SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 971
AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
AUTHORIZING THE LEVY OF A SPECIAL TAX WITHIN COMMUNITY
FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 21-3M (EAGLE VISTA) OF THE COUNTY OF
RIVERSIDE

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 25124(b). A certified copy of the full text of Ordinance No. 971 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, located at 4080 Lemon Street 1st Floor, Riverside, California 92501.

Pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, commencing with Section 53311 of the California Government Code (the "Government Code"), on February 8, 2022, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board of Supervisors") of the County of Riverside adopted Resolution No. 2022-047, stating its intention to establish a community facilities district proposed to be named Community Facilities District No. 21-3M (Eagle Vista / Lake Ranch) of the County of Riverside (the "District"), and to authorize the levy of special taxes to fund, pay for, and finance authorized street lighting, traffic signal services and landscaping (the "Services") and to pay expenses incidental thereto and incidental to the levy and collection of the special taxes, so long as the special taxes are needed collection of the special taxes, so long as the special taxes are needed to fund the Services.

Ordinance No. 971 authorizes the levy of special taxes to the applicable Improvement Areas within the District at the rate and in accordance with the method of apportionment approved by the voters at an election held on March 22, 2022 regarding the proposed levy of special taxes. Ordinance No. 971 provides that the Board of Supervisors, as the legislative body of the District, is authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine or cause to be determined the specific special tax rate and appoint to be levied for the part ensuing specific special tax rate and amount to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within the District. The special tax revenues shall be used to fund, pay for, and finance the Services and shall be levied so long as special taxes are needed to fund such Services. In addition, the special tax revenue may be used to replenish a reserve fund for the District, to pay the costs of administering the District, and to fund the cost of collecting and administering the special tax. Ordinance No. 971 provides that the special taxes may be collected on the secured property tax roll in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes and that the special taxes shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes. The rate and method of apportionment of the special tax authorized by Ordinance No. 971 is the rate and method approved by voters within the District and as further reflected in Exhibit A "Rate and Method" to Ordinance No. 971.
