Piscatella Jr. who peacefully passed away surrounded by loved ones, on February 17, 2022, at the age of 86.

Frank was born December 15, 1935. He lived much of his young life in Bloomfield, Connecticut. He graduated from Bloomfield High School. While in grade school Frank found his love for music. A proficient tenor saxophone player. Frank enlisted in the U.S. Army and was a member of the U.S. Army Band. After he completed his duty in 1956, Frank moved to Riverside to be with his family, who had relocated from Connecticut.

Frank met his wife Eva Anderson in 1957, and not too long after they married. Frank and his father Frank Sr. were owner operators of the King Size Sleep Shop in the Brockton Arcade for over 25 years, and during those years he and Eva had six children. Frank was a faithful parishioner of St. Catherine of Alexandria Church for over 50 years, and he was fondly known as "Mr. P" by many friends and acquaintances.

Frank's family was always his priority, his love for music was his calling. In the early 60's and 70's you could find him performing with his bandmates at Riverside's local nightclubs and supper clubs. He was also a band member of the Generation Gap. In 1971 he was featured as an original music writer, arranger, and tenor sax player on the jazz album Conte Candoli meets the Generation Gap. In the 80's and 90's he performed continually with the Bill Hathaway band at Mario's Place, in Riverside. He loved working with the Palagi Family. Over the years he had fewer and fewer "gigs" however he remained very close to many of his fellow bandmates.

Olaf Norden was born July 7, 1930. He was the third of six children born to Rev. Trygve F. Dahle and Agnes Dahle. Ole graduated from Oak Grove Lutheran High School in Fargo, North Dakota, and attended Augsburg College in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Olaf served in the United States Navy as a U.S. Navy Airman for four years, spending most of the time in Glynco Naval Station, in Brunswick, Georgia. After the Navy, he moved to California. Most of Olaf's working career was at Inland Moving & Storage. He worked there for 45 years and retired in 2000.

Olaf's first wife of thirty years, Susan Charbonneau Dahle, preceded him in death in 1998 from ALS. Together they had two daughters. Olaf married Beverly Barnes on January 31, 2004. They met at Magnolia Church where they were both members. Olaf was in the choir and sang many solos.
