#### BACKGROUND:

#### Summary

The Governor of California proclaimed a State of Emergency on August 1, 2022, due to the spread of monkeypox within the state of California. On August 8, 2022, the County's Public Health Officer proclaimed a local health emergency based on an imminent and proximate threat to public health from the introduction and spread of Monkeypox in Riverside County. The Board of Supervisors must ratify and extend the proclamation within seven (7) days. The proclamation of a local health emergency recognizes that Monkeypox is a serious public health concern, both in terms of current and potential spread in communities and in the paucity of resources such as vaccines and antivirals that are needed to combat the spread of the illness.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

Residents and businesses will benefit from the preparation and mitigation efforts to combat the spread of Monkeypox.

# PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL HEALTH EMERGENCY FOR THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA REGARDING MONKEYPOX

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code section 101080 authorizes a local health officer to declare a local health emergency in the health officer's jurisdiction, or any part thereof, whenever the health officer reasonably determines that there is an imminent and proximate threat of the introduction of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease; and

WHEREAS, monkeypox is a disease caused by infection with the monkeypox virus. It is spread through prolonged skin-to-skin contact and symptoms of monkeypox include rash, fever, muscle aches and respiratory symptoms. Although most cases of monkeypox resolve within a few weeks, monkeypox can cause serious symptoms, including severe pain, hospitalization and, in rare cases, death: and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2022, the first case of monkeypox in the United States was confirmed in Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2022, an investigation began into the first case of monkeypox in California in a person who traveled abroad, and the case was confirmed as positive for monkeypox on May 25, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2022 the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the multicountry spread of monkeypox to be a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, which constitutes its highest alert level; and

WHEREAS, on August 1, 2022 pursuant to the authority vested in him under Government Code section 8625, the Governor of California proclaimed a State of Emergency due to the spread of monkeypox within the State of California; and

WHEREAS, on August 4, 2022 the Biden Administration declared a National Public Health Emergency due the spread of monkeypox within the United States; and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2022 the first case of monkeypox was reported in Riverside County: and
