BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County Department of Facilities Management (FM) conducted a property inventory of assets at the Twin Pines Ranch, located at 49500 Twin Pines Road in Banning California, now operated by Cowboys for a Cause, a California nonprofit corporation (Operator). The Operator had reported that one of the aged barn structures on the property that was built in 1950's was blown down during a windstorm event (FMARC Asset ID 00003149 with has an asset value of \$156,680). FM confirmed that the unused and aged structure had in fact collapsed and was required for future operation of the facility.

FM reached out to Risk Management who subsequently filed a claim for the destroyed structure. FM is requesting the Board approve the discharge from accountability for the demolished structure pursuant to Government Code Section 24051.

Additional Fiscal Information

There are no County costs associated with this Board action. Any recovery of funds from the loss will be used for clean-up and removal of debris at the Twin Pines Ranch.
