BACKGROUND:

Summary

Government Code 7283.1 (d), part of Government Code Chapter 17.2 Standards for Participation in United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Programs, requires that the Board of Supervisors hold a public forum to provide information to the public about ICE's access to individuals and to receive and consider public comment. The Code also specifies that local law enforcement may provide the Board with data maintained regarding the number and demographic characteristics of individuals to whom the agency has provided ICE access, the date ICE access was provided, and whether the ICE access was provided through a hold, transfer, or notification request or through other means.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This forum will help ensure transparency for the community in existing law enforcement practices.

Millones de Inmigrantes con Casos en USCIS Podrían ser Beneficiados con Nueva Ley

“El Congreso también debe ayudar a la agencia al proporcionar más fondos directos para la reducción de los retrasos, algo que la agencia normalmente tendría que pagar mediante el aumento de las tarifas de los solicitantes”, advirtió.

Respaldo de organizaciones

La reforma es apoyada por varias organizaciones civiles,

incluida la Asociación Estadounidense de Abogados de Inmigración (AILA), que destacó que los 16,000 miembros de ese grupo representan casos de retrasos ante USCIS.

“Se han separado familias, las empresas han perdido empleados clave y las personas vulnerables continúan en peligro”, advirtió a finales de octubre Benjamin

Johnson, director ejecutivo de AILA.

Angélica Salas, directora ejecutiva de la Coalición por los Derechos de Inmigrantes (CHIRLA), también consideró el proyecto como una forma de garantizar que inmigrantes tengan un proceso justo en sus solicitudes.

En el mismo tenor se expresó

Nicole Melaku, directora ejecutiva de National Partnership for New Americans (NPNA).

“Durante años, la NPNA ha solicitado al USCIS que reduzca los retrasos en el procesamiento para que las familias, para que las personas no tengan que esperar innecesariamente a que se procesen sus solicitudes”, dijo.

Qué permitiría la ley

– Requiere que el Departamento de Seguridad Nacional (DHS) presente informes detallados de acumulación de casos.

– Identificar cada proceso pendiente, es decir el retraso neto y bruto.

– Describir las categorías para cada retraso en las solicitudes.

– Enumerar el tiempo de procesamiento promedio para cada

tipo de solicitud, junto con cualquier cambio en ese tiempo en relación con el trimestre anterior.

– Permitirá análisis de los factores que contribuyen a la acumulación de casos.

– Obligará a una evaluación de los procedimientos de USCIS.

– Acciones sobre cómo eliminar el atraso y garantizar adjudicaciones.

“Congress should also help the agency by providing more direct funding for backlog reduction, something the agency would normally have to pay for by increasing applicant fees,” he warned.

Support of organizations

The reform is supported by various civil organizations, including the American Immi-

gration Lawyers Association (AILA), which noted that the 16,000 members of that group represent cases of delays before USCIS.

“Families have been separated, businesses have lost key employees and vulnerable people continue to be at risk,” AILA executive director Benjamin Johnson warned in late October.

Angélica Salas, executive di-

rector of the Coalition for Immigrant Rights (CHIRLA), also considered the project as a way to guarantee that immigrants have a fair process in their applications.

Nicole Melaku, executive director of the National Partnership for New Americans (NPNA), expressed the same vein.

“For years, the NPNA has asked USCIS to reduce process-

ing delays for families, so that people don’t have to wait unnecessarily for their applications to be processed,” he said.

What would the law allow?

– Requires the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to submit detailed case backlog reports.

– Identify each pending process, that is, the net and gross

delay.

– Describe the categories for each application delay.

– List the average processing time for each type of request, along with any changes in that time from the previous quarter.

– It will allow analysis of the factors that contribute to the accumulation of cases.

USCIS Permitirá Presentar Aplicaciones de Asilo por Internet

–Se encuentran entre las categorías de solicitantes que actualmente deben presentar su solicitud por correo ante el Centro de verificación de antecedentes de asilo, como se describe en la sección de instrucciones especiales de nuestra página web del Formulario I-589

–Ya envió un Formulario I-589, que aún está pendiente con USCIS

Durante el año fiscal 2021, USCIS recibió más de 8.8 millones de solicitudes de beneficios de inmigración y otras solitu-

des, incluidos 61,150 Formularios I-589.

Desde 2017 cuando se dio el lanzamiento de la presentación en línea, la cantidad total de formularios presentados aumentó. En el año fiscal 2021, se presentaron más de 1,21 millones de solicitudes lo que refleja un aumento del 2,3 % con respecto a los 1,18 millones presentados en el año fiscal 2020.

Como dato importante para hacer el trámite para el Formulario I-589 en línea, primero los interesados deben crear una cuenta

en línea de USCIS, que proporciona un método conveniente y seguro para enviar formularios y rastrear el estado de una solicitud de inmigración pendiente de USCIS durante todo el proceso de adjudicación.

No hay costo para configurar una cuenta y la cual ofrece una variedad de funciones, entre ellas la capacidad de comunicarse con USCIS sobre una solicitud a través de una bandeja de entrada segura y responder en línea a las solicitudes de evidencia.

Con la adición de la presentación en línea del Formulario I-589, las personas ahora pueden presentar 13 formularios de USCIS en línea.

La página de consulta “Formularios disponibles para presentar en línea” tiene enlaces para ver todos estos formularios. USCIS continúa aceptando las últimas versiones en papel de todos los formularios por correo. La página uscis.gov/i-589 es importante que sea consultado para cualquier duda durante el trámite.

USCIS Will Allow Online Asylum Application Filing

Important information for filing Form I-589 online is that applicants must first create a USCIS online account, which provides a convenient and secure method of submitting forms and tracking the status of a pending USCIS immigra-

tion application. throughout the award process.

There is no cost to set up an account and it offers a variety of features, including the ability to communicate with USCIS about a request through a secure inbox and respond to

evidence requests online.

With the addition of online filing of Form I-589, individuals can now file 13 USCIS forms online.

The “Forms Available to File Online” reference page has links to view all of these

forms. USCIS continues to accept the latest paper versions of all forms by mail. It is important to consult the page uscis.gov/i-589 for any questions during the process.
