

**BACKGROUND:**

The Riverside County Community Action Commission (CAC) was formally established by the Board of Supervisors to provide guidance on anti-poverty programming, funding, and to amplify the needs of low-income communities and residents. The primary responsibility of the CAC is to work collaboratively with the Community Action Partnership (CAP) of Riverside County to implement funding allocated via the federally funded Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program within Riverside County. In accordance with the Riverside County Board of Supervisors Policy A-21, Advisory Boards, Commissions, and Committees, the CAC advises the Riverside County Board of Supervisors consistent with the Delineation of Powers Agreement between Governing Board and the Community Action Commission.

The CAC is a tripartite commission composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) members representing three sectors: one-third (1/3) shall represent the Public Sector; one-third (1/3) shall be low-income individuals or shall be representatives of the low-income community; and

one third (1/3) shall represent the Private Sector as members of a business, industry, labor, religious, education or other major group and interests in the community served. All members shall represent a Riverside County supervisorial district and shall be formally appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

Carl Smith is a Board Member of the social service nonprofit organization, My City Youth Center, located in the city of Hemet. The center provides a safe place for at-risk youth ages 8 to 18 by offering no-cost meals, and an array of free programs which include the arts, sports, and after-school education support. In addition, the center offers a teen parent program offering support, encouragement, and parenting classes. As a Board Member, Carl showcases his commitment to giving back to the community through volunteer work, facilitating youth activities, and providing job opportunities.

Carl's dedication and hands-on approach to seeking solutions that meet the needs of low-income households in the community have rendered him great success in starting a water business. His professional and frontline experience over the past decade includes expertise in areas of contribution such as strategic planning, fundraising, public speaking, community advocacy, community development, community relations, event planning, sales, business development, financial literacy/budgets/investment, and cultural diversity.

Carl will bring his experience and commitment to addressing poverty to the Community Action Commission (CAC). Carl has expressed an interest in serving on the CAC as a Private Sector Representative. If appointed, his term will begin on August 30, 2022, and will expire on August 30, 2024.
