PROPOSE ORDINANCE

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS PROHIBITING THE
UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF CATALYTIC
CONVERTERS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, do ordain as follows:

:

SECTION 1. UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF A CATALYTIC CONVERTER.

- (A). It shall be unlawful for any person, other than a Core Recycler as defined in California Business and Professions Code Section 21610, to possess a catalytic converter that is not attached to a vehicle, unless the possessor has valid documentation or other proof to verify that they are in lawful possession of the catalytic converter.
- (B). This section does not apply to a detached catalytic converter that has been tested, certified, and labeled or otherwise approved for reuse, and being bought or sold for purposes of reuse in accordance with the Federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §§7401 ets eq,) and regulations under the Clean Air Act, as they may, from time to time, be amended.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY. The ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted by Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution.

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS.

- (A) For purposes of this section, "lawful possession" includes (1) being the lawful owner of the catalytic converter or (2) in possession of the catalytic converter with the lawful owner's written consent. It is not required to prove the catalytic converter was stolen to establish the possession is not a "lawful possession."
- (B) For purposes of this section, "documentation or other proof" means written document(s) that clearly identify the vehicle from which the

catalytic converter originated based on the totality of the circumstances, and includes, but is not limited to, the following types of documents:

1. The vehicle registration associated with the catalytic converter containing an etched associated license plate number or vehicle identification number.
2. The name, address, and telephone number of the owner of the vehicle from which the catalytic converter was removed.
3. The signature of the vehicle owner authorizing removal of the catalytic converter.
4. The name, address, and telephone number of the current owner of the catalytic converter.
5. Bill of sale from the original with photographs.
6. Documentation from an auto-body shop proving that the owner relinquished the catalytic converter to the auto-body shop.
7. Verifiable electronic communication from the previous owner to the possessor relinquishing ownership of the catalytic converter.
8. Photographs of the vehicle from which the catalytic converter originated.

(C) For purposes of this section, "Metal recycler" means any person who:

- (1) Engages in the business of purchasing aluminum cans or ferrous or nonferrous metals, such as stainless steel alloys, copper cables or steel plates;
- (2) Engages in the business of utilizing machinery or equipment for the processing or manufacturing of iron, steel or nonferrous metallic scrap and whose principal product is scrap metal for reuse; or
- (3) Operates or maintains a place in which used metal items or scrap metal is purchased, collected or kept for shipment, sale, or transfer to other facilities.

SECTION 3. Purchase of Catalytic Converters.

(A) It shall be unlawful for any metal recycler or his agents or employees acting on his behalf to purchase or receive catalytic converters from any person offering such property for sale unless, in addition to the requirements set forth in Section 3:

1. For automotive repair facilities:

a. The person selling the catalytic converter presents a verifiable receipt from the repair facility with:

(1) The name of the business;

(2) The address of the business;

(3) The phone number for the business that repaired the vehicle that the catalytic converter offered for sale came from; and

(4) The year, make, model, and vehicle identification number of the vehicle or vehicles repaired.

b. The metal recycler either verifies that the repair facility is an actual business and that the automotive repair facility or muffler repair facility is open to the general public for business, or the repair facility provides a copy of their applicable County of Riverside Business License.

c. A seller with a valid used automotive parts recycler license issued by The State of California Department Of Motor Vehicle (DMV) under the California Business and Professions Code Section 21610 may offer for sale catalytic converters to a metal recycler without a verifiable receipt from a repair facility. The metal recycler must obtain a copy of the valid license issued by DMV and upload it pursuant to Section 3(B)(2) of this Code.

2. For individual sellers: The person attempting to sell a catalytic converter provides to the metal recycler:

a. The year, make, model, and vehicle identification number for the vehicle from which the catalytic converter was removed;

b. A copy of the certificate of title or other documentation indicating that the person has an ownership interest in the vehicle from which the catalytic converter was removed; and

c. Any other information required by the California Business and Professions Code Section 21610.

