SUBJECT: RIVERSIDE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM-BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: Ratify and Approve the Provision of Public Safety Realignment Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs Aggregate, All Districts. [\$1,300,000 Annually, up to \$130,000 in Additional Compensation Per Fiscal Year; \$6,500,000 Total for Five Years, 100% State Funding]

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Ratify and Approve the Public Safety Realignment Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs aggregate in the amount of \$1,300,000 annually for a total amount of \$6,500,000 for the term July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2027; and
2. Authorize the Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, based upon the availability of funding and as approved by County Counsel to: a) sign and execute Agreements with the vendors listed in Attachment A; b) sign and execute Agreements with vendors subsequently awarded under RFP MHARC-138 that do not exceed the approved aggregate amount through June 30, 2027; c) sign amendments that exercise the options of the agreement including modifications of the statement of work that stay within the intent of the Agreement; d) move the allocated funds among the vendors; and e) sign amendments to the compensation provisions that do not exceed the sum total of ten percent (10%) of the total aggregate through June 30, 2027.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Public Safety Realignment Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs are intended to provide emergency and/or transitional housing for eligible participants who currently receive services from Riverside County Probation Department. While in housing, residents will also receive an array of supportive services from Riverside County agencies and programs that would enable them to develop the skills and resources needed to reintegrate in the community and establish self-sufficient housing.

Services provided by contractors include the following:

- Emergency Housing - Short term housing, up to 30 days, approved on a weekly basis.
- Transitional Housing without services or programming (TH-WOSP) - Housing up to six (6) months with no services or programming expected to be provided.
- Transitional Housing with services or programming (THWSP) - Housing that is six (6) months to one (1) year and will include services or programming which is evidence-based or considered best practices in the field of community corrections.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

These services are a component of Behavioral Health's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

On October 1, 2013, the County of Riverside Purchasing Department, on behalf of Riverside County Probation Department issued an ongoing formal Request for Proposal (RFP) #MHARC-138 seeking competitive proposals from agencies qualified to provide for Public Safety Realignment Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs. All proposals are screened, evaluated, negotiated and the most responsive/responsible bidders are recommended for funding by an Evaluation Committee.

On June 6, 2017, (3.18), the Board of Supervisors authorized agreements with service providers for a combined annual aggregate of \$1,000,000 annually through June 30, 2021.

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On June 5, 2018, (3.29), the Board of Supervisors authorized an increase to the approved aggregate from 1,000,000 to \$1,300,000 annually for FY 2019/2020 through FY 2021/2022.

Due to the specialized services provided by the vendors listed in Attachment A, RUHS-BH requires the flexibility to add new vendors through the on-going procurement process to ensure continuity of care. Therefore, RUHS-BH is requesting that the Board of Supervisors approve the Agreements as listed in Attachment A and add new vendors through June 30, 2027 as outlined herein.

Additional Fiscal Information

Public Safety Realignment Emergency and Transitional Housing Programs are one hundred percent (100%) State funded. The Agreements have termination clauses in the event that applicable funds become unavailable for service provision. There are sufficient funds in the Department's FY22/23 budget and no additional County funds are required.
