

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The mission of the Autism Society Inland Empire is to improve the lives of all affected by autism. The Hands on Art Program will take place in partnership with Old Town Artisan Studio in La Quinta. The program will run four times a month for clients ages 6-12 and ages 13+. The program will stimulate inclusion, self-expression, and confidence in individuals with autism. CID funds will support the Hands on Art Program.
2. The Coachella Valley History Museum is working to develop a 15,000 sq ft lot into an outdoor garden and railway exhibit, dedicated to preserve the railway history and water conservation. The project is currently under phase one which is the acquisition of the car and construction plans. CID funds will support the outdoor garden project.
3. PDLQ Youth Football focuses on helping our youth build character, sportsmanship, self-confidence, and learn responsibility & teamwork in a competitive environment while gaining a strong sense of community. CID funds will be used to provide scholarship to young athletes, which will help them purchase helmets, shoulder pads, and assist with continued expenses for safety supplies for athletes and volunteers.
4. The Rotary Club of Indio hosts the annual Rotary Math Field Day, which is an annual math competition for middle school children that has been in existence since 1994. The event has been attended by all three local school districts and private schools. CID funds will be used to purchase trophies and ribbons for the students and schools.
5. The Riverside Arts Museum is one of the oldest and most prominent art institutions of the inland southern California region, engaging approximately 50,000 residents and visitors annually. The museum provides Walk & Wonder Museum tour field trips. This program includes docent-led tours of the new Cheech Marin Center for Chicano Art and Culture and the historic Riverside Art Museum followed by hands-on art projects related to artworks in the museum's collection and/or on exhibit. CID funds will be used to pay for transportation to transport students from the 4th district.
6. The World Affairs Council of the Desert (WACD) annually hosts the Academic WorldQuest Competition where teams of Coachella Valley high school students compete academically and the winning team travels to Washington, DC, to compete in the World Affairs Councils of America National Competition. CID funds will be used to assist with cash awards, and travel expenses for the national competition.
7. The Boys and Girls Club of Coachella Valley offer the Palabra and Passport2Manhood programs through the Mecca location. The Palabra program deepens that journey,

focusing on young men who do not have a positive male role model in their lives or have had legal/academic troubles. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young men in discussions and activities that reinforce character, leadership and positive behavior. Funding will support program expenses for one program director.

8. Coachella Valley Community Trust Collaborative, at-risk youth assistance program provides supplies & equipment for youth to participate in education, cultural sports, counseling, tutoring, food, clothing. The youth are referred to them from CVUSD and DSUSD, non-profits, other organizations. Funds will be used to assist at-risk youth in the eastern Coachella Valley.
9. Desert Best Friend's Closet educates and empowers clients for success in employment and life. Their Work Readiness for Youth Offenders program focuses on lowering barriers to employment. CID funds will be used for three 2-week workshops with 8 students each.
10. Read with me Volunteers mission is to assist local children from a low income, limited English speaking environment develop their fullest potential by helping them learn to read, comprehend, and speak English, while understanding that people care about them as individuals. CID funds will be used for recruitment, registration, and training volunteers.
11. Voices for Children (VFC) transforms the lives of abused, abandoned, or neglected children by providing them with trained, volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs). CID funds will be used to support advocacy supervisors who carry a caseload of 35-45 CASA volunteers.
12. The American Outreach Foundation offers the Donate Your Powerchair program, which provides veterans and seniors with mobility devices; electric wheelchair or scooters. The funds will be used to partially cover the costs of pickup/delivery powerchairs, refurbishing materials, batteries, and other miscellaneous program costs like maintenance calls and repairs. The program will benefit 30-60 recipients in ECV.
13. Coachella Valley Rescue Mission outreach team works with the homeless community daily to build trust and provide them with basic needs. The funds will be used to assist with helping veterans that are homeless to move into permanent housing.
14. HARC, Inc. conducts the Coachella Valley Community Health Survey every three years, which provides objective, reliable research and analysis and technical services for communities to facilitate better decision making for health and quality of life. Funds will be used to keep veteran-related questions on the survey.
15. SNIP provides low-cost mobile spay/neuter and vaccinations clinics to end animal overpopulation and lessen burden on local shelters. CID funds will held funding one clinic in the 4th District.