(B) Once the metal recycler has purchased the catalytic converter, the metal recycler shall:

(1) Take a photograph of:

- a. All sides of the catalytic converter, and if round, both halves;
- b. the serial number and
- c. any owner applied number, such as an etched serial number, VIN, etc.

(2) The metal recycler must upload into the police department's selected law enforcement online investigation system the photographs and all information required pursuant to subsection (A) of this section.

SECTION 4 Records required to be kept by secondhand resellers.

(A) A secondhand reseller shall be required to keep records of any used property purchased or otherwise received as follows:

(1) The date of receipt of any item; and

(2) The individual transaction number assigned by the secondhand reseller.

(B) A secondhand reseller, his agents or employees shall provide a consecutively numbered receipt to the seller or transferor of the item. Such receipt shall be dated on the actual date of the transaction.

(C) A secondhand reseller shall be required to keep and upload records of any catalytic converter purchased or otherwise received as detailed in sections Section 3 (A) and (B) of this Code.

SECTION 4. VIOLATIONS.

- D. The remedies provided herein are not to be construed as exclusive remedies. The County is authorized to pursue any proceedings or remedies provided by law.
- E. It shall be unlawful for any individual or entity other than a metal recycler to possess a used catalytic converter that was cut from its original vehicle, rather than unbolted, unless the individual or entity provides the applicable information under Section 3(A). Comments: I support changes but please go after the real problem, unregistered rentals. It is completely unfair to penalize the compliant owner based on the non compliant disrupters. Perhaps we should table these changes for a year to see how the newly hired enforcement works. We have not even given this a try. Until the unregistered rentals are addressed it does not matter how much you limit occupancy - it still won't work and does nothing but penalize the innocent.
Please do not change the occupancy limits. The change is way too drastic to the tourism industry, at least for Wine Country. Covid has already caused irreparable damage with years of lost contact for family and friends. We are finally getting to the point where families are feeling more comfortable getting together, and now we want to impose further damaging restrictions on them. It's simply not fair to anyone but the unregistered rentals who will continue to try and get away with non compliance and make more money as the compliant rentals are forced to drop out.

Eg. Two families (total of 10) can no longer rent a four bedroom 4,000 sf home because the occupancy limits them to 9.

Eg. One family of 6 can no longer rent a two bedroom 1500 sf home because the occupancy limits them to 5. However, that same family can rent a 300 sf hotel room.

Let's not make changes that do not make logical sense.

Two final points.

First, signs in front of homes are an invitation to burglary. Just because one city has done it does not make it right for us. This is a dangerous idea that even puts our neighbors at risk when burglars are being invited into the community.

Second, the renters don't have any skin in the game. I assume none of the members of the Board are actually vacation rental owners. As an owner I'm here to tell you that there are a few travelers who could care less what our rules are, because they don't have any skin in the game, and threatening them with a fine when Airbnb has the Deposit money is completely useless. Airbnb will almost always side with the traveler and will not fine the guests. Therefore, I strongly suggest two things. Number one, the Board fines disruptive guests directly. Number two, the Board makes a short welcome video as a thank you for visiting our community but also let's them know how the County expects them to behave or they can be fined substantially. I am asking the Board to assist us in creating the proper expectations for our guests.

To whom it hopefully concerns,

I am a longtime resident of Idyllwild and am quite concerned about the STRs in Idyllwild and the changes/damage that comes with so many of them on the hill.

I live on a street that is not even a half mile long and we have at least 2 on our street and one just 2 houses away on the street that runs into ours. This is quite literally the first weekend in at least a month where the entire neighborhood has not has to listen to the chosen music of the renters up the way. The first time in a month that anyone could sit on their porch, in the house that they pay for and enjoy a morning cup of Coffee or even an evening glass of Wine in the quiet among friends.

