SUBJECT: HOUSING AND WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS (HWS): Approve the Substantial Amendments to the 2019-2020 and 2021-2022 One Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plans to Include the Mead Valley Community Center Improvement Project (CDBG), and Opportunity Village Temporary Emergency Shelter (ESG-CV); Districts 1 & 5. [\$205,000 - 15% Community Development Block Grant; 85% Emergency Solutions Grant-CV]; CEQA and NEPA Exempt.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Find that the Substantial Amendments to the 2019-2020 and 2021-2022 One Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3);
2. Find that Substantial Amendments to the 2019-2020 and 2021-2022 One-Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan are exempt from the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) pursuant to Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations Section 58.34(a)(1) and (a)(3);
3. Approve the Substantial Amendment to the 2019-2020 One-Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan to add the new Emergency Solutions Grant - CV activity of the Opportunity Village Temporary Emergency Shelter (ESG-CV) more fully described in Attachment A, attached hereto; and
4. Approve the Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 One-Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan to add the new Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) activity of the Mead Valley Community Center Improvement more fully described in Attachment B, attached hereto; and
5. Direct staff to file the Notices of Exemption with the County Clerk within five business days of approval.



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that all substantial amendments to the County's Five-Year Consolidated Plan and the One-Year Action Plans are subject to the Citizen Participation Plan and are approved by the Board of Supervisors and HUD. In accordance with the County of Riverside's Amended Citizen Participation Plan for the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan (Citizen Participation Plan), all new activities added to a One-Year Action Plan, any significant increases in funding or changes to an existing project, or other changes or amendments to the 2019-2024 Five-Year Consolidated Plan are considered to be substantial amendments.

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed into law (Pub.L.116-136). Through the CARES Act, the County's Emergency Solutions Grant-CV (ESG-CV) funds are to be used for eligible activities that prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance, and to support additional assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts created by the coronavirus under the Emergency Solutions Grant Program.

The proposed Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant - CV (ESG-CV) projects warranting these substantial amendments have been determined by staff to be eligible activities that meet a National Objective of the Programs. A description of the proposed amendment to the 2019-2020 and 2021-2022 One-Year Action Plans are set forth in Attachments A and B.

Staff recommends approval of the new CDBG and ESG-CV projects listed below as substantial amendments to the 2021-2022 and 2019-2020 One-Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan:

Mead Valley Community Center Improvement Project \$30,000 Add New CDBG Activity

Opportunity Village Temporary Emergency Shelter \$175,000 Add New ESG-CV Activity

As noted above, any significant changes to an existing Emergency Solutions Grant-CV (ESG-CV) funded project is considered to be a substantial amendment. The City of Banning, a Cooperating City, received \$175,000 in 2019-2020 ESG-CV funds for Ramsey Street Village Temporary Emergency Shelter. The original description of the 2019-2020 project, The Ramsey Street Village, provides a safe environment for shelter and assistance for the homeless to transition to self-sufficiency. ESG-CV funds to pay for operational expenses including a Site Coordinator (direct staff cost), security guard service, hygiene supplies, virus prevention supplies, and utilities. The proposed project description modification, project name change, and location has been determined by staff to be an eligible activity that meets a National Objective of the ESG-CV program. Staff recommends approval of the modified project description, name change, and location as set forth in Attachment A, as a substantial amendment to the 2019-2020 One Year Action Plan of the 2014-2019 Five Year Consolidated Plan (Substantial Amendment).

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Substantial Amendments were reviewed and determined to be categorically exempt from CEQA under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), General Rule or "Common Sense" exemption. The Substantial Amendments are administrative planning documents that will only have financial and administrative effects. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed Substantial Amendments may have a significant effect on the environment and will not lead to any direct or reasonably indirect physical impacts. The projects identified in the Substantial Amendments will be subject to separate CEQA environmental review prior to taking any choice limiting action or discretionary action on that specific project. Notices of Exemption for each project will be filed by County staff with the County Clerk within five days of the approval of the Substantial Amendments.

Furthermore, the Substantial Amendments were determined to be exempt from the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) pursuant to Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations Sections 58.34 (a)(1) and (a)(3) since the proposed Substantial Amendments are administrative activities. The projects identified in the Substantial Amendments will be subject to separate NEPA environmental review prior to taking any choice limiting action or discretionary action on that specific project.

Pursuant to 24 CFR Section 91.105 and the Citizen Participation Plan, the Housing and Workforce Solutions Department published the required public notice notifying the public of the comment period for the proposed substantial amendments on March 26, 2022. No public comments have been received.

Pursuant to the CARES Act and the Amended Citizen Participation Plan, HWS posted a public notice of the proposed Substantial Amendment and the five (5) day comment period. The public notice was published in a newspaper of general circulation. Any comments regarding the proposed Substantial Amendments received prior to the April 26, 2022, Board meeting, will be submitted to the Board.

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County Counsel has reviewed and approved as to form the Substantial Amendments to the 2021-2022 and 2019-2020 One-Year Action Plans of the 2019-2024 Five Year Consolidated Plan.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Mead Valley Community Center Improvement Project (CDBG): The Riverside County Facilities Management department will use CDBG funds to pay for costs associated with improvements and upgrades to the Mead Valley Community Center. Improvements include replacing the flooring for the Mead Valley Community Development Center. Eligible costs include materials, installation, and administration.

Opportunity Village Temporary Emergency Shelter (ESG-CV): The City of Banning provides temporary shelter to homeless individuals. The Opportunity Village provides a safe environment for shelter and assistance for the homeless to transition to self-sufficiency. ESG-CV funds to pay for operational expenses including a Site Coordinator (direct staff cost), security guard service, hygiene supplies, virus prevention supplies, and utilities.

Additional Fiscal Information

There will be no impact upon the County's General Fund.
