#### **BACKGROUND:**

## Summary

On January 27, 2022, the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) released a Request for Proposals to Sheriffs and Police Chiefs in California for up to \$75,000 in funding to enable selected agencies to expand their efforts in addressing alcohol-related problems by using ABC's comprehensive program strategies. Per BOS Policy A-30, on March 9, 2022, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department notified the County Executive Office of its intent to apply for State funding from ABC. On March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022, in response to the grant solicitation, the Department applied for grant funding from ABC to support local efforts to curb underage on-sale and off-sale establishments selling alcohol to minors outside the Southwest corridor's licensing requirements.

On May 27, 2022, ABC approved the Sheriff Department's proposal and selected the Sheriff's Department to receive \$75,000 in grant funding for the Alcohol Policing Partnership (APP) grant. The purpose of the Alcohol Policing Partnership is to work with law enforcement agencies to develop a practical, comprehensive, and strategic approach to eliminating the crime and public nuisance problems associated with problem alcoholic beverage outlets.

Lake Elsinore Station personnel located in the Southwest corridor of Riverside County will use the funds to prevent, educate, and enforce underage drinking laws and respond to underage alcohol-related incidents in the cities of Canyon Lake, Lake Elsinore, Temecula, and Wildomar areas. The grant will fund overtime expenses to attend meetings with the ABC to assist with identifying disruptive and disorderly licensed premises and provide training sessions for licensees at local stations of prevention and enforcement related to the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages.

Station personnel will establish and build partnerships with retailers through education and enforcement to mitigate common issues, reduce alcohol-related crimes, reduce the number of people injured or killed in alcohol-related collisions and reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. Funds will also be used for increased personnel at targeted licensee stations to prevent the sales of alcoholic beverages to minors. The project will be staffed by a sworn supervisor (Sergeant) and Deputy Sheriffs, a minimum of two (2), or a maximum of four (4), on overtime who have experience in Alcohol Beverage Control objectives.

A four-fifths vote is required for this item pursuant to California Government Code Section 29130 as a budget adjustment has been requested.

## Impact on Residents and Businesses

Grant funds will increase focus on alcohol-related violations, including illegal sales and consumption by minors, and enhance the Department's ability to prevent, educate, and enforce the area's underage drinking and alcohol-related injuries and policies.

#### Additional Fiscal Information

This grant is State funded through the Department of Alcohol and Beverage Control and is 100% reimbursable. The Department did not include funding for this project in the FY 22/23 budget; therefore, a Schedule A budget adjustment is attached to add \$75,000 in expenditures to the budget. No additional County general funds will be required.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside desires to give the Riverside County Sheriff's Department (Sheriff's Department) authority for the management and administration of funds and projects related to the Alcohol Policing Program (APP) from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC); and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control Alcohol Policing Program has provided funding of \$75,000 for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023 to the Sheriff's Department to develop practical approaches to eliminate crime and public nuisance problems associated with alcoholic beverage outlets;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Department intends to use this funding to staff a minimum of two (2) or a maximum of four (4) Sheriff's Department personnel to mitigate and reduce alcohol-related crimes; and host trainings, perform shoulder tap programs, and conduct investigations for disorderly conduct.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on October 4, 2022, at 9:30 A.M., or soon thereafter in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors located on the first floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, California, as follows:
