020), we did not have any knowledge of this May 19, 2020 email and the other emails that were uncovered during discovery and through the freedom information act.
8. Kavand did not give factual information to the Deputy Fire Marshall in her email date May 19, 2020. Kavand had stated that the road had been widen to 30', but that is not true. The road today still averages less than 24' wide and in some areas is only 14' wide. It is a 650' long road that has no public turnabout, but instead fire waved the turnabout for a private turnabout using some of the land being vacated. The public can't turn around easily and my fence has been hit several times because of this and causing damages.
9. The information was not verified with the hard facts that were presented to the RIVCO Transportation Department by the Boers and their attorney, why? Did they just take Kavand at her word?

Hi Paul,

I just spoke with Steve from Fire and he was unaware that the CSA had recently improved Cibola Circle. The road was realigned to the west, widen to 30', smoothed and had DG placed. Additionally the gate obstructing Cibola Circle was removed approximately a year and a half ago in anticipation of the CSA improvement. This satisfies bullets 2 – 4. In order to satisfy the first bullet, I have emailed Stella to start the process of changing the address from Caravel to Cibola. Our intent was to do this once we got a bit further along with the vacate but I will start on this now. If/when the vacation is approved, the address will be updated.

I've cc'd Steve on this email from his concurrence.

Greetings:

I represent Susan and Chuck Boers, owners of the property located at 36321 Alta Mesa Court in Temecula. They live adjacent to Meghan Kavand, whose address is 36210 Caravel Lane. Ms. Kavand works for you, as an Accounting Technician in RCTC's Hemet office.

My clients are in the middle of a contentious lawsuit alleging that Ms. Kavand and others are intentionally blocking access to two public rights of way that abut the Boers property and the Kavand property (title to the Kavand property is in the name of Mike Noel, Ms. Kavand's father). The public rights of way are noted as Lots F and G on Parcel Map 20903 (a copy of that map is attached).

Recognizing that in a lawsuit people sometimes say things in the heat of the moment, I wanted to alert you to the fact that Ms. Kavand has informed my clients that she works for your agency, and that she can make sure Lots F and G are removed from the County public roads system, because she "knows people" and can pull strings needed to make the lawsuit go away.

It is not appropriate for County employees to claim that they can gain an advantage over members of the public due to some form of cronyism. I suspect Ms. Kavand was merely exaggerating her "pull" with County decision-makers, but I wanted to let you know that we expect the County to be fair with the Boers as the lawsuit moves forward. To date, we have been impressed with County employees, and have no issues with their honesty or cooperation. We want that to continue.

1. We (Susan and Chuck Boers) had filed a Harassment Restraining Order against the Noels and Kavands. Case number HEC1900369.
2. In Megan Kavand's form CH-120 (Response to Request for Civil Harassment Restraining Orders) she made a sworn statement that on August 24, 2018 that she was not at home the time the surveyors entered my parent's property opening our gates unannounced and uninvited. This was not a true statement made by Kavand.
3. However, Megan Kavand was home at the time the surveyors and it had been established previously with the first survey that it was not the Noel's or Kavand's land. The Noels and Kavands had tried to claim more than ¼ acre of our (Boers') property and were blocking two County Dedicated Public Roads. See attached Daily Dispatch Register of Action Incident Number: SW-182360011 and Supplemental Declaration of Leonard Flower date January 6, 2021.
4. Megan Kavand and her family had been informed that we would be fencing off a portion of our property by our attorney. See attached letter dated June, 29, 2018. The Noels and Kavands just choose to ignore the letter and our legal right to prevent further trespassing onto our property or adding more encroachments by them.
5. Remember Lancaster's emails dated July 3, 2018 that has been previously presented to the RIVCO BoS on February 8, 2022. Both the Noels and Kavands knew that we (Boers) where going to fence off a portion of our property. We (Boers) also didn't need to be invited or gain permission from the Noels or Kavands to gain access to our private property or a County Dedicate Public Road.
6. There were other statements made by Megan Kavand in her sworn statement that was not factually accurate and we have evidence to support that claim. However, this is the best example of why I question Kavand's integrity.
7. I question the wisdom of those that took Kavand at her word, while Kavand assisted directly in the processing of the vacation of Caravel Lane packet, despite the hard evidence that was presented to RIVCO transportation. Kavand is not the property owner, nor was she the applicant for the vacation of Caravel Lane. This was also outside of Kavand's duties as a Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) Senior Financial Analyst and was a direct conflict of interest, as well as other RIVCO Code of Ethics Standards.

Re: Encroachments on Land Of Susan and Chuck Boer

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Noel:

This office represents Susan and Charles Boer, owners of the property at 36321 Alta Mesa Court, your neighbors.

The Boers have decided to fence their property to their property line. The Boers will do so after August 1st, and because you have sometimes used the driveway that is on the Boers' property line, the Boers are giving you notice that no use of the Boers' portion of that driveway will be permitted after August 1, 2018. After extensive research and a formal survey of the Boer property, it has been determined that you have no rights to use the portion of the driveway on the Boer property. There is no easement on the Boer property that benefits your property, and no public right of way. The Boers will be installing gates and fences to surround this driveway and to insure their property is fully fenced to their property line.


To that end, you will need to stop using the Boers' driveway immediately. In order to accommodate your need to re-open your access to the south (or make arrangements with Mr. Kelly to open up your recorded easement to the north), the Boers will not install their fencing until August 1st, which should give you sufficient time to take care of your access issues.

The survey also determined that you recently placed a gate and fence on the Boer property. That fence and gate must be removed by August 1st, so that the Boers can begin fencing their property.

I attach a few photos and a Encroachment Exhibit prepared by the surveyor, so that you know where the fence line will be.

Said purpose for address must pertain to issues which are under the direct jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors. **YOUR TIME WILL BE LIMITED TO THREE (3) MINUTES.** Donated time is not permitted during Public Comment.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board’s Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, insuring that the Clerk’s Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead “Elmo” projector at the Board meeting, please ensure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo.

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. Please step up to the podium when the Chairman calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the “green” podium light will light. The “yellow” light will come on when you have one (1) minute remaining. When you have 30 seconds remaining, the “yellow” light will begin to flash, indicating you must quickly wrap up your comments. Your time is up when the “red” light flashes. The Chairman adheres to a strict three (3) minutes per speaker. ***Note: If you intend to give your time to a “Group/Organized Presentation”, please state so clearly at the very bottom of the reverse side of this form.***

Group/Organized Presentations:

Group/organized presentations with more than one (1) speaker will be limited to nine (9) minutes at the Chairman’s discretion. The organizer of the presentation will automatically receive the first three (3) minutes, with the remaining six (6) minutes relinquished by other speakers, as requested by them on a completed “Request to Speak” form, and clearly indicated at the bottom of the form.

Addressing the Board & Acknowledgement by Chairman:

The Chairman will determine what order the speakers will address the Board, and will call on all speakers in pairs. The first speaker should immediately step to the podium and begin addressing the Board. The second speaker should take up a position in one of the chamber aisles in order to quickly step up to the podium after the preceding speaker. This is to afford an efficient and timely Board meeting, giving all attendees the opportunity to make their case. Speakers are prohibited from making personal attacks, and/or using coarse, crude, profane or vulgar language while speaking to the Board members, staff, the general public and/or meeting participants. Such behavior, at the discretion of the Board Chairman, may result in removal from the Board Chambers by Sheriff Deputies.
