BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to **Inspire Life Skills Training, Inc.** will be used to help sponsor their 2022 Gala. Inspire exists to break the cycle of abuse and poverty through stable housing, education, training, and mentorship of foster and homeless youth. The youth in this program are 18-26 years old former foster and/or homeless youth. Participants can be in the program for up to five years if they are continuing their education.
2. Club members work year-round to develop and support community service projects that address topics such as children at risk, hunger, basic education and literacy, and other quality of life uses.
