**BACKGROUND:**

At the direction of the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors, L&LMD No. 89-1-C was formed in 1994 by Resolution No. 94-389 and authorized to levy an annual assessment to pay for the installation and maintenance of landscaping and streetlights within L&LMD No. 89-1-C. Since that date, L&LMD No. 89-1-C has approved and included the following improvements such as the maintenance and servicing of landscaping, trails, storm water runoff catch basin filters (fossil filters), bio-swales, streetlights, traffic signals, bridge lights, and graffiti abatement, all zone specific.

Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 89-1-Consolidated (District) maintains and services 166 locations throughout Riverside County. The District contains 83 separate assessment zones (with 99 locations overall) and 83 street lighting assessment zones as described in Attachment A.

The combined Annual Engineer's Report for FY 22/23 was prepared in compliance with the requirement of Article 4, Chapter 1, of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, which is Part 2, Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code. The County initiates proceedings for the annual levy of assessments by passing a resolution, which proposes the annual levy under the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972. This resolution also describes the improvements, the location of the District and finally orders a registered professional engineer, certified by the State of California, to prepare and file a detailed report.

In November 1996, California voters passed Proposition 218, Right to Vote on Taxes Act which added Articles XIII C and XIII D to the California Constitution, new procedures must be followed to levy annual assessments under the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972. A county may levy annual assessments for an assessment district after complying with the requirements of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, and the provisions of Proposition 218 Right to Vote on Taxes Act.

Consistent with the Board of Supervisors' direction regarding compliance with Article XIID of the California Constitution and the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, the attached resolutions have been prepared and a public hearing scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on July 12, 2022 to receive testimony for and against the proposed assessments.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

Only the property owners within the boundaries of each Zone within L&LMD No. 89-1-C are impacted by the assessments collected for the maintenance of the improvements within these zones, as described in Attachment A and the Engineer's Report.

Depending on the time the zones were annexed into L&LMD No. 89-1-C, and the type of improvements, the mailed assessment ballot proposition approved by the property owners provides for these assessments and that either no inflation factor was established (Zones 1 and 3), a two percent (2%) inflation factor was established, or the annual assessment may be increased each year by the greater of two percent (2%) or the cumulative percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U), or the Consumer Price Index for electricity (CPI-UE "for electricity"), for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (the "Index") as the Index stands as of March of each calendar year. Typically, CPI-U is for regular zones and CPI-UE is used for street lighting zones.

**SUPPLEMENTAL:**

**Additional Fiscal Information**

The annual budget for FY 22/23 totals \$1,897,261. For FY 22/23, the inflation factor, when appropriate, will be four percent (4%).

The inflation factor affects the maximum assessment, which is the maximum allowable assessment to be placed on a parcel, acre, or equivalent dwelling unit (EDU) within L&LMD No. 89-1-C. Zones may be assessed at the maximum assessment if needed, however some zones are assessed less depending on overall annual maintenance costs and existing reserves, if any. A copy of the Consumer Price Index for Riverside County for March 2022 has been provided.

