On motion of Supervisor Washington, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, December 6, 2022, be adjourned in memory of Caroline Madeline Dalcamo Pope, "Carrie," who passed away December 4, 2022.

Members of Carrie's family have been active in Corona and its environs for well over one hundred years. Her maternal grandfather, Frank Danieri and her paternal grandfather, Luy Dalcamo both arrived in the Corona area, from Sicily in the very early twentieth century. Their hard work and knowledge of citrus was essential in establishing the groves that would become the center of the local economy for seven decades.

Carrie's father, Tony, was born in Casa Blanca and had a career managing the Orange Heights Packing House. Her mother, Carmel, came with her mother and siblings to join her father in the U.S., at the age of 4. Carmel operated a restaurant in Corona for many years, famously known locally as "Carmel's."

Carrie attended, the old Lincoln Elementary School, Corona Junior High and Corona High School. As a child Carrie and her younger brother Louis were surrounded by family and friends. All her school years were with the same kids. Her favorite teacher was renowned Corona educator Francis Finley. Carrie's fifth grade teacher Mrs. Reid taught her and a group of students to hula dance.

Carrie met her husband, George, a graduate of Poly High School in Riverside, where they were both studying at what was then called, Riverside City College.

One of Carrie's favorite places in Corona, was the Catholic Church built of fieldstones. Her parents were married in that old stone church. She had all her Sacraments there and led the procession of others getting their first communions.

Carrie's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

Ruth moved to Lake Elsinore Valley in the late 80's and immediately immersed herself in civic organizations, including the Lake Elsinore Historical Society, serving as a member of the board, and later as Board President, a title she held for an unprecedented length of time.

Ruth was appointed to the Riverside County Historical Commission, and she was also a member of the Clean Extreme Committee, the Luiseño Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution for the designation of Historic Buildings, and the Lake Elsinore Chamber of Commerce, from which she received two awards, Citizen of the year 2002, and the John Packman Award 2005.

Ruth was the 2022 Women of the Year by Assemblymember Kelly Seyarto of the 67th Assembly District. She took on numerous projects such as advocating for the improvements to the city's historic lampposts along Lakeshore Avenue, and overseeing the refurbishing of the historic fire truck, which has led the city's Winterfest parades. She also served as treasurer for the Downtown Merchants Association. Ruth's activities were endless and her impact on the people who knew her, was significant. She remained a humble woman with a passion to serve.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates her service to the County of Riverside.


