

BACKGROUND:

The Riverside County Community Action Commission (CAC) was formally established by the Board of Supervisors to provide guidance on anti-poverty programming, funding and to amplify the needs of low-income communities and residents. The primary responsibility of the CAC is to work collaboratively with the Riverside County Community Action Partnership (CAP) to implement funding allocated via the federally funded Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program within Riverside County. In accordance with the Riverside County Board of Supervisor's Policy A- 21, Advisory Boards, Commissions and Committees, the CAC advises the Riverside County Board of Supervisors consistent with the Delineation of Powers Agreement between Governing Board and the Community Action Commission.

The CAC is a tripartite board composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) members representing three sectors: one-third (1/3) shall represent the Public Sector; one third (1/3) shall be low-income individuals or shall be representatives of the low-income community; and one third

(1/3) shall represent the Private Sector as members of business, industry, labor, religious, education or other major group and interests in the community served. All members shall represent a Riverside County supervisorial district and shall be formally appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

CAP Riverside held elections for low-income representatives that closed on June 3rd, 2022. Maurice Playford was elected as District 4 Low-Income Representative for the Commission in accordance with the democratic selection procedures set forth in the Low-Income Commissioner Election Policy. Mr. Playford's term shall be two years and he must continue to reside in the area selected to represent his district in accordance with the Riverside County Community Action Commission Bylaws.

Mr. Playford's two-year term will begin on August 30, 2022 and will expire on August 29, 2024.

Maurice Playford is a volunteer serving the Colorado River Community Center and Colorado River Senior Citizens Center. Mr. Playford is an avid voice for low-income seniors living in District 4's unincorporated communities along the Colorado River. He is dedicated to helping low-income residents find services including food, clothing, and shelter within the larger Blythe community especially those areas along the state's border with Arizona. He is a retired professional with over 35 years of experience advocating and working in the field of mental health care with a focus on the developmentally disabled and those with severe physical disabilities.