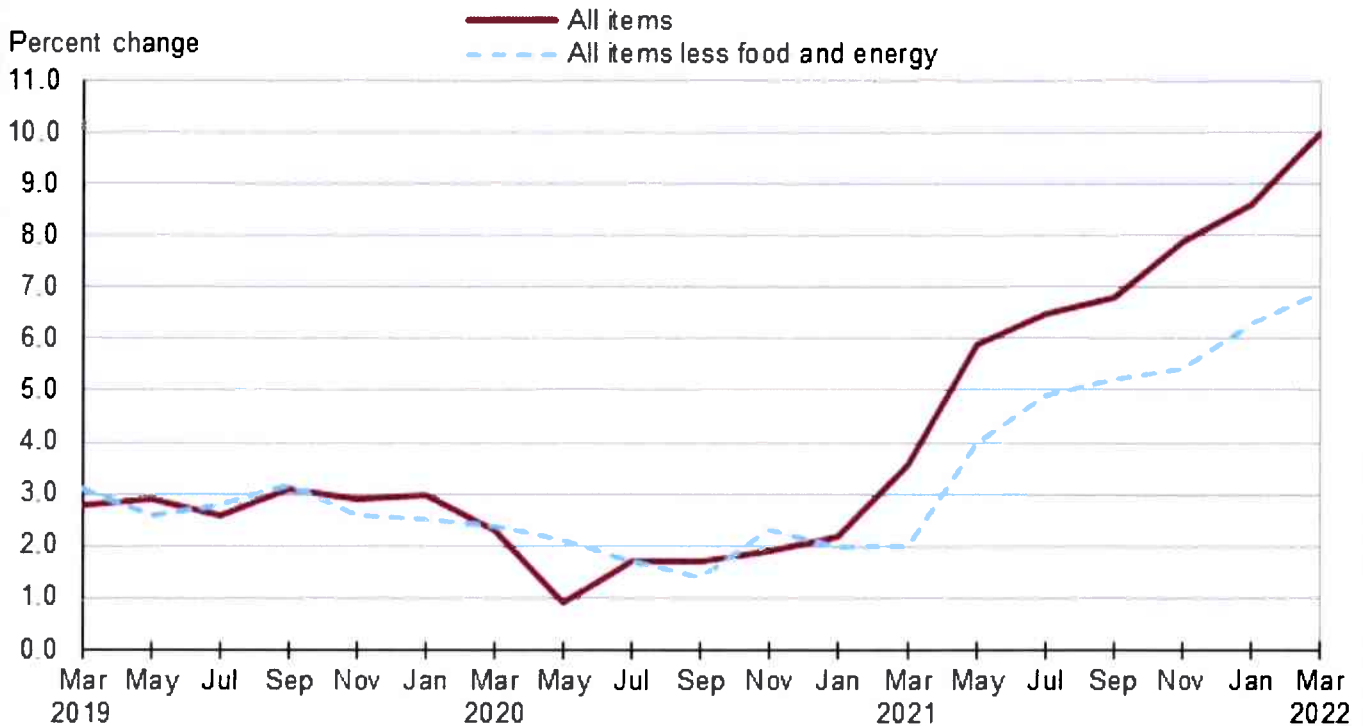
**Consumer Price Index, Riverside Area – March 2022**

**Area prices were up 2.7 percent over the past two months, up 10.0 percent from a year ago**

Prices in the Riverside area, as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), advanced 2.7 percent for the two months ending in March 2022, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. (See [table A.](#)) Regional Commissioner Chris Rosenlund noted that the March increase was influenced by higher prices for gasoline. (Data in this report are not seasonally adjusted. Accordingly, bi-monthly changes may reflect seasonal influences.)

Over the last 12 months, the CPI-U jumped 10.0 percent. (See [chart 1](#) and [table A.](#)) Food prices advanced 8.1 percent. Energy prices jumped 38.6 percent, largely the result of an increase in the price of gasoline. The index for all items less food and energy increased 6.9 percent over the year. (See [table 1.](#))

## Food

Food prices increased 1.5 percent for the two months ending in March. (See table 1.) Prices for food at home increased 1.5 percent. Higher prices for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs (4.9 percent) were partially offset by lower prices for dairy and related products (-1.0 percent) and fruits and vegetables (-0.9). Prices for food away from home rose 1.5 percent for the same period.

Over the year, food prices advanced 8.1 percent. Prices for food at home rose 9.8 percent since a year ago, led by higher prices for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs (16.4 percent). The only food at home category with a price decrease over the past year was dairy and related products (-2.3 percent). Prices for food away from home advanced 6.1 percent since last year.

## Energy

The energy index advanced 15.3 percent for the two months ending in March. The increase was mainly due to higher prices for gasoline (22.8 percent). Prices for electricity advanced 7.6 percent, but prices for natural gas service fell 11.1 percent for the same period.

Energy prices jumped 38.6 percent over the year, largely due to higher prices for gasoline (48.9 percent). Prices paid for electricity advanced 24.2 percent, and prices for natural gas service rose 18.8 percent during the past year.

