

BACKGROUND:

The Riverside County Community Action Commission (CAC) was formally established by the Board of Supervisors to provide guidance on anti-poverty programming, funding and to amplify the needs of low-income communities and residents. The primary responsibility of the CAC is to work collaboratively with the Riverside County Community Action Partnership (CAP) to implement funding allocated via the federally funded Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program within Riverside County. In accordance with the Riverside County Board of Supervisor's Policy A- 21, Advisory Boards, Commissions and Committees, the CAC advises the Riverside County Board of Supervisors consistent with the Delineation of Powers Agreement between Governing Board and the Community Action Commission.

The CAC is a tripartite board composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) members representing three sectors: one-third (1/3) shall represent the Public Sector; one third (1/3) shall be low-income individuals or shall be representatives of the low-income community; and one third (1/3) shall represent the Private Sector as members of business, industry, labor, religious, education or other major group and interests in the community served. All members shall represent a

Riverside County supervisorial district and shall be formally appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

Mayor Malcolm Lilienthal was sworn in as a Council Member for the Hemet City Council on December 8, 2020, resulting from the November 3, 2020, General Municipal Election. Aside from being a Council Member, Malcolm is a Marriage and Family Therapist. He is also a proud graduate from El Camino High School and a college graduate from Argosy University, with a degree in psychology. Mayor Lilienthal is a husband and father, dedicated to his three beautiful children. His family is proud to call Hemet home for over 15 years and is happy for the added years to come. The goals of the Mayor while in office encompass the ideals of creating a safe, attractive, and prosperous City that can be built together as a community.

The City of Hemet has over the years been an active participant in the Community Action Commission (CAC) as the City's leadership worked to address poverty and the needs of its vulnerable residents. The appointment of Mayor Lilienthal will continue this partnership and collaboration. The Mayor has expressed an interest in serving on the CAC as a Public Sector Representative. If appointed, his term will begin on June 21, 2022, and will expire at the end of his term of office on November 30, 2024.
