

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County Community Action Commission (CAC) was formally established by the Board of Supervisors to provide guidance on anti-poverty programming, funding and to amplify the needs of low-income communities and residents. The primary responsibility of the CAC is to work collaboratively with the Riverside County Community Action Partnership (CAP) to implement funding allocated via the federally funded Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program within Riverside County. In accordance with the Riverside County Board of Supervisor's Policy A- 21, Advisory Boards, Commissions and Committees, the CAC advises the Riverside County Board of Supervisors consistent with the Delineation of Powers Agreement between Governing Board and the Community Action Commission.

The CAC is a tripartite board composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) members representing three sectors: one-third (1/3) shall represent the Public Sector; one third (1/3) shall be low-income individuals or shall be representatives of the low-income community; and one third (1/3) shall represent the Private Sector as members of business, industry, labor, religious, education or other major group and interests in the community served. All members shall

represent a Riverside County supervisorial district and shall be formally appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

Captain David Cain is the Corps Officer of the Salvation Army Riverside Corps. As leader of the Salvation Army in northwest Riverside County, Cain is responsible for many social service programs including shelters, vocational training programs for individuals experiencing homelessness, programs aimed at addressing cycles of poverty within families and many other social services. He is committed to seeking creative solutions to some of the most pressing social issues in our community. Captain Cain holds a degree in Leadership and Ministry and is an ordained minister. He and his wife Kelly live in Riverside and have four boys: Preston (currently serving in the United States Navy), Landon (currently serving the United States Air Force), Micah and Malachi.

Captain Cain will bring his frontline experience in addressing poverty through the Salvation Army's programming and services to the Community Action Commission (CAC). He also brings experience in homeless services, migrant family support and vocational programming for justice involved residents. Captain Cain has expressed an interest in serving on the CAC as a Private Sector Representative. If appointed, his term will begin on June 21, 2022, and will expire on June 21, 2024.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Community Action Commission (CAC) has a positive impact on residents and business as the CAC seeks to address poverty and economic opportunities for all residents.
