SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. The donation to Temple Beth Shalom in the amount of \$2,500.00 will be used for the annual Congregation Beth Shalom's 16th Annual Legacy Luncheon. The funds raised will be used to offer community/educational programs and will be able to continue to host a large community-based outreach on the Holocaust to the Corona community and the Inland Empire community.
- 2. The donation to Starting Over Inc. in the amount of \$2,500.00 will help fund the Legal Clinics & Resource Fair which help to provide legal services to populations that needs them but are unable to pay for them. Cleaning up criminal backgrounds is a necessary first step to lowering recidivism and fostering re-entry. In addition to post conviction relief many people need other legal services. Target population includes low-income families, people with loved ones who are incarcerated, and formerly incarcerated parents. They will receive legal advice and resource information including hygiene products, medical screening, food, clothing, etc. on the day of the event.
- 3. The donation to the Patriot High School Girls Soccer in the amount of \$2,000.00 will be used for the team's end-of-the-year soccer banquet, Spirit pack and and varsity gear which is not funded by the school.
- 4. The donation to STUDIO 395 Foundation, Inc. in the amount of \$12,000 will be used at the Lakeland Village community center which focuses on being a safe and local facility that can host services needed by the community for their physical and mental well-being such as vaccine clinics, career development, and recreation services.
- 5. The donation to For the People Taskforce in the amount of \$4,000.00 will be used for their community-based organization which is self-funded, and the grant will help feed hungry individuals and families in the district.