## All items less food and energy

The index for all items less food and energy rose 1.1 percent in the latest two-month period. Higher prices for apparel (5.3 percent), recreation (2.9 percent), and shelter (1.2 percent) were partially offset by lower prices for household furnishings and operations (-1.6 percent), other goods and services (-1.1), and new and used motor vehicles (-1.0 percent).

Over the year, the index for all items less food and energy increased 6.9 percent. Components contributing to the increase included used cars and trucks (33.9 percent) and shelter (6.3 percent).

## Technical Note

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes CPIs for two population groups: (1) a CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 93 percent of the total U.S. population and (2) a CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which covers approximately 29 percent of

the total U.S. population. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Each month, prices are collected in 75 urban areas across the country from about 6,000 housing units and approximately 22,000 retail establishments—department stores, supermarkets, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date; for most of the CPI-U the reference base is 1982-84 equals 100. An increase of 7 percent from the reference base, for example, is shown as 107.000. Alternatively, that relationship can also be expressed as the price of a base period market basket of goods and services rising from \$100 to \$107. For further details see the CPI home page on the Internet at [www.bls.gov/cpi](http://www.bls.gov/cpi) and the CPI section of the BLS Handbook of Methods available on the internet at [www.bls.gov/opub/hom/cpi/](http://www.bls.gov/opub/hom/cpi/).

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights that represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Because the sample size of a local area is smaller, the local area index is subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. In addition, local indexes are not adjusted for seasonal influences. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. **NOTE: Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices between cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.**

The Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario, CA metropolitan area includes Riverside and San Bernardino Counties in California.

**SUMMARY OF RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DECLARING INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESSMENTS WITHIN ZONES AND STREET LIGHTING ZONES OF THE LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT NO. 89-1-CONSOLIDATED OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE PURSUANT TO THE LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING ACT OF 1972 FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING OF LANDSCAPING, MULTI-PURPOSE TRAILS, FENCING, STORMWATER RUNOFF CATCH BASIN FILTERS, BIO-SWALES, GRAFFITI ABATEMENT, TRAFFIC SIGNALS, BRIDGE LIGHTS, AND STREETLIGHTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-23; AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE ANNUAL ASSESSMENT THAT SHALL BE HELD JULY 12, 2022, AT 9:30 A.M. AT BOARD CHAMBERS, 4080 LEMON STREET, RIVERSIDE.**

In 1994, the Board of Supervisors ("Board of Supervisors") of the County of Riverside ("County") established Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 891Consolidated of the County of Riverside, State of California ("L&LMD No. 891C") pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, for installation and planting of landscaping; the installation of multi-purpose trails; the installation of fencing; the installation of stormwater runoff catch basin filters; the installation of irrigation or electrical facilities; the maintenance and servicing of such landscaping, multi-purpose trail, fencing, stormwater runoff catch basin filters and irrigation or electrical improvements; and the provision of electricity to streetlights, traffic signals, and bridge lights within the public rights-of-way within 83 assessment zones.

An annual assessment is levied on the 83 assessment zones within L&LMD No. 89-1-C to pay the costs of maintenance services and of the improvements, and the Board of Supervisors intends to levy an annual assessment for fiscal year 2022-2023 after public hearing. The assessment zones, annual assessments for fiscal year 2022-2023 by zone, and maintenance activities and improvements are described more particularly in the Engineer's Report presented and filed before the Board of Supervisors and Resolution 2022-128. The Engineer's Report and Resolution 2022-128 are publicly available from the Clerk of the Board and on the website of the Clerk of the Board as part of the agenda for the June 21, 2022 meeting (Agenda item 3.28). The Engineer's Report states that the assessments to be levied in the respective Zones and Street Lighting Zones for fiscal year 2022-2023 are in an amount that is the same as levied in fiscal year 2021-2022, or increased by four percent (4%) more than the assessments levied for fiscal year 2021-2022 (based on the cumulative percentage increase in the CPIU from March 2021 through March 2022), and are consistent with the terms of the ballot proposition approving the annexation of each zone.
