BACKGROUND:

Summary

On February 10, 2022, a flooding emergency occurred at the lower level of the Riverside Centre parking structure, causing an immediate response from the Facilities Management Maintenance Division, along with county awarded vendors. The flooding of the parking structure caused the building to be immediately evacuated.

Facilities Maintenance (FM) issued an emergency declaration pursuant to the authority delegated in Resolution 2003-23 by the Board of Supervisors (Board) to take immediate action so a remediation company could be procured to provide emergency water damage restoration, plumbing and electrical repairs, and clean-up of the parking structure without competitive bidding. Failure to immediately address this health safety and welfare event due to building plumbing failure would pose imminent risk and loss of county services due to electrical and environmental hazards. The response team worked around the clock to get the emergency under control and tenants returned to the building.

Facilities Management recommends the Board approve in-principle the Riverside Centre Parking Structure Emergency Remediation Project and the emergency procurement contracts with Inland Tri Tech and CICO in the cumulative amount of \$384,456; enabling FM to complete the project documentation and ensure that the parking areas within the Riverside Centre parking structure remain operational and safe from health and safety hazards.

With certainty, there is no possibility that Project may have a significant effect on the environment. The project is limited to an emergency response to provide maintenance and repairs associated with a building plumbing leak at the lower levels of the existing parking structure.

Summary (Continued)

The emergency repairs to an existing public facility are required to maintain services essential to public health and the associated actions necessary to mitigate an emergency. Therefore, the Riverside Centre Parking Structure Emergency Remediation Project is exempt as the project meets the scope and intent of the Common Sense Exemption identified in Section 15061 (b)(3) Statutory Emergency Projects Exemption identified in 15269 (b)(c), and Class 1 Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by FM staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Riverside Centre Parking Structure Emergency Remediation Project will ensure that the parking areas within the Riverside Centre parking structure are maintained and hazard free, thus providing a safe environment for both visitors and businesses that occupy this office facility.



The flooding caused the building to be immediately evacuated. FM issued an emergency declaration pursuant to the authority delegated in Resolution 2003-23 by the County Board of Supervisors (Board) to take immediate action so a remediation company could be procured to provide emergency water damage, plumbing and electrical repairs and clean-up of the parking structure without competitive bidding. Failure to immediately address this health safety and welfare event due to building plumbing failure would pose imminent risk and loss of county services due to electrical and environmental hazards. The response team has been working around the clock to get the emergency under control and tenants have returned to the building as the remediation and repair work continues. The remediation to the plumbing and electrical equipment and associated damaged infrastructure is identified as the proposed project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The operation of the facility will continue to provide public services and will not result in a change or expansion of existing use. No additional direct or indirect physical environmental impacts are anticipated.

Name of Public Agency Approving Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Name of Person or Agency Carrying Out Project: Riverside County Facilities Management

Exempt Status: State California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15269 Emergency Projects Statutory Exemption; Section 15301 Existing Facilities Categorical Exemption; Section 15061(b) (3), General Rule or "Common Sense" Exemption, Codified under Title 14, Articles 5, 18 and 19, Sections 15061, 15269 and 15301.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The proposed project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of the categorical exemption as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The project will not cause an impact to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern nor would the project include unusual circumstances which could have the possibility of having a significant effect on the environment. The project would not result in impacts to scenic highways, hazardous waste sites, historic resources, or other sensitive natural environments, or have a cumulative effect to the environment. No significant environmental impacts are anticipated to occur with the emergency repairs and clean-up of the affected equipment at the Riverside Centre.

- Section 15269 (b)(c) -Emergency Projects: This statutory exemption consists of emergency projects that are exempt under CEQA. Under (b), emergency repairs to publicly or privately owned service facilities necessary to maintain service essential to the public health, safety or welfare are exempt. Under (c), specific actions necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency are exempt. The remediation of water and electrical damage at the Riverside Centre satisfies both of these conditions, as the Riverside Centre is an essential public facility that provides public services to those in need. The water leak at the Riverside Center resulted in flooding causing damage to the electrical system and lobby that could have potentially resulted in the loss of the facility to provide these public services to the public. Emergency remediation is required to avoid a threat to the public health, safety and welfare. Therefore, the project is exempt as it meets the scope and intent of the Statutory Exemption identified in Section 15269, Article 18, Statutory Exemptions of the CEQA Guidelines.
- Section 15301 (b)—Existing Facilities: This Class 1 categorical exemption includes the operation, repair, maintenance, leasing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities, provided the exemption only involves negligible or no expansion of the previous site's use. The project, as proposed, is limited to the remediation to the plumbing and electrical systems and damaged areas to prevent operational failure. The use of the facilities would continue to provide public services and would not result in a significant increase in capacity or intensity of use. Therefore, the project is exempt as it meets the scope and intent of the Categorical Exemption identified in Section 15301, Article 19, Categorical Exemptions of the CEQA Guidelines.
- Section 15061 (b) (3) "Common Sense" Exemption: In accordance with CEQA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3). The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." *Ibid.* This determination is an issue of fact and if sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity cannot have a significant effect on the environment, then the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See *No Oil, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles* (1974) 13 Cal. 3d 68. The ruling in this case stated that if a project falls within a category exempt by administrative regulation or 'it can be seen with certainty that the activity in question will not have a significant effect on the environment', no further agency evaluation is required. With certainty, there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment. The proposed remediation to the Riverside Center will not result in any direct or indirect physical environmental impacts. The improvements occur at existing facility, would not alter the footprint and is being completed to create a compliant and safe operating facility. The use of the facility for public services would remain unchanged. Therefore, in no way, would the project as proposed have the potential to cause a significant environmental impact and the project is exempt from further CEQA analysis.

Based upon the identified exemptions above, the County of Riverside, Facilities Management hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
