

BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Girl Scouts of San Gorgonio Council – Funding will be utilized towards gender neutral ADA compliant restrooms and shower facilities for the girl scouts and school children in the STEM program.
2. Riverside University Health System Foundation – Funds will support critical work at RUHS in the Pediatric Unit, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, and the Child Abuse and Neglect Unit.
3. Oak Grove Institute Foundation – Funding will support the Arts Alive Program. Oak Grove Center rebuilds the lives of children and their families through educating, healing, restoring relationship, building character, and instilling hope. The Arts Alive Program helps to inspire them to connect with the arts as part of their healing journey.
4. Western Science Center – Funds will be used towards the Science Exploration Experience which advances knowledge through scientific discovery and understanding of the region’s natural history and cultural heritage.
5. Rotary Club of Temecula – Funding will support the Rotary Club’s monthly food boxes for seniors in Temecula.
6. Daughters of Love, Inc. – Funding will help provide transitional housing for pregnant and/or parenting women ages 18-21.

7. Community Food Pantry of Murrieta – Funds will be utilized for the weekly food box program for families in need. The Community Food Pantry of Murrieta strives to support individuals and families that are challenged with food insecurities.
8. Menifee Chamber of Commerce – Funds will support the 2022 State of the City Address. This event allows communication directly to the residents of Menifee as to current and future initiatives within the city.
9. Assistance League of Hemacinto – Funding will be used to purchase clothing and shoes for youth in need in the Hemet and San Jacinto area.
10. Riverside County Office of Education Foundation – Funding will help meet the goal of the foundation which is to provide scholarships to disadvantaged students in Riverside County.
11. Trauma Intervention Programs of Southwest Riverside County – Funds will be utilized to recruit additional Trauma Intervention Program (TIP) volunteers. TIP volunteers provide emotional first aid to survivors of tragedy.
12. Animal Town Sanctuary – Funding will help Animal Town Sanctuary with exams, lab testing, and microchipping for stray cats and dogs in Riverside County.
13. Murrieta Chamber of Commerce – Funds will support the 2022 State of the City Address. This event allows communication directly to the residents of Murrieta as to current and future initiatives within the city.
14. Boys and Girls Club of Southwest Riverside County – Funding will provide academic support, sports, arts, S.T.E.M., career readiness, and leadership programs through before and after-school programs and day camps.
15. Foundation on Aging – Funding will go towards the annual holiday grocery market gift card program to help seniors purchase groceries for warm meals during the holidays.
16. Big Brothers Big Sisters – Funding will benefit youth by providing mentors to help them plan for their future. Mentoring through Big Brothers Big Sisters is transformative and allows youth to walk a different path that they never believed was possible.
17. Menifee Valley Community Cupboard – Funds will help support the mission of the Menifee Valley Community Cupboard. The pantry been serving the community since 1997 with a goal to alleviate hunger and malnutrition for our neighbors in need by providing food at no cost to children, homeless, seniors, and those experiencing financial difficulty and food insecurity.
18. Riverside Medical Clinic Charitable Foundation – Funding will support the 8th Annual Bullying Prevention Conference where students will receive help with adjusting to being back in school and learn that bullying is not ok.
