BACKGROUND:

Summary

Award of VITA Grant Funds

The U.S. Department of the Treasury, on behalf of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) sponsors a program entitled Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA). This program provides localities with financial resources to find and train volunteers to prepare income tax returns of low-income residents for free during tax season.

The IRS has awarded Community Action Partnership (CAP) \$165,273 in annual funds for this program. The funds will be used by CAP for community outreach, coordinating the recruitment and training of volunteers, and obtaining tax preparation sites for the VITA Program for all eligible Riverside County residents. In 2021, CAP recruited and provided training to 101 volunteers (who donated 5,243 hours), prepared tax returns for 2,202 Riverside County residents, and generated \$4,398,351 in Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and other refunds which went back into the community.

The new VITA Grant agreement between the IRS and CAP is memorialized in the proposed FY 2022-2023 Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Grant Agreement (Agreement), attached hereto, which sets forth the terms for administration of these funds. The IRS distributes VITA grants annually to the County of Riverside Community Action Partnership agency (CAP), now

part of the Riverside County Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions (HWS). The grant agreements seldom vary significantly from year to year.

HWS/CAP is requesting approval of Resolution No. 2022-214, which is a delegation of authority from the Board of Supervisors to the Director of the Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions to apply for, accept and administer VITA Grant funding received from the IRS for the provision of free tax preparation services to the low-income individuals and families of the County, and ratification and approval of the Grant Agreement. County Counsel has approved both the Resolution and the Grant Agreement as to form.

Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the attached Resolution No. 2022-214 and Grant Agreement.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

Low-income residents of Riverside County will have access to important tax preparation services completely free of charge through funding provided to this VITA Program.

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Board of Supervisors, located on the 1st floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, as follows:

- 1. The Director of HWS, or designee, is authorized to apply for and accept VITA funds on behalf of the County of Riverside. This authority shall include signature of necessary grant acceptance documents, agreements, amendments (that increase or otherwise modify the grant) and related documents required to secure and continue the grant for the County. Agreements and amendments shall be approved as to form by County Counsel.
- 2. The Director of HWS, or designee, shall administer VITA funds and its related programs and sign all certifications, assurances, exhibits, reports, or similar documents made or required under the VITA grant.
- 3. The Director of HWS, or designee, shall promptly report to the Board all grants received and grant funding changes for budget and Auditor-Controller purposes. The Director of HWS, or designee, shall also promptly report any material changes or significant new developments related to the VITA grant(s).
- 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
