Tina had an MFA degree, and attended Indiana State University, Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles Film School and Theater of Arts, Hollywood. Tina was an award-winning television producer, executive director and show host. She was the creator and executive producer of the long running PBS In Our Community, television show series, and she concurrently produced and directed the weekly television show, Today's Kids.

Tina's love for children led to a rewarding career helping hundreds of children and teenagers, develop confidence through affordable youth development classes such as acting, modeling, public speaking, college prep workshops, boxing, internships, and much more.

Tina was the founder and CEO of Today's Youth Non-Profit Organization, which she established in 2001, in effort to keep youth active, up-to-date, and informed. The organization is a strong partnership between adults and the community where young people are at the forefront of creating positive social change. The training and connections that she provided youth, is immeasurable.

Tina was well known for giving back to the community. She annually donated profits, to sponsor underprivileged youth in education and the entertainment industry. Tina was a strong role model and true inspiration to so many, she was honored with the Multicultural Motion Picture Media Award as an Important Woman in Television.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates her service to the County of Riverside.



In March of 2022, he promoted to his current rank at the John J. Benoit Detention Center.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates Correctional Corporal Jacks' service to Riverside County. He is remembered as a loving father and dedicated public servant.

Hannah Nichole Jacks was a 2020 Hemet High School graduate. She was a devoted dance and musical theatre instructor at The Dancers' Studio in Hemet where she inspired and mentored young dance students. Hannah had just launched her dance career with Disneyland Resort as a performer in the Christmas Fantasy Parade. She is remembered as a happy and kind young woman, and an incredible dancer.

Their memories will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved them. They will be greatly missed but never forgotten.



George attended Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan for two years, he later returned to California, and attended Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, majoring in dairy husbandry. After finishing college, George intended to work for his father on the dairy but was drafted in 1957 and served in the Army for two years.

George returned to San Diego on leave, to marry the love of his life, Marvalee Johnson, on November 18, 1958. They met at a church youth group. After his Army service, George purchased a chicken farm in Calimesa, and started a small retail nursery and landscaping company.