As a full time resident you have loud parties and gatherings every now and again. When you rent a house that accommodates a good number of people and costs a good chunk of cash odds are you are doing so for a gathering and or celebration - we have had birthdays, Spring Breakers etc and all noisy cause they rented for a party/gathering.

When i first read the new proposal which raised the cost of the permits I thought this was a good idea. Now however I realize that it only will effect the people who are just renting their house out occasionally in order to get a bit of income to pay Property Taxes or possibly money for a future project or two. The owners like the house up the way that charge \$750 a night and can sleep 12 are simply not effected by the permit cost increase. Even at \$400/night this is simply not a deterrent but rather an incentive to rent out one more weekend to cover the increase.

I believe that the permit should be kept as it was but a QUARTELY fee should be levied that is commensurate with the income received by the STR owner. Conversely an approach that limits the STR rental days to a percentage of time per year would help as well. Oh and we should NOT be rezoned - we are a residential town. Can I simply decide to open a restaurant in my house or set up a mechanics shop in my driveway? Why then can someone basically open a hotel and one that doesn't have to be compliant with ADA rules?

We who have invested our time and money in this town should not be so negatively effected by these STRs. I also think the number of STRs should be less than the 10% proposed. As it is now you find no rentals available up here. A friend almost had to move to Hemet, pay a bunch of money and get rid of his dog simply because the owners of the house he rented are putting it on the market and their just aren't houses for rent. Another friend I know of new of 15 people at one time looking to even just rent room so as not to have to move off the hill or possibly become homeless. When you go into the stores up here you find that not may of the clerks live here - they drive up from Hemet which is a problem with congestion, effects their income and of course air pollution.

Lastly you know the water issues, fire dangers, trash increase and many of the other things that have been negatively effected by the expansion of STRs.

We need them limited and we need local enforcement. People who are near by, know the community and actually care about the health of our town.

BOARD RULES

Requests to Address Board on "Agenda" Items:

You may request to be heard on a published agenda item. Requests to be heard must be submitted to the Clerk of the Board before the scheduled meeting time.

Requests to Address Board on Items that are "NOT" on the Agenda/Public Comment:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these rules, a member of the public shall have the right to address the Board during the mid-morning "Oral Communications" segment of the published agenda. Said purpose for address must pertain to issues which are under the direct jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors. YOUR TIME WILL BE LIMITED TO THREE (3) MINUTES. Donated time is not permitted during Public Comment.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board's Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, insuring that the Clerk's Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead "Elmo" projector at the Board meeting, please ensure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo.

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. Please step up to the podium when the Chairman calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the "green" podium light will light. The "yellow" light will come on when you have one (1) minute remaining. When you have 30 seconds remaining, the "yellow" light will begin to flash, indicating you must quickly wrap up your comments. Your time is up when the "red" light flashes. The Chairman adheres to a strict three (3) minutes per speaker. *Note: If you intend to give your time to a "Group/Organized Presentation", please state so clearly at the very bottom of the reverse side of this form.*

Group/Organized Presentations:

Group/organized presentations with more than one (1) speaker will be limited to nine (9) minutes at the Chairman's discretion. The organizer of the presentation will automatically receive the first three (3) minutes, with the remaining six (6) minutes relinquished by other speakers, as requested by them on a completed "Request to Speak" form, and clearly indicated at the bottom of the form.

Addressing the Board & Acknowledgement by Chairman:

The Chairman will determine what order the speakers will address the Board, and will call on all speakers in pairs. The first speaker should immediately step to the podium and begin addressing the Board. The second speaker should take up a position in one of the chamber aisles in order to quickly step up to the podium after the preceding speaker. This is to afford an efficient and timely Board meeting, giving all attendees the opportunity to make their case. Speakers are prohibited from making personal attacks, and/or using coarse, crude, profane or vulgar language while speaking to the Board members, staff, the general public and/or meeting participants. Such behavior, at the discretion of the Board Chairman, may result in removal from the Board Chambers by Sheriff Deputies.
