Occupancy Limits Set Forth in Draft Ordinance 927.1 (rev. 06.07.22)

Are Not Reasonable And They Will Cause More Parties and More Noise

How can this be?

Because, limiting occupancy without consideration for small children (age 16 and below) would cause MORE groups of adults from different households to rent the STR because it's still affordable for 4 to 5 different households to rent a 4 to 5 bedroom home.

Because, without excluding children under 16 in the guest count, there will be fewer:

Families who are Friends getting together for a vacation with their children because most families count on sharing vacation rentals with friends with children for an affordable vacation.

Because without excluding children, extended families cannot have family vacations and reunions at a vacation rental. Grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, etc. should be able to stay under one roof without counting children under the age of 16 in the "Occupancy" count.

How much of the STR business are family vacations with children?

For TWC Villas, it's **over 80%!!**

I know this 80% is true for many of my colleagues as well. In Idyllwild, however, the homes are smaller and have far fewer family gatherings compared to other areas in unincorporated Riverside county.

Please help me run a quiet vacation rental.

Please make allowances for children under 16 years old.
